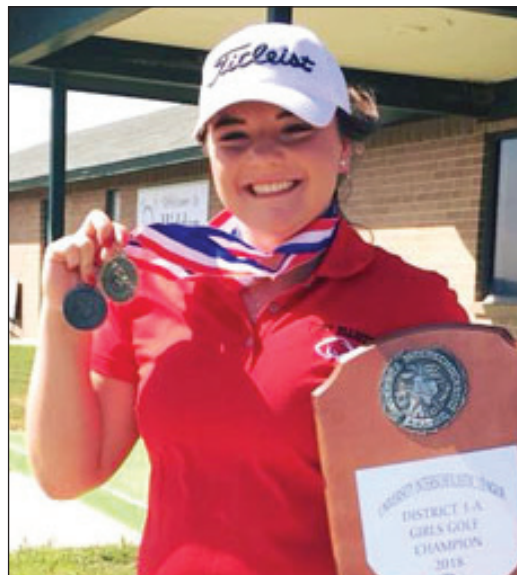

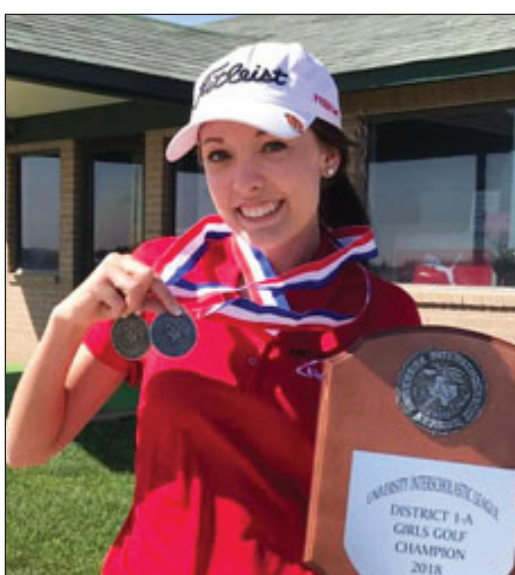

world. Looking back, many old movies and television shows had themes related to human character. That practice is not as common in modern forms of entertainment. For that and many other reasons, some American's are concerned our youth are not exposed to enough positive examples of core character traits.

For this reason, some communities are developing and conducting community-based training and activities that concentrate on these virtues. In many towns various civic groups and organizations are uniting to help ensure the efforts are successful.

Most of these efforts are based on groundbreaking research by Christopher Peterson and Martin Seligman. Their book, "The Character Strengths and Virtues: A Handbook and Classification" is the first attempt by the psychological research community to identify and classify the positive human strengths and virtues of human beings. In it, they identify six classes of core virtues that are made up of 24 measurable character strengths. It has drawn interest from a wide range of professions and disciplines, including education, management, consulting, psychology, coaching, and many others.

The identified core virtues include:

Strengths of Wisdom and Knowledge: Cognitive strengths that entail the acquisition and skillful use of knowledge.

1. Creativity & Imagination: Thinking of novel and productive ways to conceptualize and do things.

2. Curiosity: Taking an interest in ongoing experience for its own sake; exploring and discovering.

3. Open-mindedness: Thinking things through and examining them from all sides; weighing all evidence fairly.

4. Love of learning: Mastering new skills, topics, and bodies of knowledge, whether on one's own or formally.

5. Holistic perspective: Being able to provide wise counsel to others; having ways of looking at the world that make sense to oneself and to other people.

Strengths of Courage: Emotional strengths that involve the exercise of will to accomplish goals in the face of opposition, external and internal.

6. Bravery: Not shrinking from threat, challenge, difficulty, or pain; acting on convictions even if unpopular.

7. Persistence: Finishing what one starts; persisting in a course of action regardless of obstacles.

8. Integrity: Presenting oneself in a genuine way; taking responsibility for one's feeling and actions.

9. Vitality: Approaching life with optimism and energy; feeling alive and motivated.

Strengths of Humanity: interpersonal strengths that involve supporting and befriending others.

10. Love & Compassion: Valuing close relations with others, especially those in which sharing and caring are reciprocated.

11. Kindness & Compas-

sion: Being kind to all others; doing favors and good deeds for others.

12. Social intelligence: Being aware of the motives and feelings of other people and oneself.

Strengths of Justice: strengths that underlie healthy and harmonious community life.

13. Citizenship: Working well as a member of a group or team; being loyal to the group.

14. Fairness: Treating all people the same according to notions of fairness and justice; not letting personal feelings bias decisions about others.

15. Leadership: Encouraging a group of which one is a member to get things done and at the same maintain time good relations within the group.

Strengths of Temperance: strengths that protect against unhealthy excess and egotism.

16. Forgiveness and mercy: Forgiving those who have done wrong; accepting the shortcomings of others; giving people a second chance; not being vengeful.

17. Humility / Modesty: Letting one's accomplishments speak for themselves; not regarding oneself as more special than others or anyone else.

18. Prudence: Being careful about one's choices; not taking undue risks; not saying or doing things that might later be regretted.

19. Self-regulation: Regulating what one feels and does; being disciplined; controlling one's appetites and emotions.

Strengths of Transcendence: strengths that forge connections to the larger universe and provide meaning in life.

20. Appreciation of beauty and excellence: Appreciating beauty, excellence, and/or skilled performance in various domains of life.

21. Gratitude: Being aware of and thankful of the good things that happen; taking time to express thanks.

22. Hope: Expecting the best in the future and working to achieve it.

23. Humor: Liking to laugh and tease; bringing smiles to other people; seeing the light side.

24. Spirituality: Having coherent beliefs about the higher purpose, the meaning of life, and the meaning of the universe.

Certainly, there will be untold rewards for communities who are organizing efforts that provide tangible educational experiences and demonstrations of these core human virtues. The question is: Is your community one that can benefit from an effort to encourage a greater emphasis on these 24 strengths and virtues?

Ten Point Checklist to Fertilizing Your Lawn

1. Determine the amount of time and money you want to spend on managing a lawn. The more fertilizer applied, the higher the maintenance level.

2. Know the size of your lawn. Measure the length and the width and multiply to get square feet. All fertilizer recommendations are calculated in square feet. Over fertilization of lawns means added maintenance.

3. Test your soil for required nutrients. Soil testing packets can be picked up at the County Extension Office.

4. Choose your fertilizer and fertilization rates based upon the soil test recommendations. Slow release fertilizers are the products of choice.

5. Match the annual nitrogen application program to your grass type and your level of work and inputs. Types of grass in the Wheeler County area include Bermuda, Fescue, and Buffalo which all require different quantities of nitrogen. For low maintenance, fertilize in the spring for growth and again in the fall for

root development. To increase quality of the turf, supplemental applications can be made throughout the summer.

6. Know how much fertilizer to apply in any single application based upon soil test recommendations as compared to the fertilizer analysis listed on the fertilizer bags. Fertilizer analysis is usually computed in three numbers (for example a 16-4-8). The first number is nitrogen percentage, the second number is phosphorous percentage and the third is potassium percentage. A 40 pound bag of 16-4-8 would contain 16% N, 4% P, and 8% K. To calculate total pounds of each nutrient contained in a bag, multiply the total weight of the bag by the nutrient percentage. Example: 40 x 16%=6.4 pounds of actual nitrogen. At the rate of 1 pound of nitrogen per 1,000 square feet, the 40 pound bag would treat 6,400 square feet of lawn.

7. Investigate types of fertilizers: urea, slow release, weed and feed, etc. Use caution on weed and feed fertilizers. Some are made for Bermuda grass lawns. These weed and feed products can also damage or kill nearby flowers, shrubs, and trees.

8. Know when to apply fertilizer in the spring. A good rule

of thumb is to apply fertilizer after the second mowing of grass (not weeds) around May 1st. At this time the grass is actively growing and can utilize the nitrogen.

9. Know if additional fertilizer is needed between spring and fall applications. Newly established, previously neglected or higher maintenance type lawns where the homeowner wants to improve the quality and density of the turf may need additional nitrogen ap-

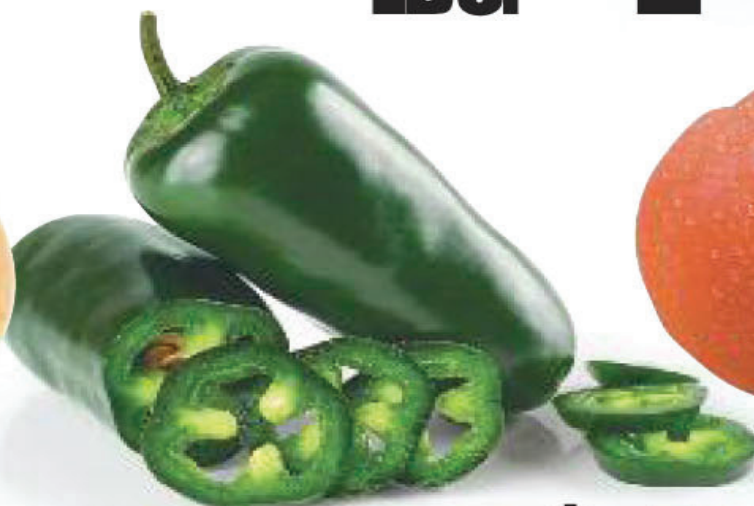

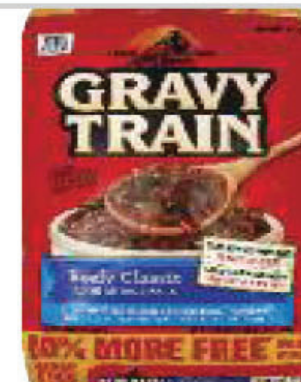
