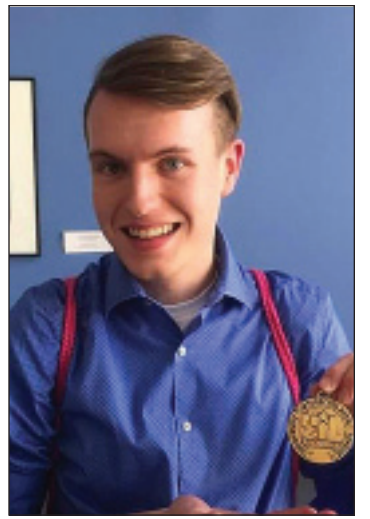

The Wheeler High School track teams traveled to West Texas High School to participate in the Area Track Meet on Monday.

Those placing in the top four were eligible to advance to Area. The local varsity team was represented in eight events. In the 400 meters, Hesston Marshall ran the 400 meters. Logan Harris ran the 110 hurdles. Wheeler's 4x200 Relay team, David Rascon, Eduardo Porras, Baldemar Gallardo and Tony Castillo, participated. Logan Harris, Angel Ontiveros, Ian Finsterwald and Hesston Marshall ran the 4x400 relay. Daniel Rascon threw the 12lb. Discus. Andy Garcia competed in the 1.6kg discus throw. Hesston Marshall made the long jump; he also made the triple jump competition. Gustavo Andrade made the triple jump; as did Brady Bailey.

Wheeler's Junior Varsity was represented in eight events. In the 800 meter, Marcos Herrera ran. Marcos Herrera and Eloy Uribe ran the 1600 meter. Eloy Uribe and Houston Hardcastle qualified in the 3200 meter. The team, Jayton Couch, Marcos Herrera, Cooper Foreman and Nekruz Nabiev, ran the 4x100 relay. In the 4x200 relay, Gustavo Olivas, Jayton Couch, Cooper Foreman and Nekruz Nabiev ran. Alexander Davis threw the shot put and the discus. Hunter Smith and Gustavo Olivas both made the long jump.

## Community Care: Capitalizing on Seasonal Tourism

This time of year, people begin to take to the roads for long-awaited vacations. These annual events present communities on and near major highways with opportunities to secure economic boons during the summer months.

Towns who possess historic or cultural elements that are interesting to these travelers are especially fortunate – they have elements that naturally draw the attention of vacationers in search of new and interesting experiences.

Dodge City, Kansas, is one such community that has embraced its rich western history by developing attractions related to its western lore. To help ensure these efforts real-

ize success, the community utilizes social media and traditional advertising campaigns. One other such community is Roswell, New Mexico, who has long embraced its connection to the supposed UFO crash nearby, because of the economic boon curious visitors represent.

However, many communities have elements that can be drawn upon, but do not seem to understand the positive economic impact these factors can provide.

For instance, the state of Texas can lay claim to an exceedingly diverse collection of cultural icons that fascinate people from around the world. However, relatively few Texas towns offer travelers experi-

ences that relate to its rich cultural lore.

Individuals within small towns most likely do not have the resources necessary to attempt any kind of related effort on their own. For that reason, local economic development offices encourage, sponsor and support cooperative efforts that can kickstart attempts to boost local tourism. After all, such endeavors are one of the primary goals of economic development boards. Furthermore, funds they receive are intended to be applied to efforts to boost local economies.

Small communities, especially those who are not in close proximity to our nation's interstate highways, may not

enjoy a high number of visitors throughout the year. For this reason, many communities have what are referred to as seasonal attractions – meaning they are only open during tourist season which is April to September. This way they are able to boost their local economies when the greatest number of visitors are possible, but are not encumbered with related expenses and responsibilities when the opportunity for visitors is low.

There are many different kinds of attractions that can draw visitors to communities that do not require an on-site attendant or daily upkeep. Such attractions are especially prudent for small towns, for they can benefit the commu-

Warning: I'm going to vent for a moment, but I'm going to be as nice as possible.

I walked into a store earlier to get some bottled water. Upon walking to the counter I overheard two women discussing all the wildfires.

Woman 1: We need to pray for rain and for everyone dealing with this.

Woman 2: Yeah, but why does everyone keep posting all over to pray for the firemen?

I mean they signed up for this s\*\*\* and they are protected in trucks and have water. It can't be that bad.

I turned leaving my bottled water at the counter unpaid for and left. I was seething angry and to be honest couldn't believe what I had heard. I had to wait till I had calmed down to write this. Those men and women put their lives on the line EVERY SINGLE TIME they gear up and roll out. Fighting fire is dangerous whether it's grass or structure. They never know what elements other than the fire that they will have to contend with all while fighting to save other people's land and/or houses. Plus, they work unGodly hours. It's stressful, hard work. I have friends on nearly every department around here. Our firemen need our prayers, love and support! If it wasn't for them there is no telling what all would be lost! I hate it every time Chuck runs out the door but I'm also proud of the selfless giving man that he is!

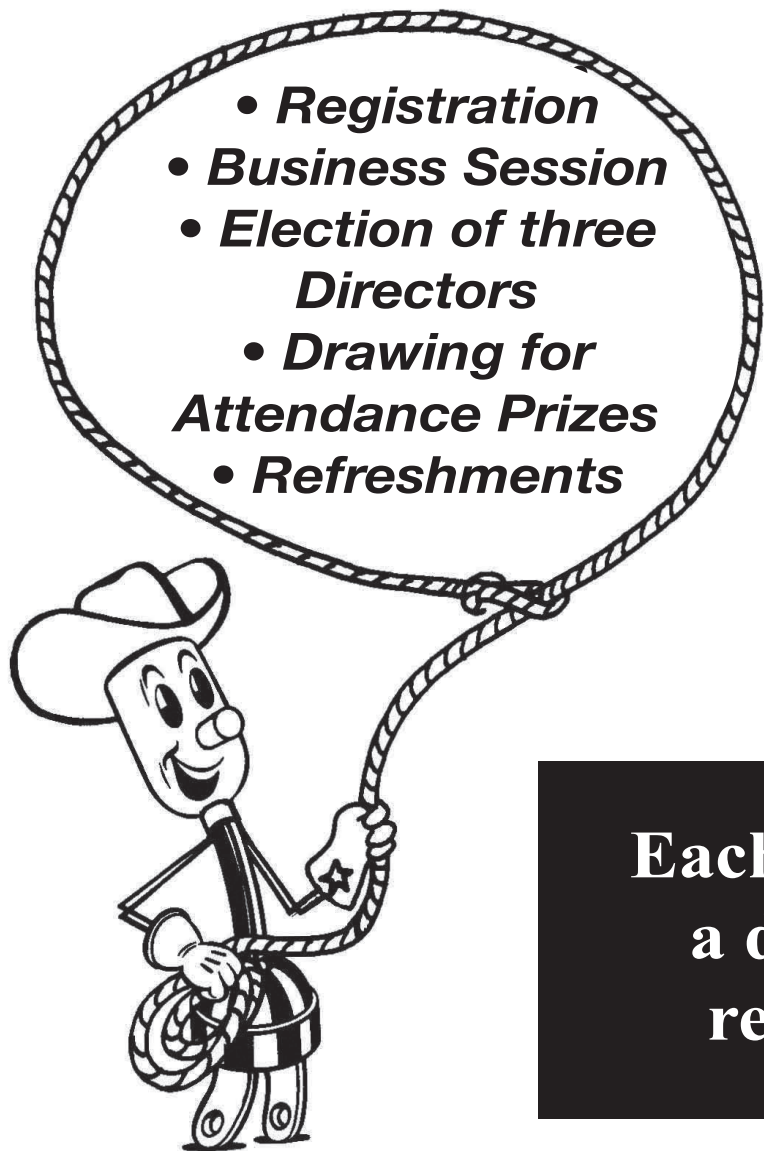

## Emergency Preparation Supplies

### Sales Tax Holiday

You can purchase certain emergency preparation supplies tax free during the 2018 Emergency Preparation Supplies Sales Tax Holiday. There is no limit on the number of qualifying items you can purchase, and you do not need to issue an exemption certificate to claim the exemption.

This year's holiday begins at 12:01 a.m. on Saturday, April 28, and ends at midnight on Monday, April 30.

These emergency preparation supplies qualify for tax exemption if purchased for a sales price:

- Less than \$3000
- Portable generators
- Less than \$300
- Emergency ladders
- Hurricane shutters
- Less than \$75
- Axes
- Batteries, single or multi-pack (AAA cell, AA cell, C cell, D cell, 6 volt or 9 volt)

- Can openers - nonelectric
- Carbon monoxide detectors
- Coolers and ice chests for food storage - nonelectric
- Fire extinguishers
- First aid kits
- Fuel containers
- Ground anchor systems and tie-down kits
- Hatchets
- Ice products - reusable and artificial
- Light sources - portable self-powered (including battery operated)

Examples of items include: candles, flashlights and lanterns

- Mobile telephone batteries and mobile telephone chargers
- Radios - portable self-powered (including battery operated) - includes two-way and weather band radios
- Smoke detectors
- Tarps and other plastic sheeting

through April 5, 2018 totaling \$127,708.82 in expenditures.

- There were two budget transfers approved.
- There were no line item transfers.
- There were no revisions to the Wheeler County Policy Manual.
- Exceptions were made to the County's Phase 2 Burn Ban:

EXCEPTIONS: A Recognized Wheeler County Fire Department or Texas Forest Service may:

1. Conduct controlled burns to lessen the spread of wildfire into cities.

These supplies do not qualify for tax exemption:

- Batteries for automobiles, boats and other motorized vehicles

For example, you purchase a rescue ladder for \$299 with a \$10 delivery charge, for a total sales price of \$309. Because the total sales price of the ladder is more than \$300, tax is due on the \$309 sales price.

2. Conduct controlled burns to lessen the potential spread of wildfire in any areas of the county where extremely hazardous conditions exist.

The County Judge may at his discretion temporarily lift the Burn Ban for 48 hours. This may or may NOT be a County-wide lifting of the ban. This will only be done after appreciable rainfall has occurred in the local area where the burn is planned and forecast weather conditions are within TCEQ burning guidelines. Wheeler Sheriff Office and Shamrock Police Department dispatch offices will be notified by Judge that the Burn Ban has been temporarily lifted. Persons wishing to burn may call the dispatch offices and determine if the burn ban has been temporarily lifted prior to conducting their burns.
