NRCS Announces 2019 Deadline for Conservation

Assistance Funding The USDA-Natural Re-

sources Conservation Service (NRCS) in Texas has announced the first funding application deadline of March 15, 2019 for the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP). A second funding application deadline is scheduled for May 10, 2019.

Applications are taken year around for NRCS programs,

but deadlines are announced to rank and fund eligible conservation projects. Producers interested in signing up for EQIP should submit applications to their local USDA service center or if already a USDA client, on-line via Conservation Client Gateway (CCG).

EQIP is a voluntary program that provides financial and technical assistance to agricultural producers. Technical (Continued Page 5)

SATURN V DISPLAY: A Lego set of the Saturn V Rocket was purchased by Chip and Pam Hill for display at the Wheeler Historical Museum. Seth Bryant, age 10, had the honor of putting the 1969 pieces together for it to be on exhibit. Seth did not have school Friday, so he gladly spent 5 hours putting the rocket together; then he set up this display at his home in Oklahoma City. The completed model measures 39.5 inches and can be taken apart, showing the stages as they separate during launch. Saturn V was launched fifty years ago, Nov. 9, 1969. On the right is "moon landing" and left is "splash down" in proportion; they fit in place inside the rocket. Seth has been putting lego sets together since he was four; his largest was a project had 4867 pieces, which he got for Christmas.






