2019/20 Budget Workshop was held from 6:25 pm - 7:25 pm.

Ben Ed called the meeting to order at 7:25 pm and Randy opened in prayer.

Randy made a motioned to approve the January 14, 2018 minutes, John seconded the motion, passing it with all 4 members voting for, 0 against, 0 abstaining and 3 absent.

No public comment.
Charles presented the financial statement report to the board.

Kristen presented an EDC Incentive Application requested by C3 Inspection. The board discussed incentive options and to seek legal counsel. Based on the expansion of this business to manufacture and maintain a certain number of jobs that pay higher than average wages, the board considered a matching 50/50 loan, forgivable based on job retention. A third of the loan would be forgiven (or due to be paid) at the end of each year for the next three years, based on job growth and TWC payroll reports. In a motion by John and seconded by Ben Ed, to proceed with a \$50,000 forgivable loan based on maintaining 25 Full Time, higher than average wages, within 3 years and based on working with our lawyers for any default payments or legal stipulations/ review that C3 Inspection is approved by all 3 members voting for, 0 against, 1 abstaining and 3 absent.

Kristen is working with Chamber Directors from Childress, Shamrock, Canadian and Perryton to market Highway 83, to bring awareness of our towns and what our communities offer while working with Double U Marketing to handle the marketing for a large event hosted in each of the communities. The chambers are requesting to use HOT funds to advertise

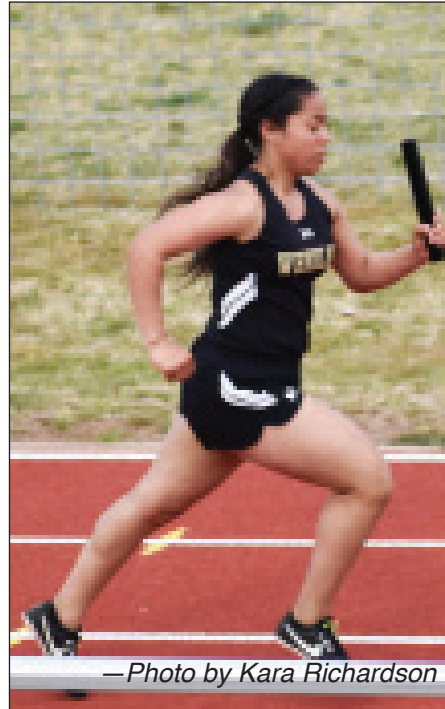

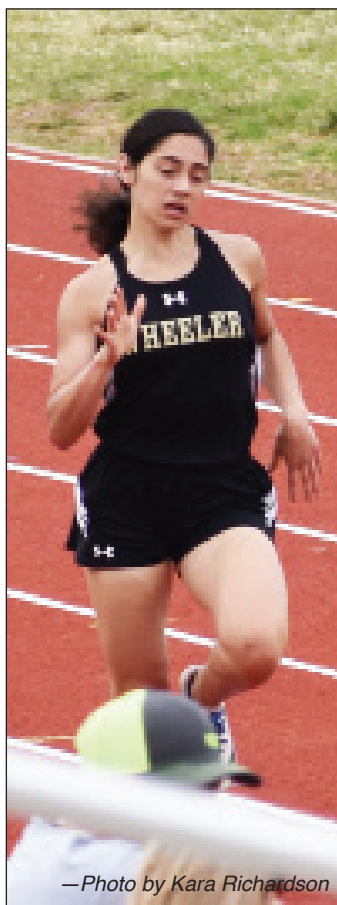

Sidewalks was approved for the City of Wheeler. The board discussed in great detail the pros and cons of accepting the grant proposal. Based on the fact the project has been resolved to represent a blithe area in the downtown and accessible routes do not comply with current statute the board advises to move forward with acceptance of the grant. The sidewalks are in disrepair ex-

hibiting extensive cracking, elevation differences that could contribute to tripping hazards, substandard slopes and, substandard store entrances for numerous storefronts. Elevation differences between street level and a number of entities is such that barrier protection is required and/or reconfiguration. Obvious accessible routes will be established in the design of this project comply with current TDLR requirements. Sidewalks will be replaces and in come areas reconfigured to conform with TDLR requirements improving storefront entrance, the need for barrier protection and hand railing. The sidewalks are in poor condition and accidents may occur resulting in injury to citizens because of unsafe sidewalks and they will not meet public safety standards and guidelines that provide safe and adequate access to the businesses for disabled and senior citizens. In a motion by Randy and seconded by Britt, the motion was made to support the City of Wheeler Resolution Number 2018.08 in support of the Texas Department of Agriculture Texas Capital Fund: Downtown Revitalization Program to remove and reconstruct sidewalks in the downtown area. The EDC will provide a financial commitment in the amount of \$149,766 as cash contributions towards the Downtown Revitalization program in order to receive the \$250,000 grant from TDA. The motion passed with all 4 members voting for, 0 against, 0 abstaining and 3 absent.

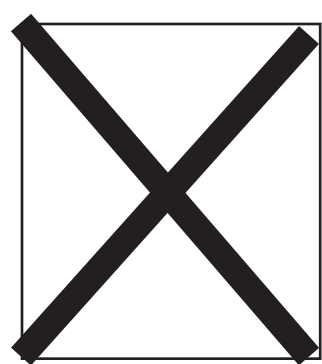
