FIVE LOCAL COMMUNITIES TO HOST 'WILD & FREE ON 83' 4-Day Event to Promote Communities Along Veterans Memorial Highway

Texas Senate Declares August 3rd Highway 83 Day

This weekend, five Texas Panhandle communities along Highway 83 will host a first-of-its-kind, four-day, family-friendly festival.

The event has received recognition all the way down in Austin, where the Texas Senate passed a proclamation declaring 83 Highway 83 Day.

Canadian, Wheeler, Shamrock, Wellington and Childress have each scheduled dozens of events from Thursday, August 1st through Sunday, August 4th.

Some of the things on tap for *Wild & Free on 83* include helicopter tours, live music, art exhibits, scavenger hunts, clay shoots, cookouts, block parties, golf tournaments, star watch-

ing, wine tasting, turtle races, goat roping, a ranch rodeo and much more!

There's even a chance to win a brand new car for making a hole-in-one at predetermined holes at each of the town's golf courses.

Area residents are invited to discover the rich heritage of these communities by visiting points of interest in each town, while enjoying the events scheduled throughout the four days.

Wild & Free, which was organized by the Chambers of Commerce in each community, will be a yearly event. The goal is to expand each year, including more stops along Highway 83.
