

More Than Just A Badge

Why would anybody in their right mind want to be Sheriff? With all the hatred in this country toward law enforcement, it would boggle the mind as to why anyone would want to become a sheriff, police officer or any type of first responder. You see its more than just a badge. It is a desire to help our fellow man and stand up for those that are in need of help.

For the past seven plus years, I have listened to the citizens of Wheeler County express their displeasure in the ways that the Sheriff's Office has failed them. The Sheriff's Office has more deputies than it has ever had. Yet, it is not uncommon to make a call for assistance and be told that a deputy is not available. To have a single deputy responsible for over nine hundred square miles is unacceptable and irresponsible.

I was recently asked about my take on deputies being on Interstate 40. The safety and welfare of the citizens of Wheeler County should be first and foremost. 




