Kelton Robotics Team Prepared For Cancelled Dimmitt Meet Sat.

Time is ticking and gears are turning here at Kelton ISD as an upcoming scrimmage approaches on December 12 in Dimmitt. This time of year marks the beginning of socalled "crunch time" for the members of the Kelton Robotics Program as builders are fixing minor mechanical flaws, programmers are ironing out small bugs within their code, and the engineering notebook committee is coordinating our upcoming fundraisers. In the wake of our new "normal," the entirety of placement-related meets will be conducted virtually, but an upcoming in-person scrimmage in Dimmitt is rapidly approaching. The four teams at Kelton, all of which have varying levels of experience within the challenge, will be competing in this scrimmage. The most experienced

team at Kelton, the Robotic Chinchillas, have a fully functional robot along with various autonomous programs. Builders Pavan Patel and Raj Bhakta have ironed out small kinks within their robot, making it both reliable and efficient. Their robot consists of a chain-driven intake system and a central conveyor belt that transports rings to a List of instruments filed in the shooting flywheel all of which is mated to a chain-driven mecanum drive train. Their robot can shoot each disk working on TensorFlow. TensorFlow is an autonomous vision program that allows the robot to distinguish between various game elements. This type of technology has been implemented in many modern-day machines, such as

the Tesla. The Wookie Robotics team is also preparing for the upcoming competition and they too have a fully operational robot. Builders Jet Erickson and Vincent Sherwood have completed construction on their robot and are now locating minor glitches in their design and code. Their robot consists of a claw attached to a primary arm, all of which is mounted onto a two-wheel -drive drivetrain. Their robot can effectively place rings in the bottom goal and can effectively manipulate the wobble goal. In the weeks before the contest, Raj plans on helping them construct their first autonomous program.

Gemini Robotics is also another rookie team to come from Kelton. The team consists of Caylan Schaffer, Faith Toland, Capryce Chappel, Macie Lamar, and Zen Lister. At the moment, Caylan Schaffer and Capryce Chapel have constructed a reliable robot that can manipulate both the wobble goal and rings. With the help of Pavan, Faith and Macie have also completed

an effective autonomous program. Additionally, Mr. Herndon has recently consulted them about potential redesigns on their robot in which they can consistently shoot rings.

The Rooster Robotics is the youngest team at Kelton and they too have just completed construction on their robot. Team members Seth Bryant and Dalton Blackburn have created a two-wheel drive robot with a claw attached to a primary arm. They have resolved the final issues on their robot and are scheduled to develop their first autonomous program on Monday.

It's "crunch time" here at Kelton, and students are awaiting their first scrimmage in Dimmitt. All teams have reliable robots and are as ready as can be for their upcoming contest. Here at the Kelton Robotics Program, we strive to provide each student with a sense of direction. Along their journey, each child develops key character traits such as






