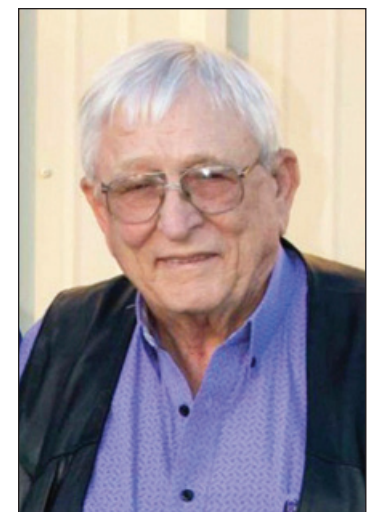
Services April 19 For Dean Tipps

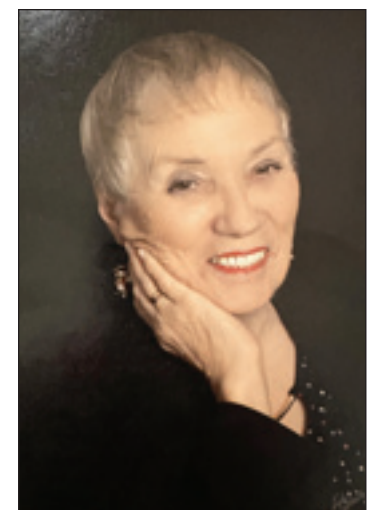

basic essential amenities. And from the cabin sequester he came up with a full set of songs, which his band used for the next album they recorded. I've sometimes thought that that approach seemed attractive; at the very least it is idyllic, but many things are idyllic until you try them for yourself.

The cabin sequestration ties in nicely to the concept of a Sabbatical. One or two years ago I heard someone speak convincingly about how a Sabbatical was absolutely essential. We tend to think of them as once-in-a-lifetime occurrences for 0.1% of the people (does that make them once-in-a-thousand-lifetimes?), but this person, who if I remember correctly was a substantially profitable business person, stated that it was essential to take a Sabbatical on a yearly basis. I wouldn't doubt it.

I think much of the disorder we so often bring upon ourselves, in the form of staying up late, excessive eating or drinking, unnecessary purchases, worry, etc., is the result of feeling caught in the vortex of haste and the frenetic pace of life, and I would imagine that a person on Sabbatical might be able to break free of that black hole, if he could stick with it long enough - if he could remain engaged with being disengaged. But what am I talking about? When you're getting sucked in to the whirlpool, the only solution that appears to be available is to paddle harder. How is that working?

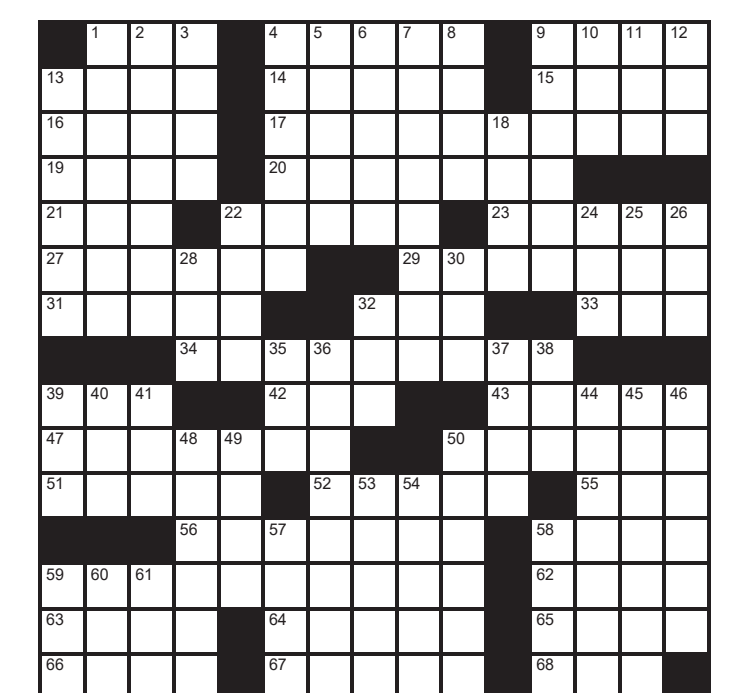

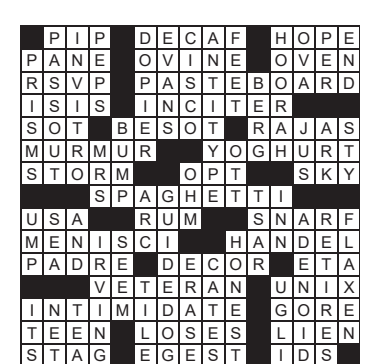

Filing by Southwestern Public Service Company, doing business as Xcel Energy Inc., of Statement of Intent and Application for Authority to Change Rates

On February 8, 2023, Southwestern Public Service Company ("SPS"), doing business as Xcel Energy Inc., filed a statement of intent and application for authority to change rates ("Application") with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission") and with each Texas municipality that has original jurisdiction over SPS's electric rates.

SPS has approximately 403,400 Texas retail customers. All customers in each of SPS's Texas retail customer classes will be affected by the relief requested in this Application.

Statement of Intent to Change Rates

SPS requests that the Commission approve an overall increase in annual base rate revenues of \$157,546,272 which represents an increase of 22% in base rate revenues (the portion of the bill not including fuel costs and rate riders) and an increase of 14% in overall adjusted revenues. The effect of the proposed rate change on individual customer classes is set forth in the section entitled "Effect on Customer Classes" below.

SPS's proposed effective date for this rate change is 35 days after the date of this filing, which is March 15, 2023. That proposed effective date is subject to suspension and extension by actions of the Commission or other regulatory authorities.

Effect on Customer Classes

The average Residential Service customer using 1,000 kilowatt-hours of energy per month will see an increase in base rates of \$13.29 per month, or 9.1%, which results in an overall increase of 10.59%, compared to the rates established in SPS's last base rate case.

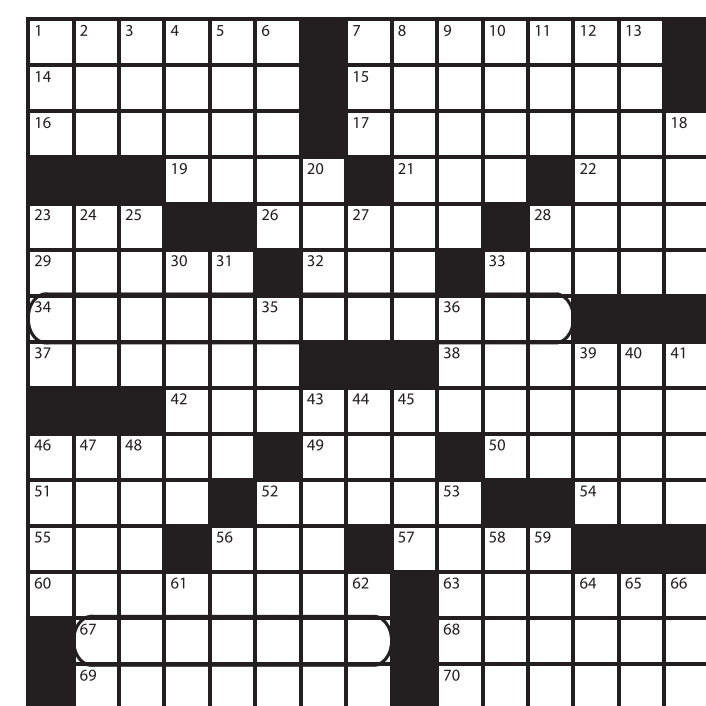

Resources Available For Safe Rooms, Storm Shelters

The Panhandle Regional Planning Commission (PRPC) would like to remind Panhandle homeowners that there are resources available to assist with the installation of a tornado shelter in or around their residence. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has stated that a tornado shelter, or safe room, "can help provide near-absolute protection for you and your family". Every year, tornadoes and extreme wind events injure or kill residents throughout the US and most homes, even those built to current standards, won't provide occupants with adequate protection against life-threatening wind events. However, safe rooms built to FEMA specifications are designed

for that purpose – to provide safe shelter from the wind. The PRPC has received funding through FEMA to help Panhandle residents with the cost of putting a shelter in or around their home. The Panhandle Regional Residential Safe Room Rebate Program will cover 50% of the cost, up to a maximum of \$3,000, of installing a safe room in a homeowner's home. The eligibility requirements are fairly minimal. First, before the shelter is installed, a resident must apply for and receive a rebate through the PRPC. Second, the resident must own the home where the shelter will be installed. Additionally, shelters must be built to FEMA standards and they can't be installed in a flood hazard area. All rebates are awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.

"The most valuable items in any home are the people who live there. Things can be replaced, people can't." And, in a region of the country where tornadoes are a fact of life, the safe room rebate program provides a practical solution for protecting life when tornadoes occur.
