## Wheeler County Commissioners' Court

### Bills In Amount of \$289,720.47

The Commissioners' Court of Wheeler County, Texas, met in regular session on Monday, July 24, 2023, at 9:00 a.m., in the Wheeler County Courthouse at 401 Main Street, Wheeler, Texas, to consider prior bills and discuss matters of mutual concern and to take action on the following agenda items:

- The meeting was called to order by Commissioner John Walker in the absence of Judge Pat. McDowell.
- The opening prayer was offered.
- Khasi Campos, Regional 9-1-1 Admin. Specialist, re-

viewed and received positive action on the Interlocal Agreement for E9-1-1 Services and PSAP Equipment.

- Minutes of the previous meeting were approved.
- The court accepted the report of the County Treasurer.
- Budget Amendments were approved by the court as presented.
- No Budget Transfers were presented for approval.
- The court approved the line-item transfers as presented.
- No action was taken on the Burn Ban.
- The court appointed the following citizens to the Wheeler County Historical Society Board of Directors: Roger Pace, Ann Graham, Misty Copeland and Tonya Finsterwald.

PUBLIC COMMENTS: Ken Powell addressed the council about animal ordinances and would like to see the ordinances updated and enforced.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS: Library: The library needs a new computer at an estimated cost of \$800.

Maintenance: Paul discussed the recent water sewer state inspection that was completed recently. The state will require testable backflow prevention devices

on all businesses. An engineer will be coming on June 30th to work on an easement agreement between the landowners and the city. The street signs are in, and they will begin installing soon. The new sanitation truck is in and working great.

EDC: Kristen updated the council on the Wheeler Chamber of Commerce. There are up to 76 members and 23 youth ambassadors.

Office: I reported that we have officially moved into the new office and like the bigger and brighter space. Mayor Sams discussed the annual audit that was completed the first week of June. The auditor finished 3 days earlier than expected and the auditors said everything went well. The auditors will be back in July or August to go over the audit report.

Pool: Jenny brought to the council the recommendation to change up the free pool day from July 4th to July 3rd to keep all July 4th festivities over near Britt field where the rest of activities are happening. The pool will be closed on July 4th. She also asked if there were any objections to the Wheeler band having a pool party on August 19 which is after the pool's official close date. There were no objections from the council to either of these suggestions.

MAYOR UPDATES: Mayor Sams asked the council about old equipment in the storage room. The

council agreed to dispose of obsolete equipment. Mayor Sams signed the lease for a copier for the office. It was delivered last week. Mayor Sams discussed the West Texas Gas monthly collection fee. A discussion was made for Mayor Sams to contact WTG about increasing our monthly collection fee. The water rate increase information was not submitted to the mayor on time by the city attorney. It will be on next month's agenda. Mayor Sams also brought to the council the recommendation that the City Utility employees strictly enforce the disconnection date of the 21st of each month for delinquent water bills. Open house on the new office will be the last week of July.

ACTION ITEMS: Mayor Sams brought to the council the codification company (General Code) that would help the city get the ordinances into order. Bryan Markham made the motion to sign the contract with General Code. Tracy Tignor seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mayor Sams discusses with the council the new rates for the health insurance for the city employees. The council gave approval to sign the rerate agreement for this year but investigate other options for next year.

A motion was made to amend the January 2023 minutes to include the missing action of a mobile home variance for 101 Sweetwater. Camden Dorris made the motion to accept the change in minutes. Amy Zybach seconded, and the motion passed unanimously.

May 15th minutes- A motion was made by Bryan Markham and seconded by Tracy Tignor to accept the May 15th minutes. Motion carried unanimously.

The next Council meeting will be held July 17, 2023.

Mayor Sams adjourned the meeting at 7:56 p.m.

What if you had no alarm clock? What if you had no toothbrush? What if you had no tooth?  
How tough was it? Well, rich people owned the land, lived in a castle, and could afford to bathe once a year.

These people worked long hours, between sunrise and sunset. They had no wrist-watches. Sundials were too heavy to keep in a pocket.  
Many remedies were herbal. They were passed down from one generation to the next, mostly by conversation. (These were the first oral medications.)  
Consequently, there were very few old people, because anybody over 30 with three or four teeth and most of his fingers was considered a geezer.  
And nearly everybody had superstitions. Many believed in witches, and their ability to transform into werewolves at night. This made parties extremely risky, and curfew a lifesaver.
