



She married Olen "Bill" Bailey on December 27, 1948, in Groom, Texas. The couple moved to Pampa in 1950 and have been in the community ever since. Louise started her career as a banker soon after she and Bill moved. She was the first female senior officer at the First National Bank. After 45+ years there, she retired at age 67. Bill preceded Louise in death in 2010 after 62 years of marriage.

While Bill was still living, he worked the Jasper Johnston ranch in Mobeetie. After his death, Louise continued to run the family cow-calf operation, up until the day of her death. When she wasn't at the farm, Louise loved to spend time with family and travel. She took numerous trips to Colorado, New Orleans, Branson, and visited places like San Francisco, Nashville, and Ireland.

Louise was a kind lady and loved to serve others. She was involved in several organizations in the Panhandle throughout the years. She served as the president of the Pampa chapter of Altrusa International Foundation from 1985-1987 and had been a member since 1976 to the present. Louise was a cofounder of the Tralee Crisis Center for Women in 1983 and was one of the original members of the board. She helped organize the Tralee Crisis Center Thrift Store and often worked at the cash register. Most of her post-work wardrobe came from the thrift store, spending as much as \$0.25 per item. She was also part of the Pampa Widow's Twentieth Century Club, Study Club, serving multiple terms as president, a board member of the Pampa Salvation Army, a member of Beta Sigma Phi, and a faith-



a choice actually must be made between the quality of a particular job, or the quantity of output - typically I believe we are conditioned to compromise on quality for the sake of getting the job done. But don't you have the familiar sense that you are never really caught up, anyway? I don't know anyone who can relax with the satisfaction of having everything attended to, and nothing else demanding of their time, effort, or attention. So if the job(s) won't get completed anyway, what does it hurt to leave a little more uncompleted, and let what is completed have been done as well as it could be? You will never be caught up anyway - why not at least be satisfied with the work you have done?

I don't know the answer to that question but it seems plausible: it seems worth further consideration than I have granted it here, or in practice. Perhaps it's worth a go - and perhaps it's just a thought.
