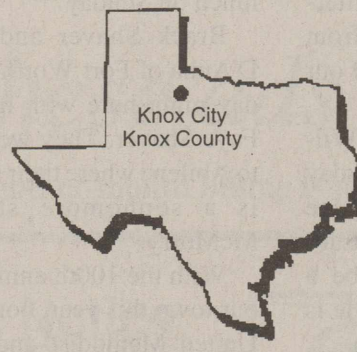

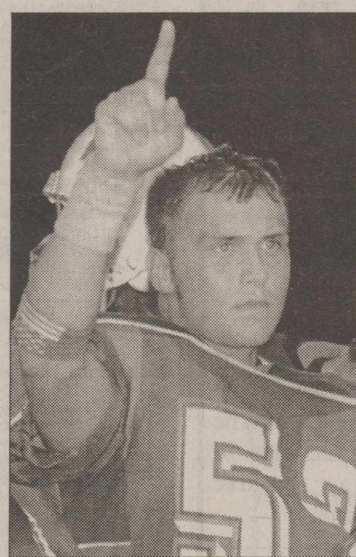
Greyhounds roar, Lions whimper in 46-7 Knox City victory

Fielding an awesome defensive unit that held the Roby Lions to a total of 13 yards offense, the Knox City Greyhounds proved early on that they will be a force to be reckoned with this year. While not to be outdone by the defense's impressive performance, the offense also scored 46 points in a varied attack that included both running and passing touchdowns.

Quentin Spells started the scoring drive early in the game. With 8:33 left in the first quarter, Quentin crossed the goal line on a 3 yard run. The extra point kick was good, putting the Greyhounds on the scoreboard first, 7-0. Riley Spells had the crowd on their feet and cheering as he ran the ball 77 yards into the end zone with 4:56 left in the first quarter. The extra point kick attempt failed.

Second quarter action saw the Greyhound defense continue to shut down Roby's offense while the 'Hound offense turned up the heat. Quentin Spells moved down the field with lightning speed on a 68 yard run, the extra point kick by Quentin added another point. A 20 yard pass from quarterback Andy Shaver to receiver Derrick Magana added another touchdown, the extra point kick by Spells was good. Just before the halftime, Quentin Spells once again crossed the goal line and added another 6 points after a 25 yard run. The extra point kick by Spells failed.

Leading by a wide margin at the start of the second half, Knox city did not ease up on the Lions as Shaver again connected with Magana for a 25 yard pass and touchdown with 7:17 left in the third quarter. The extra point kick failed. Once again displaying his accurate

passing ability, Andy Shaver threw a pass to Quentin Spells for another touchdown on the 58 yard play. The extra point kick by Quentin Spells was good.

The fourth quarter saw mostly backup players on the field for Knox City as Coach Wayne Hutchinson chose not to run up the score and also to give the underclassman valuable playing experience. Albany was able to finally score after Joe Posey completed a 45 yard pass to Jance Morris with 1:48 left in the game. The extra point kick was good, giving Roby their game total of 7 points.

Knox City's leading rusher was Quentin Spells with 137 yards and 3 touchdowns on 8 attempts. Cody Wainscott picked up 103 yards on 8 attempts with one 40 yard play. Riley Spells carried the ball 8 times for 93 yards and 1 touchdown. Evan Clark picked up 16 yards on 3 carries and Andy Shaver had 2 yards on 1 ground carry.

Quarterback Andy Shaver completed an impressive 9 of 12 attempts for 219 yards and 3 touchdowns. His long pass for the game was 58 yards. Receivers were Derrick Magana with 5 catches for 100 yards and 2 touchdowns, Ty Chisum with 1 reception for 14 yards, Quentin Spells with 1 reception for 58 yards and 1 touchdown, and Riley Spells with 1 catch for 35 yards.

Knox City takes a long road trip this week, heading northwest to Memphis. Game time for this non district match is set for 7:30 p.m. The Junior Varsity will host Memphis at O'Brien on Thursday at 6:00 p.m. (More game photos inside and on sports booster page)

FSA reminds producers of Friday nomination deadline

Knox County Farm Service Agency (FSA) reminds America's farmers, ranchers and other agricultural producers that the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) FSA County Committee nomination process is underway.

September 3, 2004, is the deadline for eligible voters to nominate themselves or local producers to service on the FSA County Committee.

According to Michael McDonald, County Committees play an important role in the local implementation and oversight of FSA programs, but the committee system is only as successful as the election process.

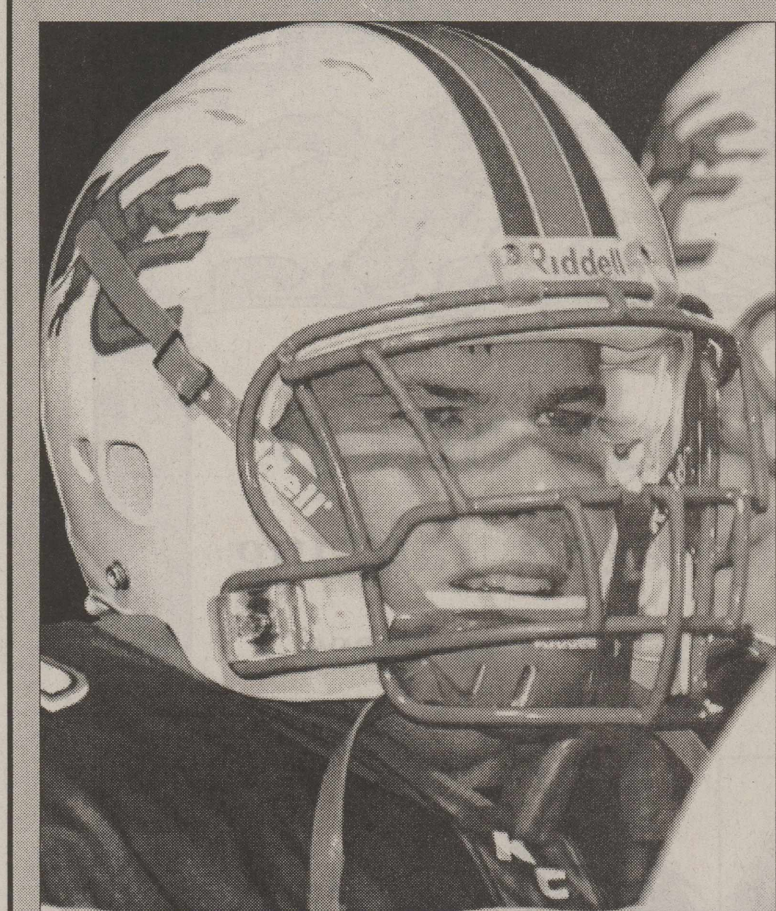

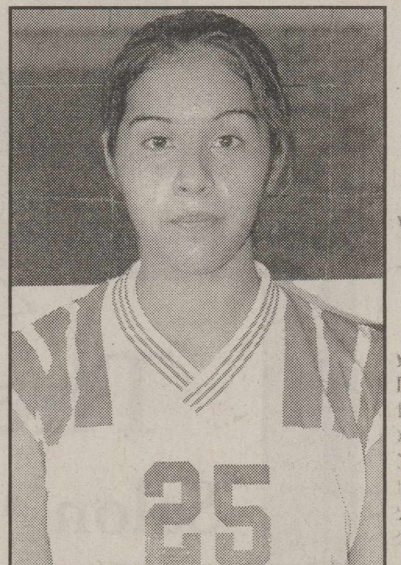
