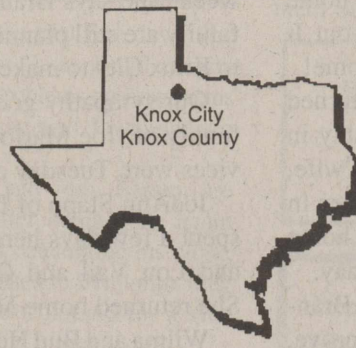

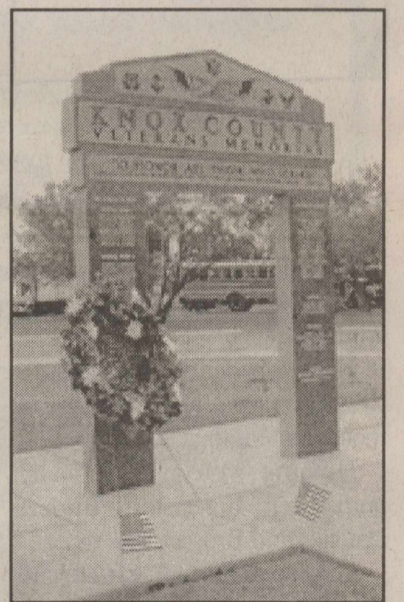

## KC Lions hear program on 'Adopt a Hwy.'

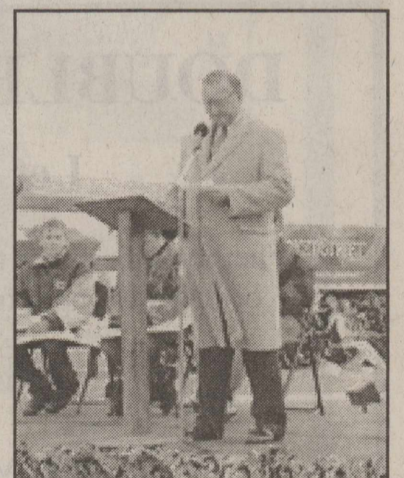

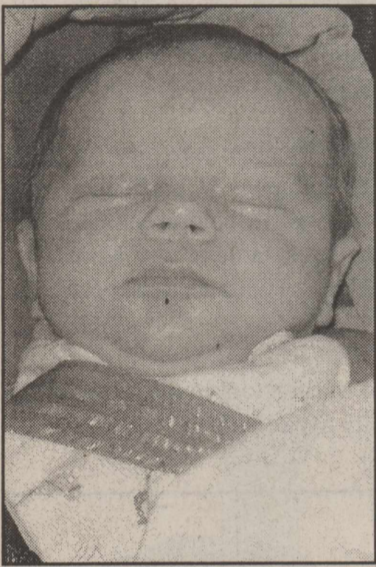

Graveside services for Ernest J. Ward of Clyde, former Knox City businessman, were held Friday, November 12, 2004, at 2:00 p.m. at Elmwood Memorial Park in Abilene. Tony Grand, pastor of Trinity Baptist Church of Haskell, officiated. Mr. Ward died Monday, November 8, 2004, at his residence.

Born May 17, 1912, in Sylvester, to John Walter and Nellie Douglas Ward, he married Dollie Margaret West.

Mr. and Mrs. Ward were former Knox City residents. He owned and operated Ward's Sand and Gravel for 15 years. He and his wife ran Margaret's Home Grocery in Knox City before retiring in 1990, moving to Lake Cisco and later moving to Clyde. Mr. Ward served in the United States Marines during World War II in the 1st Marine Division as Corporal.

He was preceded in death by three sisters, Alynne Parham, Goldie Brown and Opal Draper; and a brother, Alton Ward.

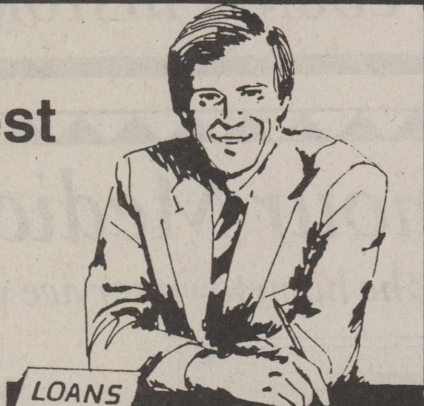

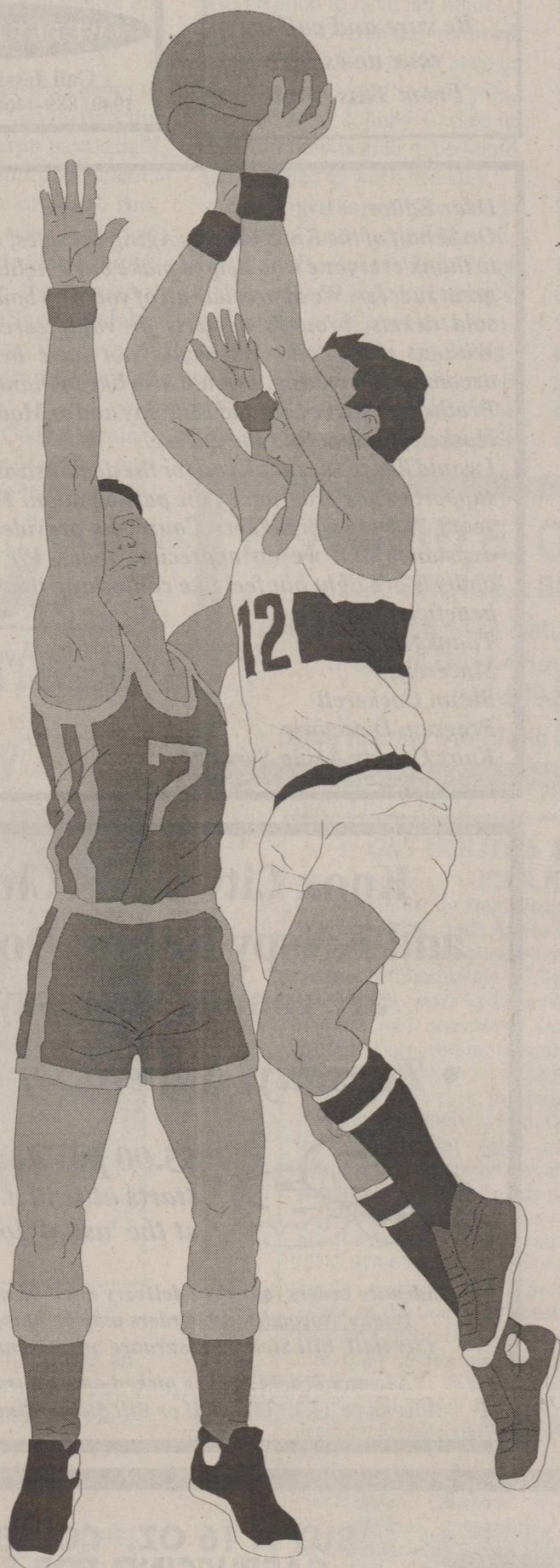
