Texas Commissioner of Agriculture Todd Staples presented the award along with State Representative Drew Springer. Red Steagall provided the entertainment.

The 100 year plus farm is located six miles north of Haskell in the Josselet's Switch area. The land was purchased in 1900 by Victor Josselet. Victor passed the land down to his son Paul and wife Carrie Josselet in 1919. Paul then passed the land to his daughter Alma Terrell in 1973. Alma and husband V.P. Terrell worked the land for many years before deeding to their daughter Mollie Moeller and her husband Roger Moeller.

The Moellers currently work the property and raise cattle, hay crops and wheat.

After realignment this

year, Haskell competed against Hamlin, Electra, Petrolia, Seymour and Munday for the district title. Hamlin, which represented our district in the playoffs, was defeated last week, after an outstanding run for the

state championship.

District 7-2A coaches met to nominate and choose the All-District players. Indian wide receiver Henry Smith made the First Team on offense, while Indian Reed Lee was selected to the First Team on defense. Finn Goette, with a unanimous vote, was named First Team Kicker, and Sam Fouts was recognized as an All-District Utility Player.

Named to the All-District Second Team offense were quarterback Dylan Hanson, running back Lane Burson, wide receiver Ryan Pace and offensive lineman Chase Gibson.

Included on the Second Team defense were inside linebacker Garret Tatum and defensive back Alec Roewe.

Honorable Mention picks for offense were wide receiver Fouts and offensive lineman Dakota Baumbach, while defensive tackle Gibson, outside linebacker Burson and defensive back Pace were listed on the defensive side.

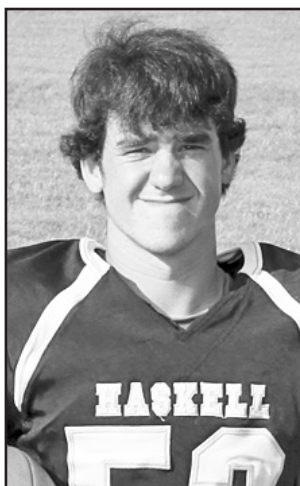

Congratulations to all these Indians for their accomplishments on the field and in the classroom.



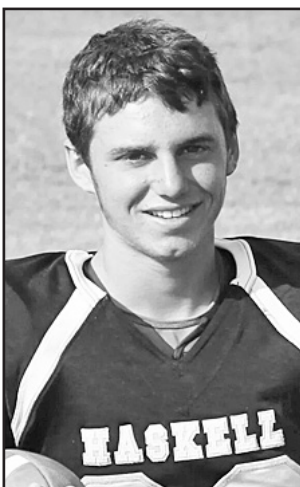

Haskell Maidens take down fourth ranked Lady Pirates

After coming off a much needed Thanksgiving break, the Maidens hit the road to take on the fourth ranked Eula Lady Pirates. Haskell raced out to a 27-18 halftime lead and never looked back going on to win 52-36. The Maidens move to 5-1 on the season.

Haskell was led by Senior Reagan Hadaway who finished with 34 points and 13 rebounds. She shot (11-18) for 61% from the field and (10-12) for 83% from the free-throw line. "I thought Reagan had a great all around game. She shot a very high percentage from the field and free-throw line. Jacie Klose and the rest of the girls did an outstanding job passing her the ball in scoring position. It was awesome to watch and it sure makes my job easier," Haskell head coach Blake Eddleman said.

Other leading scorers on the night were Klose with 6, Crissy Bassett 5, Kenzie Shelton 4 and Ashlyn Bevel 3. Klose did an excellent job

as the Maiden point guard and she finished the game with a team high 8 assists. "Jacie is the best point guard that I have ever coached in my career. She is a true point guard with great vision and great understanding of the game. In addition, she can score the ball when she wants too," Eddleman said.

Leading the team in rebounds was Hadaway with 13 followed by Shelton with 7, Bevel 5 and Klose 5. Hadaway also had a team high 3 steals followed by Klose with 3 and Bevel 2.

"Overall, I thought the girls played some tough man to man defense against a fundamentally sound Eula team. We also did a nice job shooting the ball from the field and free-throw line. The City of Haskell, as other cities, is having issues with taste and odor in the city's water supply. The city continues to work with our water supplier to correct these issues. Some of the issues are beyond both entities control, as they are caused by natural processes.

The City of Haskell continues to flush our water lines to ensure water safety. Flushing our lines bring up the chlorine residual in our system which ensures we have safe water to supply our customers. The city checks the chlorine five times a week and four samples are sent to the water lab in Abilene once a month to ensure the safety of our water that we are

delivering to our customers. The result of these tests are sent to Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) every month by the water lab. TCEQ also monitors our water and would cut off our water distribution system if our water was unsafe to use.

The city does not like that we waste our precious water while flushing our line, but it is unavoidable and necessary to ensure public safety.

The State FFA Leadership Development Contests were held the past weekend on the campus of Sam Houston State University in Huntsville.

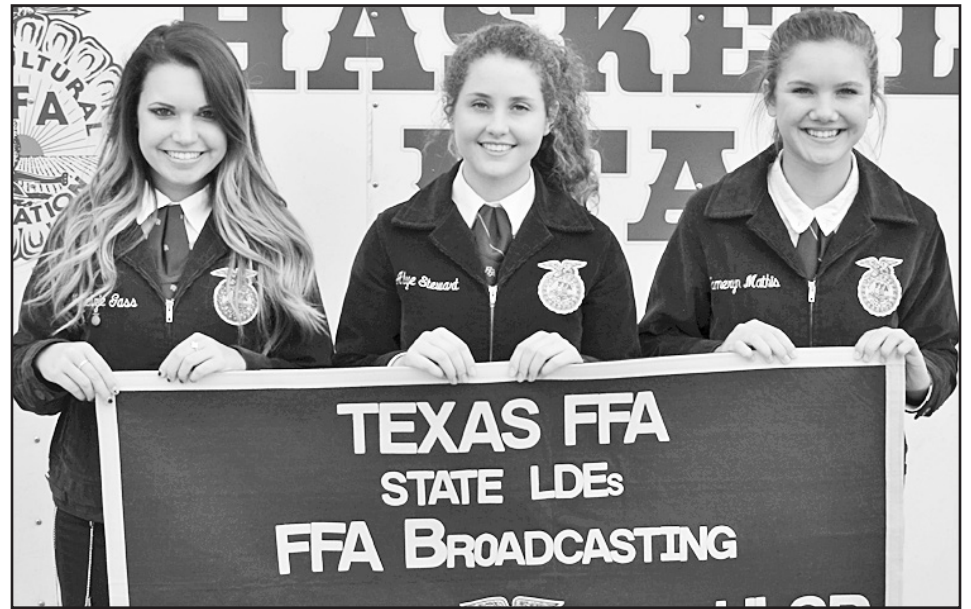

SFDP exceeds first year expectations

The Development Corporation of Haskell (DCOH) and Haskell Downtown Revitalization Committee (DRC) are pleased with the response to the first round of Store Front Development Program (SFDP) projects completed in 2013-2014 calendar year.

Fourteen of the sixteen projects eligible to receive grant funds through the program have completed their agreed to façade improvements, or have made plans to do so by the end of 2014. The program required participants to follow a plan for renovations approved by the DRC and then submit the necessary documentation at the completion of their renovation to receive up to a \$2,500 matching grant for the façade improvements. Renovations completed through the program included installations of new awnings, signage, windows and lighting as well as implementing a common color palate and proper painting techniques to highlight building architecture and aesthetics.

"The biggest concern of residents and building owners who participated in our 2012 community meeting was how our community could resolve eyesores downtown and bring continued vibrancy to the area," said Wallace Emerson, Executive Director of the DCOH. "The DCOH board of directors believed incorporating the SFDP and grants into their 2013-2014 budget would be a good starting point for this concern. The program worked so well the first time, they voted to include a second round SFDP grants for their 2014-2015 budget which will include twenty-one new projects to be completed by the end of 2015."

Buildings with projects completed through the 2013-2014 program include Henderson Bookstore, old Johnson Real Estate and Kis Photo building, Boggs & Johnson Furniture, Verizon Wireless, old Western Auto building, old Free Press building, Personality-Slipper Shoppe, DixieBz, Texas Trims, Big Country Realty, Kaleidoscope, Tidbits & Treasures, Haskell Abstract & Title and American Legion building.

In total, the DCOH board of directors has allotted a combined total of \$61,000 for SFDP grants in their 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 fiscal year budgets. To date, \$20,551.00 of the allotted funds have been disbursed.

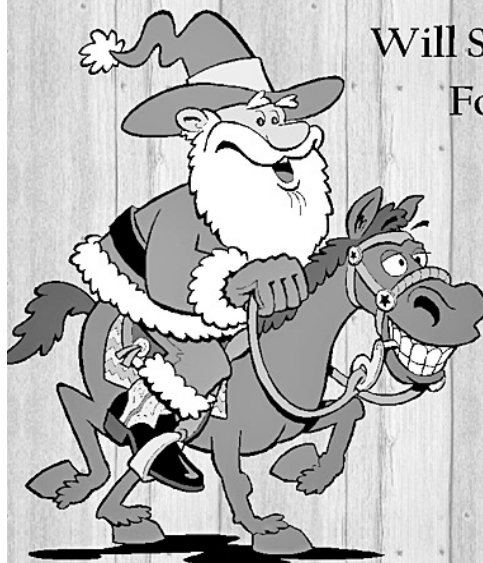

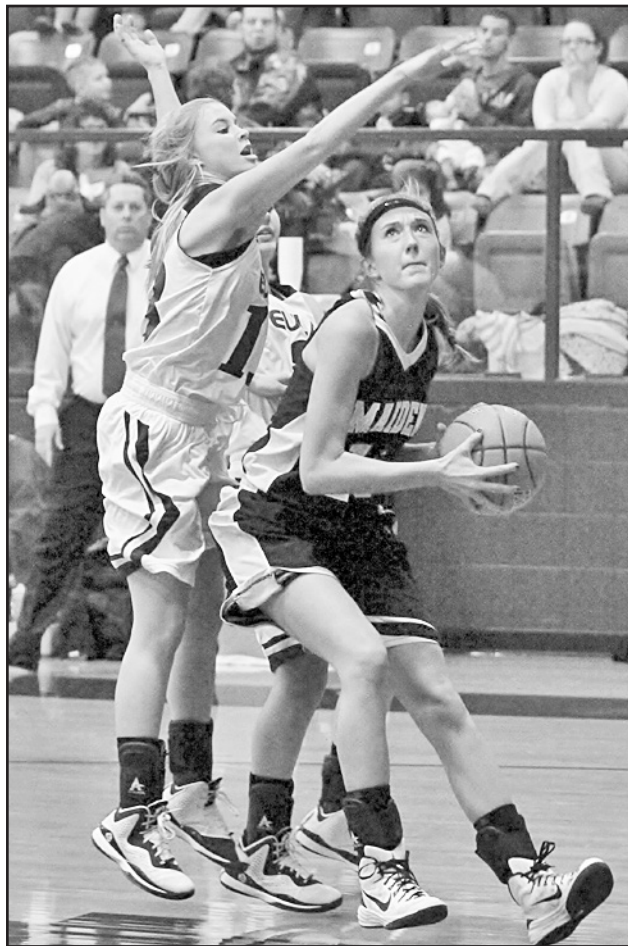
