Approximately 50 persons attended.

Similar programs will be presented Wednesday evening at the Stokes school house and Friday night at Valley View. They will be continued until programs have been staged at

each of the county's rural schools. The meetings are open to the public.

Delbert Downing, Jaycee president, was master-of-ceremonies at the Tuesday night performance, with Joe Mims, Midland attorney, delivering the principal address.

Numbers by the Dixie Hot Shot String Band opened the performance. Roy DeWolfe played two accordion solos, followed by two vocal numbers by a "quartet" composed of Sam Spears, Margaret Savage, Roy Markham, Joe Erickson, Joe Sey-

LONDON (AP)—Pan American Airways has been authorized to extend its service from Lisbon to Oporto, Eire, an official announcement said Wednesday.

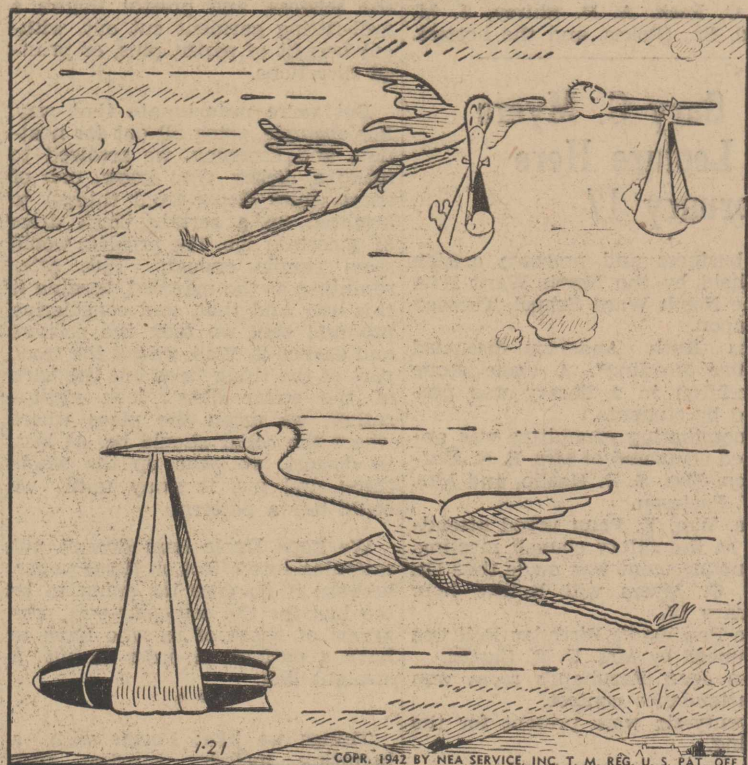

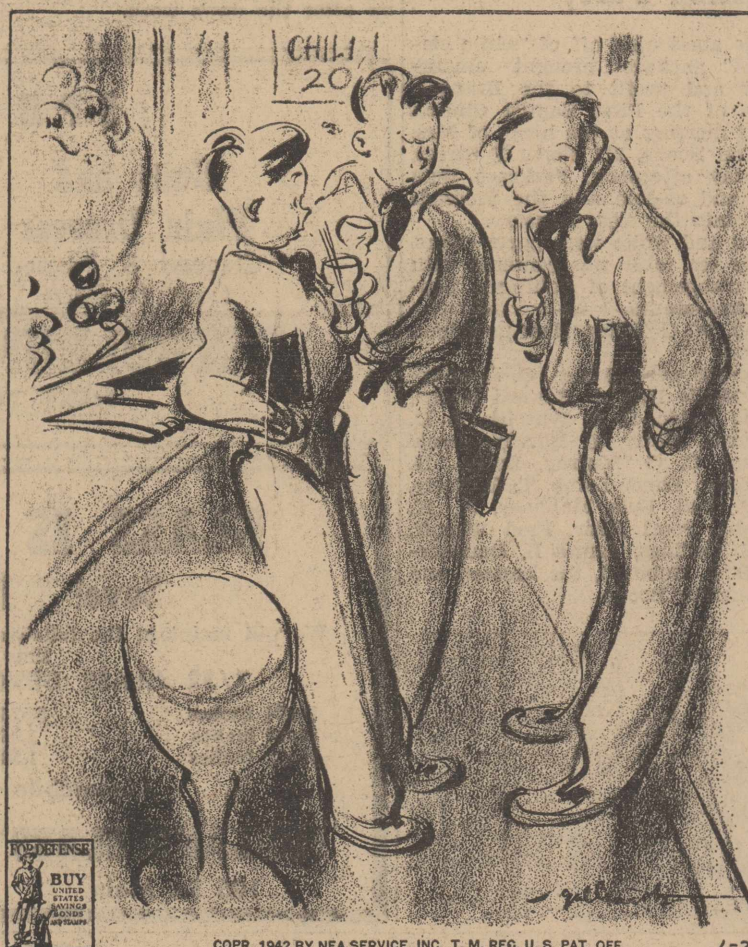
Many fires were started in the port area, said the announcement, which acknowledged loss of four planes in the assault.
