

A miller's existence was too tame for young Lillie, and he joined the outfit of "Trapper Tom" Evans, who was killing buffalo for their hides, and trapping other fur-bearing animals. Born too late to participate in chiefly in what is now western Ok-

> After a year of trapper's life, small band of Comanche Indians and deliverance from death beneath the hoofs of a huge herd of stampeding buffalo, Lillie entered the government Indian service at Pawnee, where the agency of the Pawnee tribe was located. That was in 1882.

He soon became a friend of the Indians and retained their confidence all his life. He learned their language and was made interpreter for the agen-

Colonel Cody employed Lillie in 1883 to accompany a group of Pownees that traveled with Cody's first wild west show. Lillie remained with the shows two years, resigning to form his own organization. Pawnee Bill's wild west show became one of the best paying circus properties in the United States. took it to King Leopold's International Exposition at Antwerp, Belgium, and later toured Europe for two years.

In 1888, after the death of Capt. David L. Payne, Lillie took up Payne's fight to open Oklahoma Territory for white settlement. The territory was then occupied by cattle barons who resisted all efforts of small farmers to enter. Lillie organized the "Oklahoma Boomers" at Wichita, Kan., and entered Oklahoma with them on April 22, 1889, known now as the birthday of the

In the winter of 1893, backed by the Arkansas City, Kan., board of trade, he organized the "Cherokee Strip Boomers," and was the leader in opening of the "strip", a narrow slice of land in Northern Oklahoma.

A combination of the Buffalo Bill and Pawnee Bill shows was effected in 1907, and for five years the organization toured the United States and Canada

At the death of Colonel Cody Lillie retired to his ranch and devoted the last years to perpetuating the buffalo.

His survivors include a brother Albert Lillie of Pawnee, and two sisters, Mrs. Albert Judy and Mrs. Lena Green, both of Henryetta.

### McKENNEY ON BRIDGE

By William E. McKenney America's Card Authority

The opening bids and responses, together with slam bidding after a four no trump call, have been pretty well standardized into a few wellknown systems. But bidding tactics for the part of the auction between these two extremes is still any man's land. There are many systems and ideas contending for gen-eral acceptance as to this intermediate range.



Al Weiss of New York, a player well on his way to becoming a senior master, recommends linking the early responses to a system of slam bidding. In his system, the response to an opening two-bid is based on controls; in fact, all subsequent bids by the partner of the opening bidder must endeavor to show what the hand holds in first and second round controls, even third round if time permits.

After an opening bid of two of a suit, the responding hand must bid two no trump if he holds no ace. But he may jump to three no trump with one and one-half honor tricks but no ace. Likewise he may jump to four of the original suit with long strong support but no With one or more aces, he must commence bidding the suits of the aces, starting with the ace of the opener's suit if he has it.

Today's hand shows how the Weiss system would handle a slam hend. North's response of three hearts shows the heart ace. North's raise of the second suit bid by South shows the king. That is all the information South needs to bid

Notice that with his freak hand, South needs to know exactly what North's high cards are, because top clubs would not help his hand, and anything less than the ace in spades would be useless.


