Secretary of War Stimson announced Thursslay that American-Filipino defenders of Bataan numbered 36,853 troops when their resistance apparently collapsed after three months of bloody conflict against Japan's invasion armies.
Stimson indicated that the bulk of this force had either been killed or cap ured.
The War Secretary also disclosed President Roosevelt has authorized the American commander in the Philippines to make any decision he deemed necessary in the light of events.
"This is only a temporary loss," Stimson said. "We shall not stop until we drive out the invaders from the islands.
Stimson's report on the end of America's heroic chapter of Bataan followed a War Department bulletin announcing that wave after wave of Japanese shock troops had engulfed the battle-exhausted defenders east Malta Stands Despite Mass Raids Of Axis flank, on Manila Bay
