entitled to a full, fair and impartial statement, supported with figures, from a source in which the public has

About the only excuses advanced are that lend shortage. Now lend-lease Administrator Edward R. Stet-
tinus knocks out the first with figures and casts doubt pon the second.
The first two months of this year, reports Stettinus,

1000 of our beef, and even this was five times the rate
in 1942 , at the end of which decent beef was almost unobtainable by civilians.
