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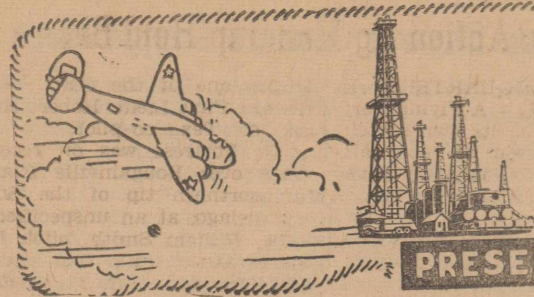

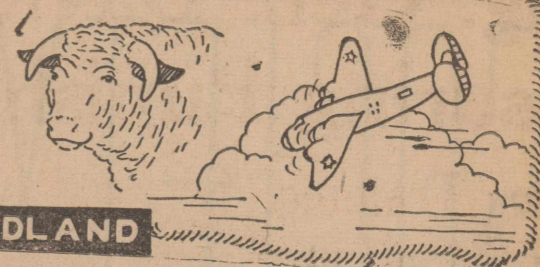

Soft Water Service Fills A Definite Need In This Area

Man depends upon three things—food, air and water. In the past, much has been done to condition both food and air, but until recent years little has been done for water. Now water is successfully being treated to make it more agreeable.

Soft water in the home not only lifts a burden for the homemaker, but also provides many other benefits. It is especially helpful in these days of shortages of critical materials. Steve Vaughan, manager of the Soft Water Service, points out. It keeps hot water heaters free of lime and helps keep repairs to a minimum. Almost 70 per cent less soap is necessary, and fats and oils which make soap are critical materials.

Scouring powders are not necessary where soft water is used, and fabrics last three times as long when washed in zero soft water. Twenty per cent less coffee is needed when soft water is used to make the same amount of coffee. But one of the greatest assets of the unit is the comfort and luxury of having soft water in the home. Since the water used in Midland has about 13 degrees of hardness, the Soft Water Service fills a definite need in this area, and home owners without its benefits are urged to investigate the service offered.

The idea of furnishing soft water for American homes on a service basis, without investment to the home owner was conceived in 1938 by H. J. Trumbull and W. L. Wall at Wheaton, Illinois. After developing and proving the benefits of the system, the two men expanded their operations and now own or control the operation of almost 10,000 water softener units in Texas, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan and Washington. It is their firm belief that 20 years from now there will be a soft water unit in every home in hard water communities of the country.

The Soft Water Service unit is a portable affair 43 inches high by 19 inches in diameter and is connected between the raw water supply and the hot water heater. It is changed periodically, depending upon the water consumption, and a truck calls on scheduled days, the old softener is removed and a fresh one installed. Through the means of a patented slip connection, this procedure of exchanging the softener is only a matter of seconds. The exhausted softener is taken back to the plant where it is sterilized and rejuvenated. It then is ready for its cycle again.

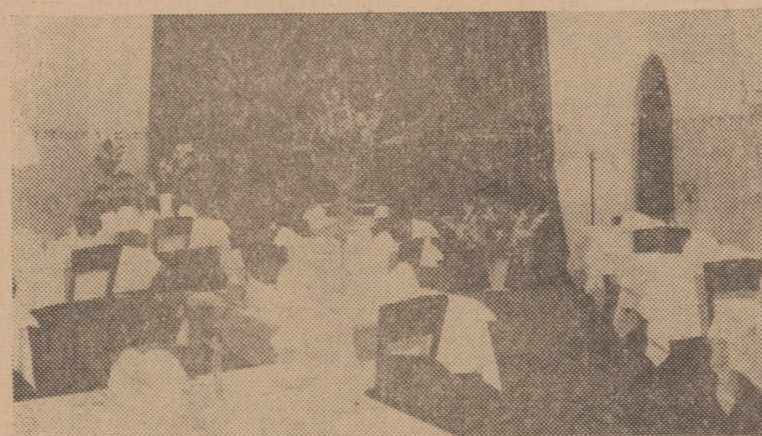
Although materials are scarce, the company is granted limited amounts of steel for manufacturing the units. At the present time it has available about 100 additional units ready to be put in service in the Midland-Odessa territory. 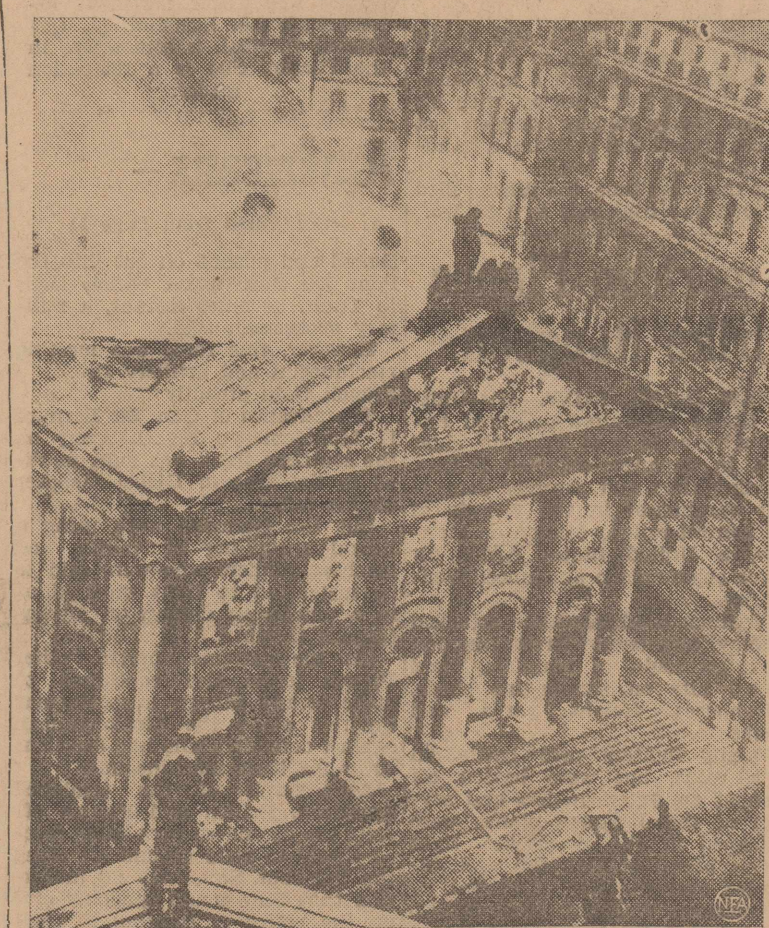
He has been known to give complete dinners of exotic foods from cans and one friend accused him of being a magician because he could always produce a can of any food mentioned from his well-stocked shelves.

Better Relationship With Latin American Neighbors Is Urged

HOUSTON (AP)—It will be necessary for North Americans to arrive at a better understanding of Latin Americans if a permanent peace is to be achieved, Dr. John C. Patterson, chief specialist of inter-American educational relations, Washington, D. C., told delegates to the state conference of the Pan-American round table Tuesday night.

He urged that more Spanish be taught in the United States and particularly in Texas, pointing out that the English language is being studied in all Latin American countries.

"The solution of the economic and political problems which face the Latin American countries can be achieved only through educating these people concerning their neighbors," Patterson said.
