#### Americans Down 102 Nazi Planes In Sweep Sunday

General Eaker Says Raids Are Opening Road For Invasion

LONDON —(P)— Boosting Nazi lane losses to more than 300 in three days, American Flying Fortesses and escorting Thunderbolts shot down 102 enemy planes Sunday as the big bombers tore through stubborn defenses to blast important German transportation centers Muenster and Coesfeld.

Thirty bombers and two fighters a communique said, were lost by the American formations, which also hit an enemy airfield near Enschede, Holland, in the blazing climax to a weekend of violent Allied aerial activity that riddled the Germans' fighter strength.

Lt. Gen. Ira Eaker, commender of the U.S. Eight Air Force, disclosed that the attacking force on both Friday and Saturday totaled 400 bombers, and said these and other raids to follow were in preparation for an Allied invasion of Germany "across the English Channel and the North Sea."

While the size of the attacking American formations was not officially disclosed, there was reason to believe that they may have approximated the record concentrations of 400 bombers which hammered German targets on each of the two preceding days. Invasion Preparation

Commerce Secretary and RFC Chairman Jesse Jones believes that when the war is over local business should be given first chance at buying the government-owned war plants and converting them to civilian use. The RFC has more than \$7,000,000,000 invested in such facilities.

Administration advisers, pointing to last week's 20 per cent cutback in the planned production of destroyer escorts, urge that the country be given a headstart by chan-nelling into civilian goods production the materials and services made available by reductions of military output. War Mobilizer James F. Byrnes has been asked to name an agency to do the work and it has been suggested that a curtailed munitions industry be the first to build up production of es-

sential civilian commodities.

And it appeared Monday that an accounting of every dollar spent—before it is spent — will not be delayed until peacetime. Chairman Thomas (D-Okla), of the Senate military approximations as military appropriations subcommittee and Chairman Cannon (D-Mo) of the House appropriations group made it clear that congressional war and other departments to "get down to brass tacks" in the future when they ask for money and that they must expect no more fast-action, overall fiscal outlays.


