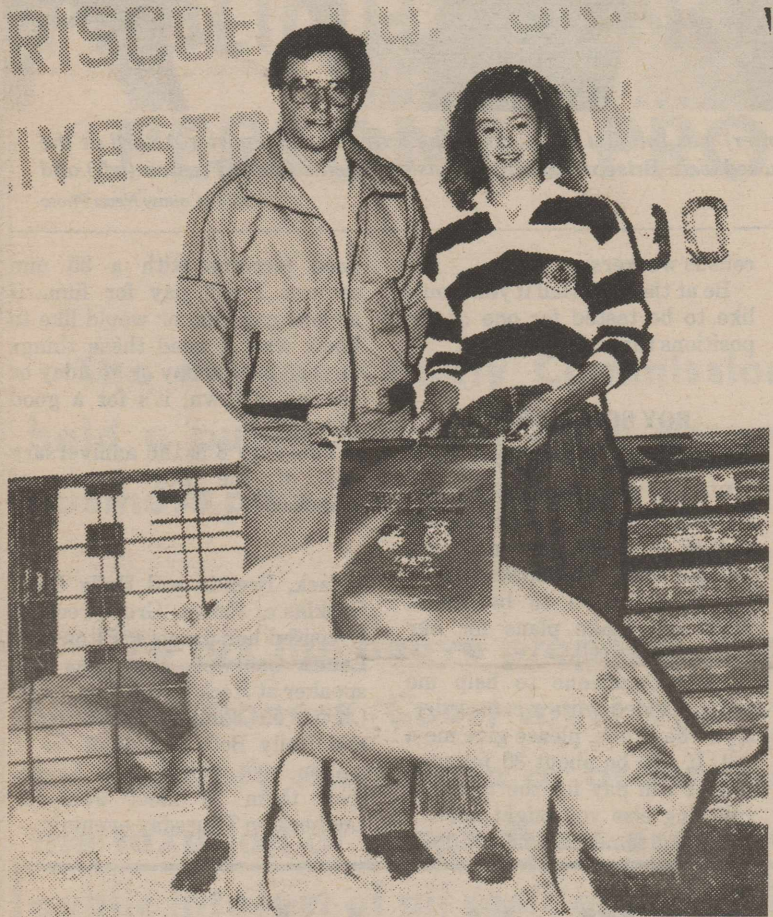
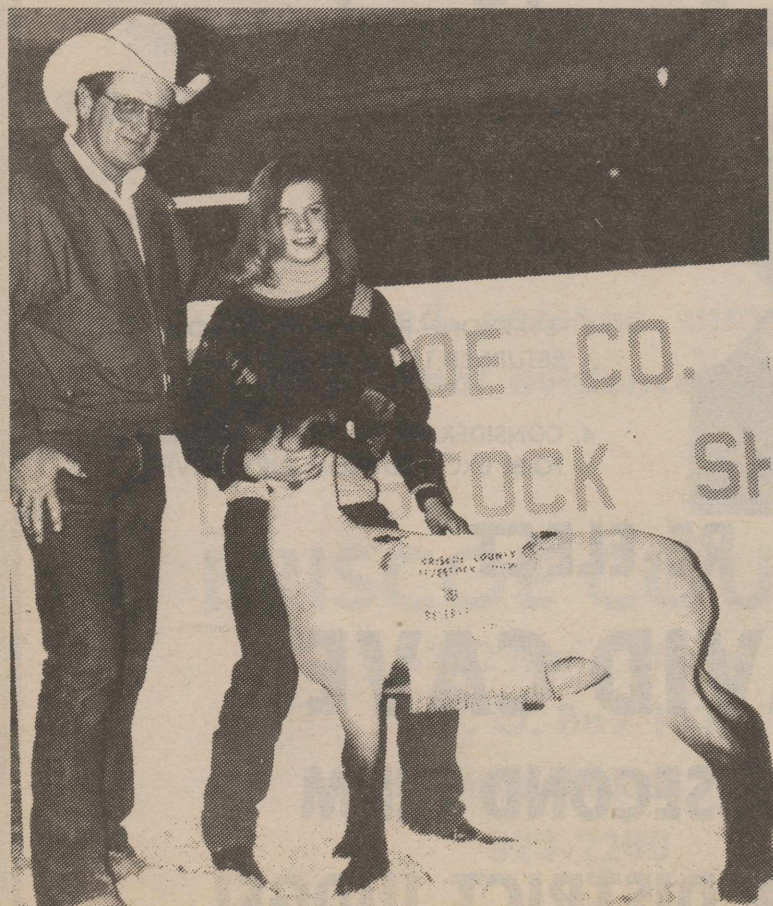

Stella Maye McJimsey, 92, died Monday night, February 5, at St. Anthony's Hospital in Amarillo, following surgery for the repair of a broken hip.

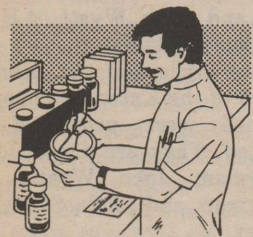
Funeral services will be conducted at 2:00 p.m. today (Thurs-

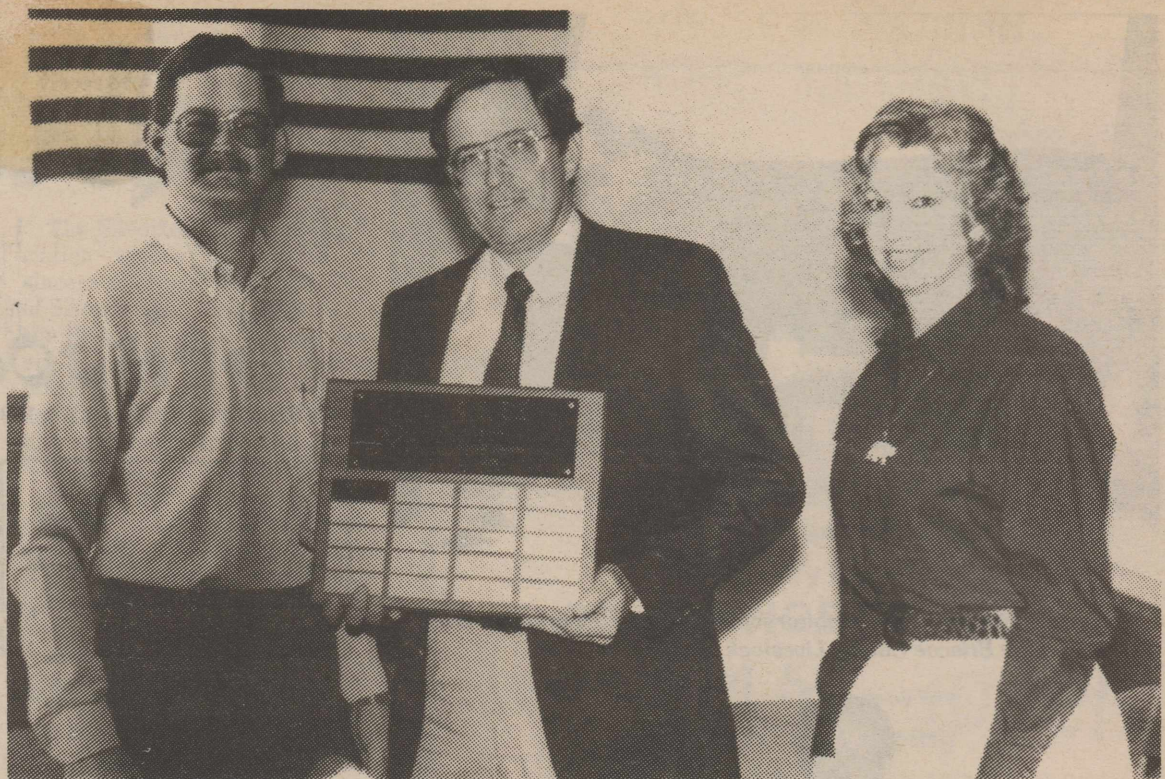
