

Appraisal Board Has Business Session

Present at the regular business meeting of the directors of Briscoe County Appraisal District July 12 were L. B. Garvin, jr., Jimmy Burson, Dewey Estes and Tommy Burson, along with Carlye Fleming, chief appraiser. Absent

The financial report was given by Mrs. Fleming, and motion was made by Jimmy Burson, seconded by Tom Burson, and carried to set Tuesday, July 24 at 10:00 as the time to adopt the 1991 budget.

The 1989 tax collections through the month of June were Briscoe County, 96.5%; Silverton ISD, 97.5%; City of Silverton, 96.0%; City of Quitaque, 92.7%; Mackenzie Water Authority, 96.0%. This represents overall 1989 collections of 96.6%.

Mrs. Fleming noted that each taxing unit now has received a certified delinquent tax roll which lists all delinquent taxpayers. A total of the delinquent taxes turned over to the attorneys includes Briscoe County, \$11,637.27; Silverton ISD, \$10,096.99;

City of Silverton, \$1,559.03; City of Quitaque, \$2,878.19; Mackenzie Water Authority, \$1,575.52.

Mrs. Fleming reported that the 1990 Appraisal Review Board held its Protest Hearings on July 6, and certified the appraisal records that same day. She noted that values are down from last year. The 1990 Certified Values are Briscoe County, \$109,745,857; Silverton ISD, \$78,187,561; City of Silverton, \$13,930,953; Mackenzie Water Authority, \$13,930,953; City of Quitaque, \$8,845,920.

The 1990 taxable values are Briscoe County, \$79,114,637, down \$1,715,887; Silverton ISD, \$53,098,751, down \$852,536; City of Silverton, \$13,923,453, down \$257.929; Mackenzie Water Authority, \$13,934,453, down \$257,929; City of Quitaque, \$8,835,920, down \$296,100.

According to Mrs. Fleming, the major factor in the declining value this year is the reduction in value of the Red River Pipeline which affects both Briscoe County and Silverton ISD. She noted

that they don't have a good market for the gas they are transporting. Recently 50% of the pipeline sold to two companies for a minimal amount of money and assumed over \$17,000,000 worth of debts. It was appraised June 1 by a prominent appraiser from Austin who valued the pipeline at \$70,715 per mile. (There are 29.47 miles of the pipeline in Briscoe County.) It was the recommendation of Louis Henderson of Lone Star Valuations, Inc. that the pipeline value be set at \$79,780 per mile for 1990. The ARB approved this value. Value loss of this pipeline was \$485,330 for Silverton ISD and \$890,580 for Briscoe County.
