SUPPRESSION OF CRIME.

There is a clearly defined public sentiment in Texas regarding the crimes that disgrace our State. This sentiment is rapidly crystallizing into a fixed and organized determination to redeem Texas from the reputation these crimes have made for her.

Men, en masse, do not so act in answer to what is called public opinion. Opinion is of intellectual birth—conviction founded upon evidence. All men do not think; and public opinion, as called, is but the echo by the many of the reasoning by a few.

When a sentiment takes hold of the great public heart, then it is that nothing is impeded toward march until it is satisfied. Public sentiment is not the following by the few of the leading of the many.

It is this kind of public sentiment—not opinion—that protests against crimes in Texas. The sentiment will not be checked except by a sufficient answer. Its first spontaneous outburst was in the unparalleled demand upon the late legislature for a prohibition law.

The prohibition demand is but a fraction of the work that should be done, and that will be done by the people. This great outburst of public sentiment, it is now poised, as it were, until a perfected plan of operation is reached; and it will, ere long, demand in a manner that cannot be resisted.

Whoever imagines that the defeat in the legislature of the people's demand will check them, has not manifested an overwhelming force that abides in a sentiment born of a whole people's heart to accomplish a humanitarian purpose.

The great curse of Texas is the fact that good citizens have in the past manifested so little active interest in politics. They have contented themselves with grumbling that governmental control is in the hands of the vicious.

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light over the question, a compromise reached whereby the granting of liquor licenses was allowed only in incorporated towns, thus preventing the sale of liquor in country stores. But in Ohio the warmest fight has waged, no less than twenty-four anti-liquor bills being introduced in the Legislature.

It will thus be seen that there is a temperance wave now sweeping over this country, such as has never been witnessed before. It has spread even into Canada, and an earnest crusade is now being carried on in Montreal by the Catholic archbishop of that city at its head, against intemperance and the use of liquor.

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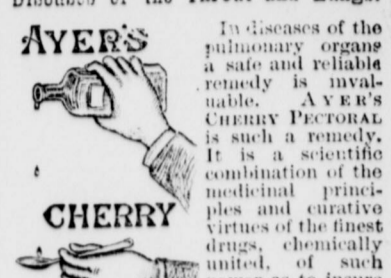
