Anyone who feels that they might be eligible to receive
Supplemental Security Income Supplemental Security income
checks is encouraged to apply at the local Social Security Office.
Glyn Hammons, manager of Glyn Hammons, manager of
the Abilene Social Security the Abilene Social Security
office, says that Supplemental
Security Income Security Income claims can
usually be processed quickly provided the appsicant brings
certain items with certain items with him when he
files for benefits. Bringing the necessary documents may alsa
prevent a person from having to prevent a person from having to
return to the Social Security return to the Social Security
Office in many cases. Hammons said.
What to bring to file a claim depends on the type of
Supplemental Security Income claim. For example, a person 65
or older will need to or older will need to prove his
age, so his birth or baptismalage, so his birth or baptismal-
certificate will be neecessary. On certicate will be necessary. On
the other hand, a person
applying on the basis of disability or blind ness should
bring the names. bring the names, addresses.
and phone numbers of all
doctors doctors, hospitals and other
medical facilities what have treated them for disability.
Particular items may not be required from persons who are
presently drawing presently drawing Social Secur
ty benefits, Hammons said. ty benefits, Hammons said.
Since Supplemental Securit Income eligibibility also depends on having limited income and
resources, a person will need evidence of things he owns and proof of recent earnings and include for examp.e. Proofs will a copy of the most recent tax
return, checkbooks, savings account books, stock and bonds, ilie insurance policies, auto
registration cards, and the recent real eards, and the most tat state-
ments. Also award latt showing the amount of VA
pensions, civil service annuities or other similar benefits will be
helpful in process helpful in processing a Supple
mental Security Income claim Applicants who are married
should also should also bring documents
showing their husband's or Showing their husband's
wife's income and resources. Since every recipient must be a citizens of the United States or
an alien lawfully admitted for an alien lawfully admitted for
residence, a voter's registration card or alien resistration car
will will be necessary. A birth
certificate, passport or certificacertificate, passport or certifica
