The Rotan Gin led all seven gins with 6,390 bales. Hobbs Gin was second with 4,433 and Farmers Union Coop Gin at Roby was third with 3,928 bales.

The Farmers Gin at Rotan has baled a total of 3,210. Terry Gin has baled 2,400, Longworth Gin 1,184 and Sylvester Gin 450
