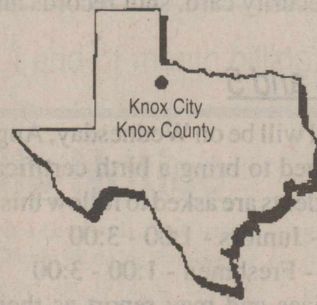

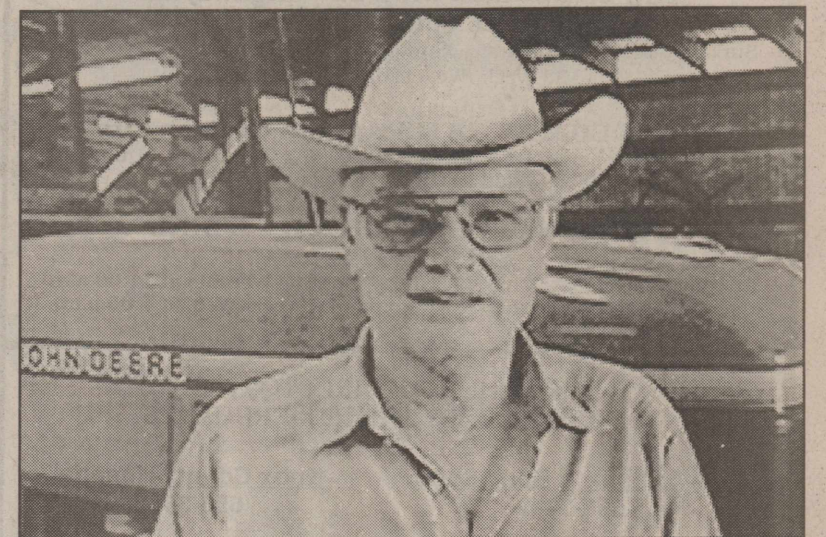

## Knox City - O'Brien CISD readies for upcoming school year, registration set

Students attending school in the Knox City - O'Brien Consolidated Independent School District in the upcoming 1999 - 2000 school year are reminded that the first day of the new school year will be Thursday, August 12.

Registration schedules have been announced. Students will be given a list of supplies needed at their respective registrations, new students need a birth certificate, social security card, shot records and records from prior school.

### High School to register August 4 and 5

Registration for the 1999-2000 school year at Knox City High School will be on Wednesday, August 4, and Thursday, August 5, at the high school library. New students will need to bring a birth certificate, social security card, shot records and records from their prior school. Students are asked to follow this schedule.

**Wednesday, August 4** - Seniors - 9:00 - 12:00 - Juniors - 1:00 - 3:00

**Thursday, August 5** - Sophomores - 9:00 - 12:00 - Freshmen - 1:00 - 3:00

Some students will already be involved in extra-curricular practices and may report as their practice schedules permit. High school principal Mack Lowe reminds students and parents that this process may require some time, especially for the underclassmen. Parents are welcome and encouraged to accompany their children to registration. Special Education students daily time schedules will not be finalized at this time, but course selections may be made.

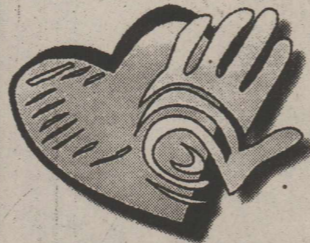
Jimmy and Michele Barrientez of Lubbock spent the weekend with homefolks.
