

Make your plans now to enjoy yourself on Saturday at the City Park.



# **Buying school clothes?** Sales tax holiday coming August 6-8

School buildings are mostly empty. Family vacations are underway. Texas temperatures are rising. The Rangers and Astros lead their divisions. It's definitely summertime in the Lone Star State

Summer is in full swing, but Texas families might want to start thinking about their back-toschool shopping. Why? Thanks to senate Bill 441, which the Legislature passed and Governor Bush signed earlier this year, Texas families will enjoy 72 hours of tax-free shopping in early August.

On August 6, 7, and 8, Texans will enjoy the first-ever sales tax "holiday". Items of children's and adult clothing, and non-athletic shoes, sorting less than \$100 will be completely exempt from state and local sales taxes. Texas leaders estimate this sales tax holiday will save Lone Star State consumers \$69.2 million.

The sales tax holiday means


that consumers will save up to 8.25% on their purchases of Wranglers, Red Wings, or Doc Martins.

Athletic shoes and clothing commonly used as everyday wear, such as football jerseys, baseball caps or running shoes costing less than \$100, will be exempt. But items used exclusively for athletic purposes, such as golf shoes or football pants, are not eligible for the sales tax break. In addition, jewelry, handbags, wallets and formal wear are not exempt. Sales tax holidays conducted in other big states have proven to be good news for retailers and consumers alike. Since January 1997, New Yorkers have saved \$81.6 million thanks to three sales tax holidays. Florida's \$50 sales tax holiday conducted last August saved families \$15.1 million.

Texas' August 6-8 sales tax holiday is part of a package of pro-consumer tax relief measures aimed at putting money back into the pockets of Texas families. The Legislature also eliminated sales taxes on over-the-counter medications and up to \$25 per month in Internet access charges. Altogether, state leaders cut consumer, sales, business and property taxes by nearly \$2 billion this year allowing citizens to keep more of their hard-earned money.

State leaders used the record \$6.4 billion budget surplus wisely. We funded record increases in public school funding, a \$3,000 pay raise for school teachers, human service and criminal justice needs, and then returned nearly \$2 billion to the people in the form of tax cuts.

Going back to school is often stressful for children and parents alike. Back to school shopping can be a taxing and expensive experience. Fortunately, our state leaders have made things easier by cutting taxes for school related clothing, so remember that you have 72 hours of tax-free shopping on August 6, 7 and 8.

# King County memorial honors slain sheriff and DPS trooper

### 26 years after killing By JIMMYE TAYLOR The Paducah Post

Two memorial monuments were placed at the King County Courthouse Saturday. July 17. 1999, honoring Paul Vinson, King County Sheriff who was slain in May of 1972, and Gayle Holmes, Highway Patrolman, who was killed in the same incident. Texas Department of Public Safety arranged for the memorial to the fallen officers.

The two granite monuments were set side by side in front of the courthouse. and in a ceremony presided by Sgt. Beckworth of the Department of Public Safety, were dedicated to the slain officers' memory.

Wording on the monuments

was exactly alike:

"We the people of the State of Texas acknowledge and thank (the names of Vinson and Holmes) for the great sacrifice he made to keep the public safe. His efforts will stand the test of time. May God rest his soul. May 19, 1972."

Wives, children and other family members joined a large group of DPS officers and officials, county sheriffs from surrounding counties, and other friends and associates at the ceremony.

Beckworth thanked the "We The People Of The State of Texas" organization who made the project possible, and Richard Metcalf, brother of Robert Metcalf, who started the organization to honor fallen law officers, spoke of his *See Memorial Honors, Page 3*

# Gramm announces funding for low-income KC housing

## \$788,600 grant awarded to Housing Authority

WASHINGTON - U.S. Senator Phil Gramm has announced the award of a \$788,600 Comprehensive Improvement Assistance Program (CIAP) grant to the Knox City Housing Authority.

CIAP is a program of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development.

"These funds will be used for emergency work items which pose an immediate threat to the safety of residents," Gramm said. The funding is for asbestos abatement, replacement of damaged wall and ceiling sheetrock and for plumbing repairs.

The projects must be completed within a year of CIAP funding approval.

"I am pleased that, once again, we have been able to return some of the money Texans have paid in federal taxes to directly benefit Texas," Gramm said.

HUD provides capital funds to improve the physical condition and upgrade the management and operation of existing public housing projects.

brother's dedication to the project. The two monuments were the latest of 76 which have already been erected in honor of 73 DPS officers and a number of sheriff's who died in the same incidents. Fifteen more monuments are to be set, Metcalf said.


Vinson, who was only 43 years old when he was killed, and Holmes, 26, were both married, and left wives and children behind.

The shooting occurred at the Northcutt store, midway between Paducah and Guthrie in King county, about 10 o'clock in the evening of May 19, 1972. Sheriff Vinson and two Highway Patrolmen, one of whom was Holmes, were called to the store to answer a complaint about drunks causing a ruckus on the premises.

Shots erupted as the officers stepped out of their vehicles, killing Vinson instantly with a slug to the neck. Holmes was shot in the chest and died a few minutes later.


Vinson was in his first term as sheriff, and Holmes had been a Highway Patrolman three years.





# Benjamin ISD Announces School Lunch Guidelines

The Benjamin school serves meals each school day. Children may buy lunch for 80¢ / \$1.00 and breakfast for 80¢ / \$1.00. If you now get food stamps or TANF for your children, your children can get free meals. If your total household income is the same or less than the amounts on the Income Chart below, your children can get free meals or reduced-price meals regardless of your income. The reduced price is 40¢ for lunch and 30¢ for breakfast. To apply for free or reduced meals, you may pickup an application at the school office.

### HOW TO APPLY

<u>If you now get food stamps or TANF</u> for the children you are applying for, the application must have the children's names, a food stamp or TANF case number for each child, and the signature of an adult household member. <u>If you are applying for a foster child</u>, the application must have the child's name, the child's "personal use" income, and an adult signature. <u>If you do not list a food stamp or TANF case number</u> for all children you are applying for, then the application must have the children's names, the names of all household members, the amount of income of each person got last month and where it came from, the signature of an adult household member and that adult's social security number or the word "none" if the adult does not have a social security number.

In references to the minutes that was published in the Munday Courier a couple of weeks ago on the Knox County Commissioners Court.


We would like to know how other taxpayers in our county feels about funding a new building for a court room?
