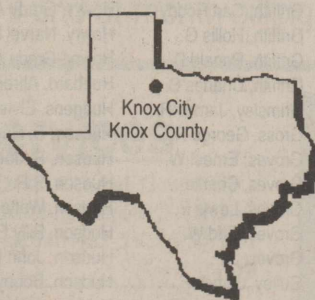

Father and son injured in vehicle rollover accident

Early last Sunday morning, a one vehicle rollover accident west of O'Brien seriously injured David Carver and his son Caleb, both of Knox City.

After being ejected from their pickup truck during the rollover, both David and Caleb were taken to the Emergency Room at the Knox County Hospital in Knox City. After initial trauma treatment there, both were airlifted by a medical helicopter to Hendrick Medical Center in Abilene.

Children's Hopes and Dreams Foundation sends Lyndon Baty and his family to Disney World in Florida

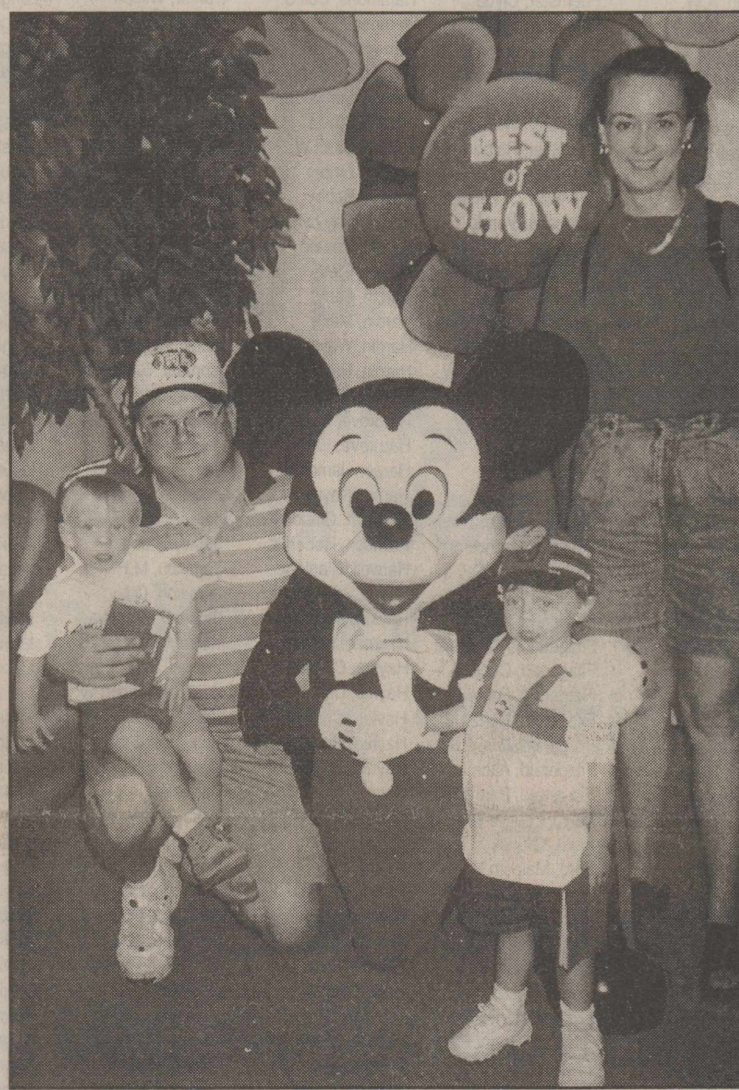

It is a magical place for children with life-threatening illnesses. The village, established in 1986 by a visionary, Henri Landwirth, is a 51-acre resort that provides entertainment, food and lodging while critically-ill children and their families enjoy all of Central Florida's attractions including Disney World, Sea World, and Universal Studios.

"It is the most incredible place in the world," Lyndon's parents, Louis and Sheri, remarked. The village is an amusement park within itself. There is an endless list of things from eating all of the ice cream you desire, games to play, and trains to ride in addition to eating breakfast with Disney's Pluto and Goofy as well as meeting Mickey Mouse. "Children's Hopes and Dreams Foundation and Give Kids the World pro-

vided us with incredible memories for our family."

While at the attractions, the Baty family met stars including Mickey Mouse, Minnie Mouse, Donald Duck, Winnie the Pooh, Tigger, Piglet, Chip and Dale, Peter Pan, Scooby Doo, George Jetson, Fred Flintstone, Lassie, and Tarzan, as well as enjoying all of the rides and events at each theme park. The Baty's spent quality time together as a family without having to focus on the constant struggles of Lyndon's illness. Medical care was readily available at the village and local hospital as needed.

Lyndon was diagnosed with Infantile Polycystic Kidney Disease at birth. It is a genetic condition usually unknown to the parents, that affects the child's kidneys, liver, spleen and induces extreme blood pressure. Few children survive past 1 month of age. "Lyndon is a daily blessing to us. His zest for life is amazing and a lesson to us all," Louis and Sheri stated. Lyndon turned 4 on January 8, the weekend before the Baty's enjoyed their trip to Florida. In addition, Louis and Sheri have been blessed with their second child, Sheldon, who shows no signs of the disease.

Immunization clinic to visit in Munday on Thursday, February 3

The Texas Department of Health will conduct an Immunization Clinic at the Perry Patton Community Center in Munday on Thursday, February 3, from 10:00-11:30 and 1:00-3:00.

Immunizations offered include DTaP, Hib, Polio, Measles, Mumps and Rubella and Hepatitis B for infants as well as all school immunizations.

The Hepatitis B series was required for all 12 year olds on August 1, 2000. Parental notification

of the chickenpox disease or proof of the varicella immunization will also be required as of August 1, 2000 for all 12 year olds, kindergartners, or any child over the age

of 12 months in preschool, daycare or registered homes. Parents are asked to take time to check their

child's records and take appropriate action. Those interested in the varicella vaccine should call 940-574-2159.

Participants are asked to bring

immunization records and social security numbers. A parent, adult family member or legal guardian must accompany a minor.

All services provided by the Texas Department of Health are provided on a sliding fee scale but no one is denied services due to an inability to pay.

Emergency farm loan applications being accepted

Applications for emergency farm loans for damages and losses caused by drought occurring March 1, 1998 and continuing, are being accepted at the Farm Service Agency (FSA) offices located in Knox City and Seymour, FSA - Farm Loan Manager Bobby G. Cude said.

Knox and Baylor Counties are 2 of 68 in Texas recently named by Secretary of Agriculture Dan Glickman eligible for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from the drought.

Cude said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 80% of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue in business, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest is 3.75 percent.

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan," Cude said. Farmers participating in the Federal Crop Insurance program will have to figure in proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

"Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be accepted until September 12, 2000, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing and possibly over into the new farming season," Cude said.

FSA is a credit agency of the U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is authorized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work at and relay on farming for a substantial part of their living. Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who are U.S. citizens and to farming partnerships, corporations or cooperatives in which U.S. citizens hold a majority interest.

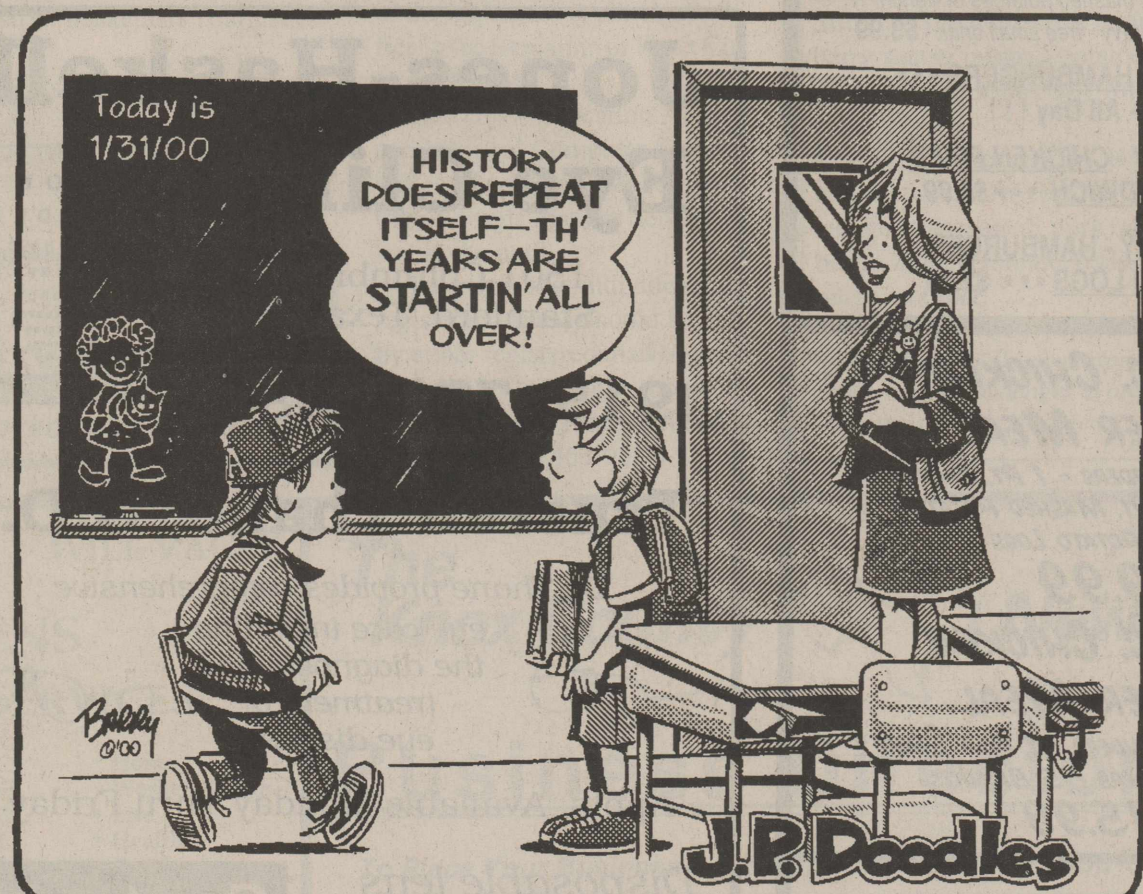

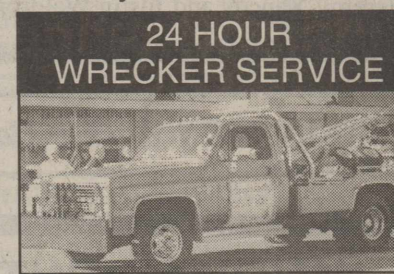

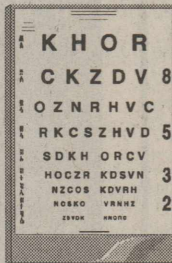

The spring administration of the exit level TAAS and TEAMS test will be conducted at 8:30 a.m. in the Benjamin and Knox City High Schools on the following dates:

February 22 - Writing (TAAS only); February 23 - Mathematics; February 24 - Reading
 Students currently enrolled in the 11th or 12th grades are eligible to take any section of the exit level test that they have not yet mastered.

In addition, individuals who are out of school may test at the spring administration.

Individuals who are no longer enrolled in a Texas public school and who wish to register to retake the TAAS test and all individuals who wish to take the TEAMS test, may pick up a registration packet at the high school principal's office in the Benjamin or Knox City High School.

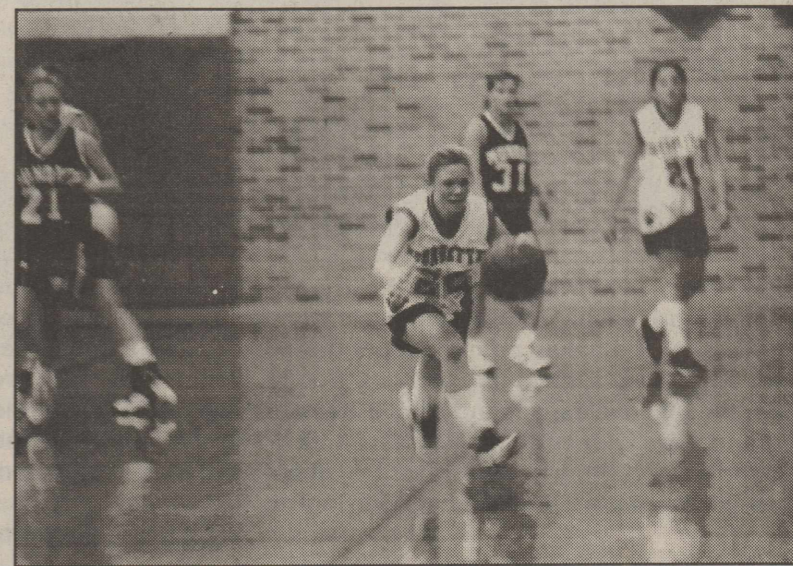
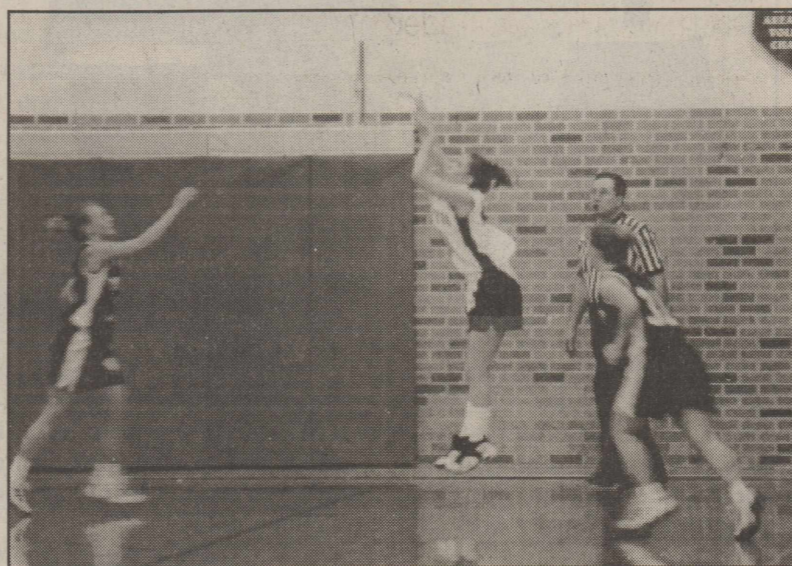

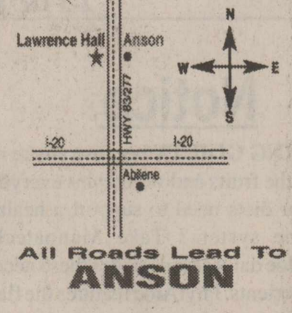
