#### Non-jury trials, hearings, pre-trial matters on docket of 50th Judicial District Court

Numerous non-jury trials, hearings and pre-trial matters were heard during the past two weeks on the criminal docket of the fourcounty 50th Judicial District Court, according to District Attorney Bill Neal.

A Knox County jury had been called for Tuesday, November 28, but various defendants who had demanded jury trials changed their minds and agreed to waive a jury trial and present their cases to the court.

On Tuesday, visiting Judge Leslie Thomas of Crowell heard the State present its case against Brenda Correll, 52, of Knox City who had been indicted for Theft by a Public Servant of over \$20,000.00 but less than \$100,000.00.

Correll who had been a clerk for Knox City in charge of collecting utility bills for the city had been accused of diverting the city's funds to her own use.

District Attorney Bill Neal presented an audit of the city's utility accounts over the period of the time during which Correll was responsible for collecting and depositing these accounts. Correll took the stand and admitted stealing utility funds from the city, but said she thought the total theft was about \$23,000.00, and plead guilty to the charge.

Judge Thomas accepted her guilty pleas and ordered a presentence report prepared. He stated that after he received the report he would set the date for a sentencing hearing.

Correll was represented by Andrew Ottaway of Haskell.

On Wednesday, District Judge David Hajek heard three companion cases against Michael ("Big Mike") Venard Toney, 33, of Dallas; Frank Masias, Jr., 33, of Austin; and David Castillo, 44, of Austin, all indicted for Conspiring to Deliver over Four Grams but 200 Grams of Cocaine and Engraving in Organized Criminal Activity over an eight-month period of time in 1999.

Toney entered a plea of guilty to the charge and received a 10year probated sentence, plus a \$1,000.00 fine. He was represented by Kris Fouts of Haskell.

Both Frank Masias Jr. and David Castillo entered pleas of "not guilty" but agreed to waive a jury trial and be tried before District Judge David Hajek.

 District Attorney Neal called various witnesses and introduced documents, including long distance phone records, motel records and Western Union wire transfer records tending to show that Frank Masias Jr. and David Castillo, both of Austin, had, over the eightmonth time frame, supplied cocaine to Munday residents Alfred Masias Jr., Dennis Masias and Mary Alice Masias for resale in the Knox area.

The investigation had been conducted by a joint effort between the North Texas Drug Task Force, Munday City Police Chief Kenny Barnett and the 50th Judicial District Attorney's Office, and had resulted in several undercover "buy" of cocaine from the conspirators.

After the case was presented and argued, District Judge David Hajek, found the defendants "guilty" and ordered a presentence report be prepared prior to sentencing. A sentencing hearing is anticipated in January 2001. Frank Masias was represented by Shane Deel of Abilene and David Castillo was represented by Neil Kucera of Austin.

Meanwhile, on the following Wednesday in the Knox County District Court, other members of the "cocaine conspiracy" appeared before District Judge Hajek and entered guilty pleas for their part in the drug dealings pursuant to plea bargain agreements with the State, represented by District Attorney Neal.

Both Dennis Masias, 39, of Munday, represented by Kyle Allen of Childress and Mary Alice Masias, 36, of Munday, represented by Paul Scott of Vernon, each received 109-year penitentiary sentences.


Cindy Masias, 26, of Munday, and Christy Masias Gallegos, 23, of Munday represented by Andrew Ottaway of Haskell entered "guilty" pleas to their part in the cocaine delivery conspiracy, a pursuant to a plea bargain agreement with the State, received fiveyear probated sentences.

Cindy Masias' punishment was "deferred adjudication" probation while Christy Masias Gallegos' punishment was by way of regular probation.

Alfred Masias Jr. (Junior), 25, of Munday has indicated he intends to enter a "guilty" plea to his part in the cocaine conspiracy at the next non-jury date in Knox County in exchange for a 15-year penitentiary sentence, according to District Attorney Bill Neal.

Alfred Masias Jr. is represented by Wichita Falls attorney Michael Valverde.

These cards are sent to TSCRA and entered in the central filing system right away. A cattleman, who re-records early, not only protests his brand but benefits by immediately having updated information in TSCRA's files.

It is illegal to brand cattle and horses without registering the brand, but anyone can register a brand without owning cattle or horses. For instance, a family whose grandfather ran cattle and horses under a certain brand can retain the brand for nostalgic purposes

Removing obsolete brands from the files! is the major advantage to re-recording. It benefits everyone involved in the Texas cattle industry. Re-recording is a fair and equitable way to handle brands. It keeps brands in the hands of people who can use them.
