Brother Kyle was born in Dallas and grew up in a Baptist preacher's family in Mesquite, Texas.



# Wichita-Brazos SWCD honors contest winners



The students were not the only winners Monday evening. The Wichita-Brazos SWCD presented each school in the county a gift of \$3,000.00 to be used in their ag department.






