Knox City-O'Brien receives TIF grant in amount of \$50,000 for KCHS campus

AUSTIN - High-tech, dot com, world wide web and surging the net are just a few phrases that can be associated with the technology revolution and have become staples in the daily lives of many Texans.

With the assistance of the Telecommunications Infrastructure Fund (TIF) Board, a state agency that provides funding for Texas public schools, new opportunities to participate in the every-progressing technology of today are now possible.

Students across the state are able to reap the benefits of technology in education. Using TIF grants, schools are introducing students to modern technology including high-speed Internet access and distance learning.

Knox City-O'Brien received a grant award of \$50,000 for the high school campus. This funding will be used to develop new, and expand current, technology infrastructure to provide students with the technology they needs to pre-

pare for the digital era.

The TIF Non-Competitive Grant for Texas Public Schools was designed to fund up to date hardware and connectivity equipment, high-speed workstations, Internet access, and / or distance learning equipment so that students may take classes from another school district and / or an institution of higher education.

Additionally, grant funds will be used for technology staff development, including hardware and software training, network training, methodology training, and base level technology training. These grant projects officially begin May 15, 2001.

In an effort to provide equitable funding for Texas public schools, TIF collaborated with the Texas Education Agency (TEA) by coordinating the release of PS9 grant award announcement with the Technology Integration in Education (TIES5) announcement.

Prior to this release, staff mem-

bers from both TIF and TEA met to discuss the functionality and purpose of each grant program. As a result, Texas public school districts will be able to leverage funds from both funding sources thus allowing schools to expand and increase technology capacity.

Since its creation by the 74th Legislature in 1995, TIF has awarded approximately \$592 million in grants to its four constituent groups - public schools, libraries, institutions of higher education, and public, not-for-profit healthcare facilities.

The agency receives approximately \$150 million per years in revenues from telecommunications assessments to disburse over a ten-year period.

Summer TAAS exit test set for July dates in KC and Benjamin

The summer administration of the exit level TAAS and TEAMS test will be conducted at 8:30 a.m. in the Benjamin and Knox City High Schools on the following

July 10 - Writing (TAAS only)
July 11 - Mathematics
July 12 - Reading

Students currently enrolled in the 10th, 11th or 12th grades are eligible to take any section of the exit level test that they have not yet mastered. In addition, individuals who are out of school may test at the summer administration.

Individuals who are no longer enrolled in a Texas public school and who wish to register to retake the TAAS test and all individuals who wish to take the TEAMS test, may pick up a registration packet at the high school principal's office in the Benjamin or Knox City high school.

The test registration form must be completed and returned in the pre-addressed envelope and must be received in Austin no later than 5:00 p.m., June 8, 2001.

The Texas Education Agency and NCS Pearson will not be responsible for registration forms that are delayed or lost in the mail.

To ensure that individuals are registered, forms should be sent by either registered mail or certified mail. Questions concerning the summer exit level test should be directed to the Texas Education Agency, Student Assessment Division, (512) 463-9536.

Veterans News Notes

Dewhurst announces opening of Alzheimer's wing at both Temple and Floresville State Veterans Homes

AUSTIN-Texas Land Commissioner David Dewhurst today announced the opening of a new 32 bed wing for the care of veterans with Alzheimer's Disease, at both the William R. Courtney Texas State Veterans Home in Temple, and the Frank M. Tejeda Texas State Veterans Home in Floresville. Dewhurst said the facilities serve Texas veterans, their spouses, surviving spouses and Gold Star parents.

"I'm so pleased that in addition to around-the-clock nursing care, we can now offer quality care for Texas veterans with Alzheimer's, as well as peace of mind for their loved ones," Dewhurst said. "If you know a Texas veteran who is diagnosed with this illness, please give us a call, and we'll offer to help."

Dewhurst said the newly opened wings are tailor-made for those suffering from Alzheimer's and boast numerous safety features. For example, Dewhurst said, a registered nurse is always on hand, and measures are taken to prevent residents from wandering off and becoming lost. A code must be entered on a push button lock to enter or leave the wings, and devices worn by residents trigger an alert if they leave secure areas.

"We want our residents to receive dignified, state-of-the-art care, and we want them to be safe," Dewhurst said. "There's great demand for homes specializing in Alzheimer's care, and we're delighted to be of service."

Dewhurst said the Alzheimer's wings have their own secure courtyards with eight-foot fences. In case of fire, the wings' main entrances and courtyard gates open automatically. In addition, Dewhurst said, the wings have their own dining and activities areas, and kitchenettes where residents can keep drinks and snacks.

"Texas veterans have given so much to America," Dewhurst said. "They made sacrifices and protected us while they served, and we should protect them when they can no longer care for themselves."

Dewhurst said the Temple and Floresville homes, along with a similar home in Big Spring, and one that will open soon in Bonham, house 160 veterans in spacious private and semiprivate rooms. Dewhurst said each Texas State Veterans Home has an Alzheimer's wing, and residents have access to a broad spectrum of health care services, a comprehensive rehabilitation program, special diets, recreational activities, social services, a library and gift shop.

The Temple home, located midway between Austin and Waco, serves Central and East Texas. The Floresville home, located 30 miles from San Antonio, serves Central and South Texas. The Big Spring home, approximately equidistant from Abilene, Lubbock, Midland, Odessa and San Angelo, serves West Texas and the Panhandle. The Bonham home, which will open late this spring, is located north of Dallas near the Red River, and will serve North and East Texas.

"We still have openings in all our veterans homes, but now is the time to apply for admission, because they're going to fill up fast," Dewhurst said. "I urge my fellow Texas veterans or their family members to call our toll free number at 1-800-252-VETS, or visit our Web site at www.glo.state.tx.us/vlb. "
