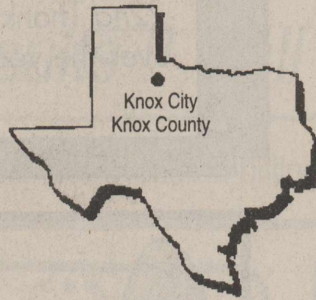

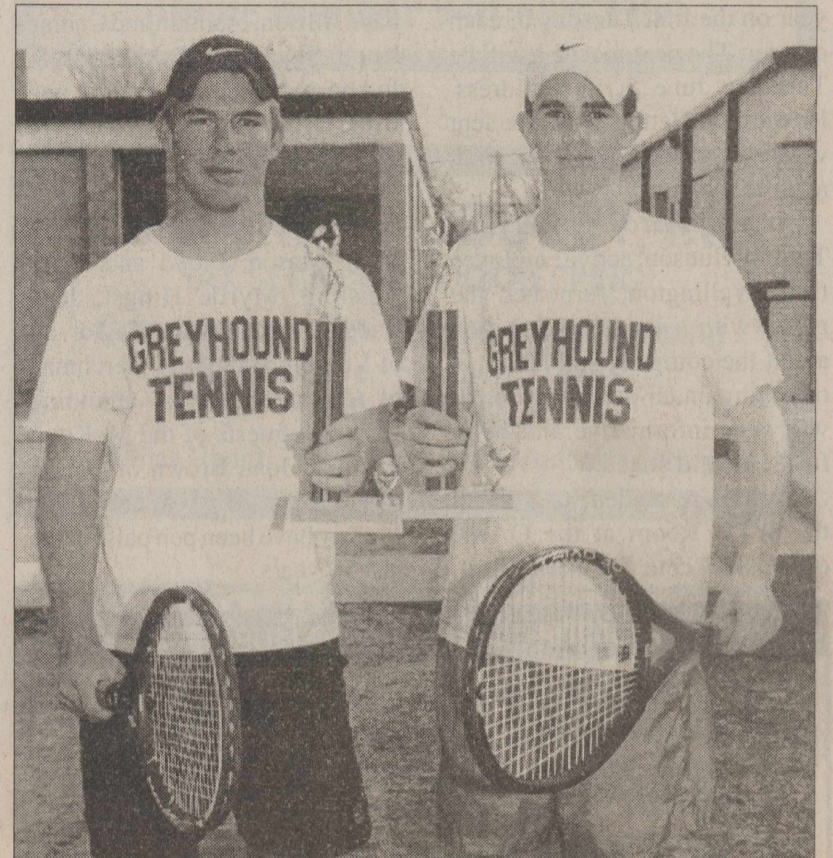

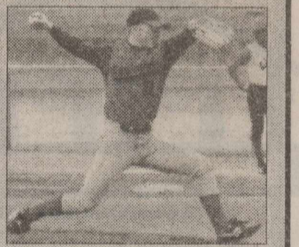
KCHS team sweeping high school tennis tournaments

Meeting for foster, adoptive parent prospects next Monday

The Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services is a child-protecting agency, assigned to provide safe and loving homes for children who, for whatever reason, must be temporarily separated from their birth families; these families are called foster families.

When children cannot be reunited with their birth parents or relatives, then a search for adoptive homes to help meet the permanency needs of these children is begun.

The agency is looking for fami-

lies for can care for older children, sibling groups and medically fragile children.

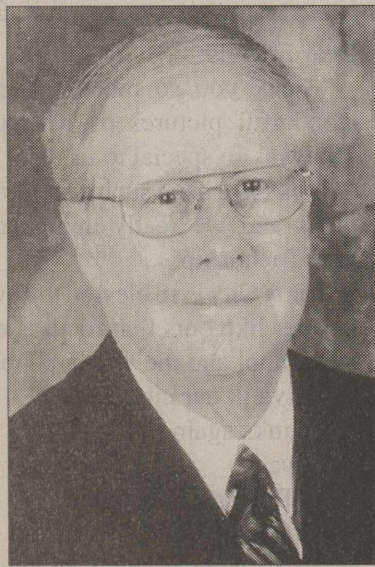

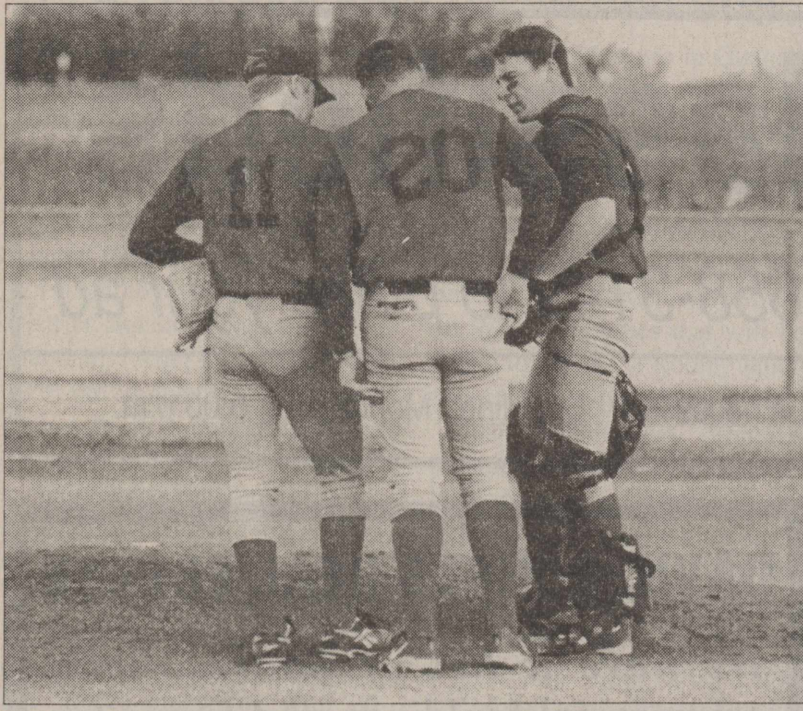
