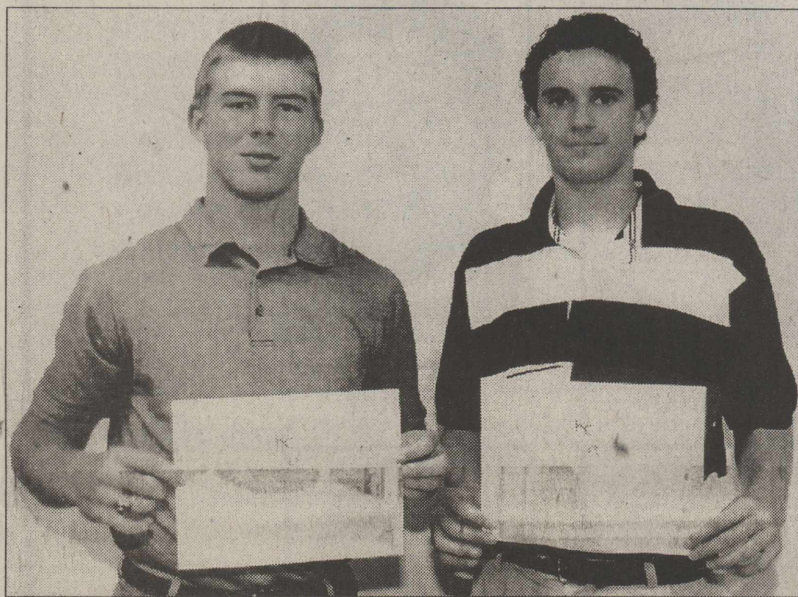

Reed Underwood is home from Texas Tech and will be with his parents, C.H. and Linda Underwood before going on to law school next year. He will be working with David Counts.

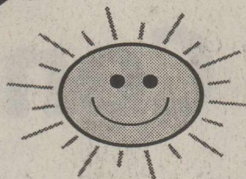
Veeta Reid came home after spending a few days in Fort Worth with her daughter Angela and

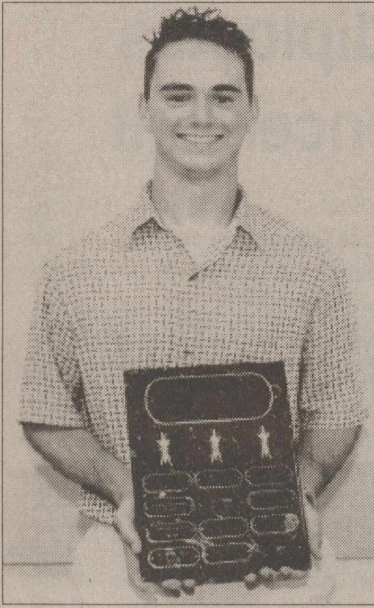

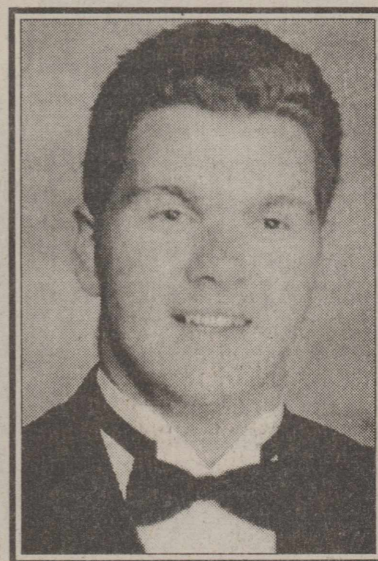
In Junior High, Leilani was involved in volleyball, track, band, pep club, and UIL academics. Leilani graduated with honors.

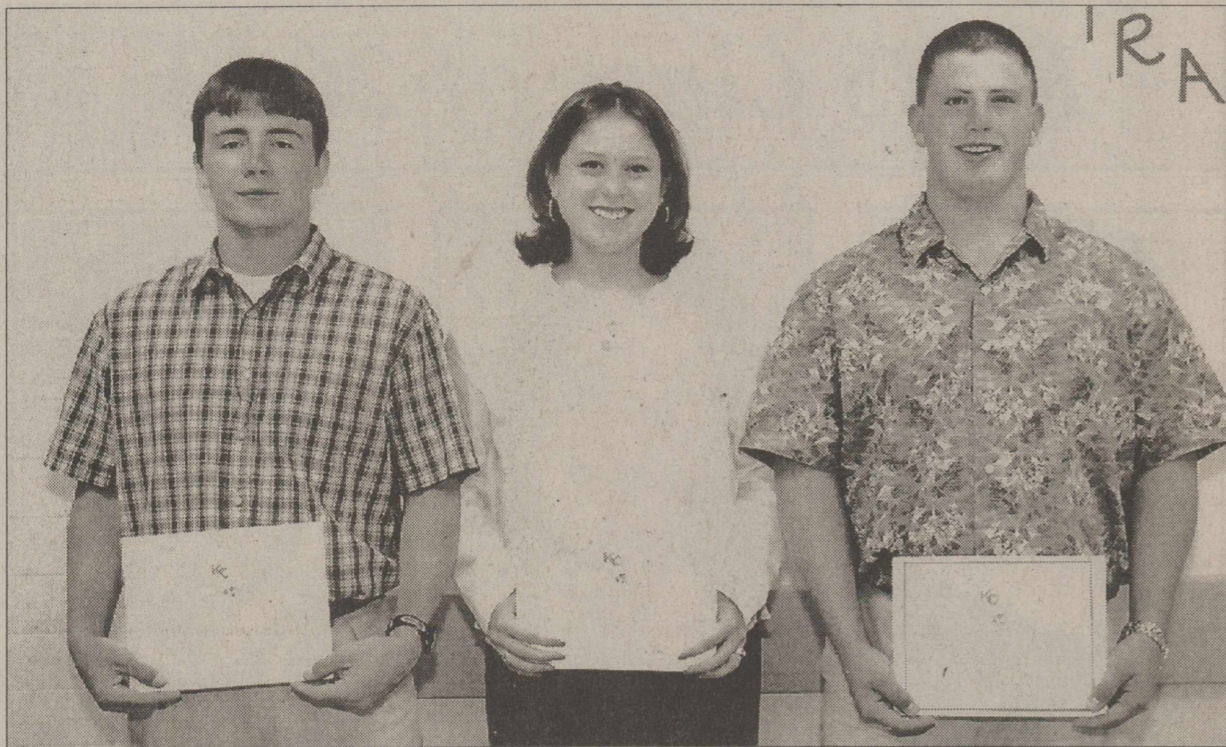

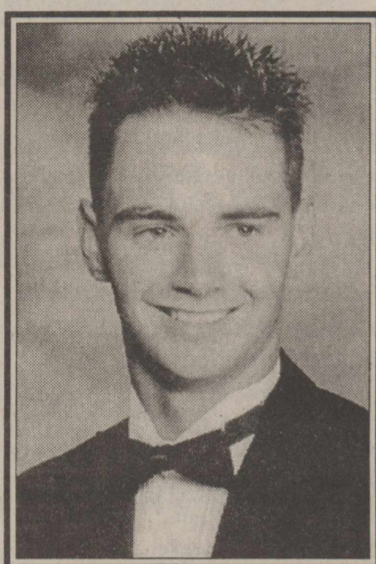

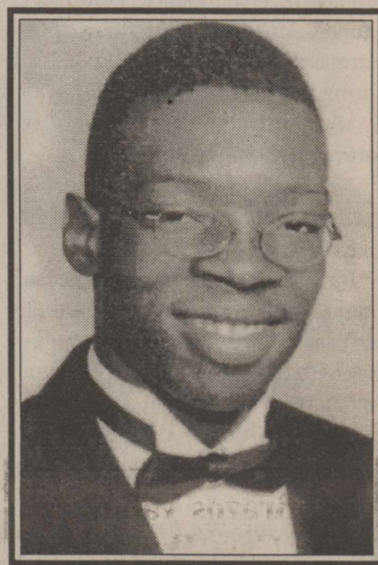
RUSSELL BISHOP

Angela would like to thank her parents and grandparents for the love, patience, and guidance they have shown her. She would also like to thank her big sister for being a well, typical big sister.



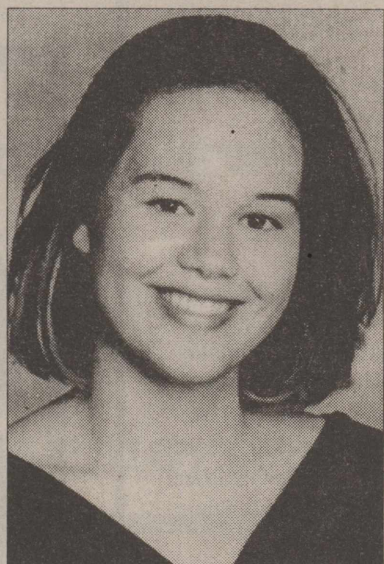

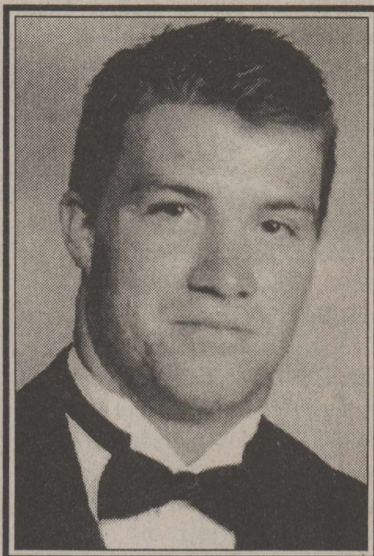
Shawn also enjoys spending time with his three nephews, helping them learn how to play baseball, how to throw and catch.

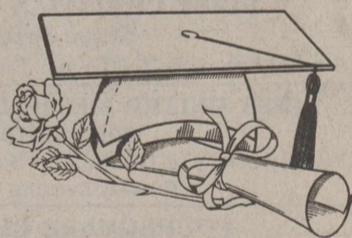
WILL GRIMSLEY



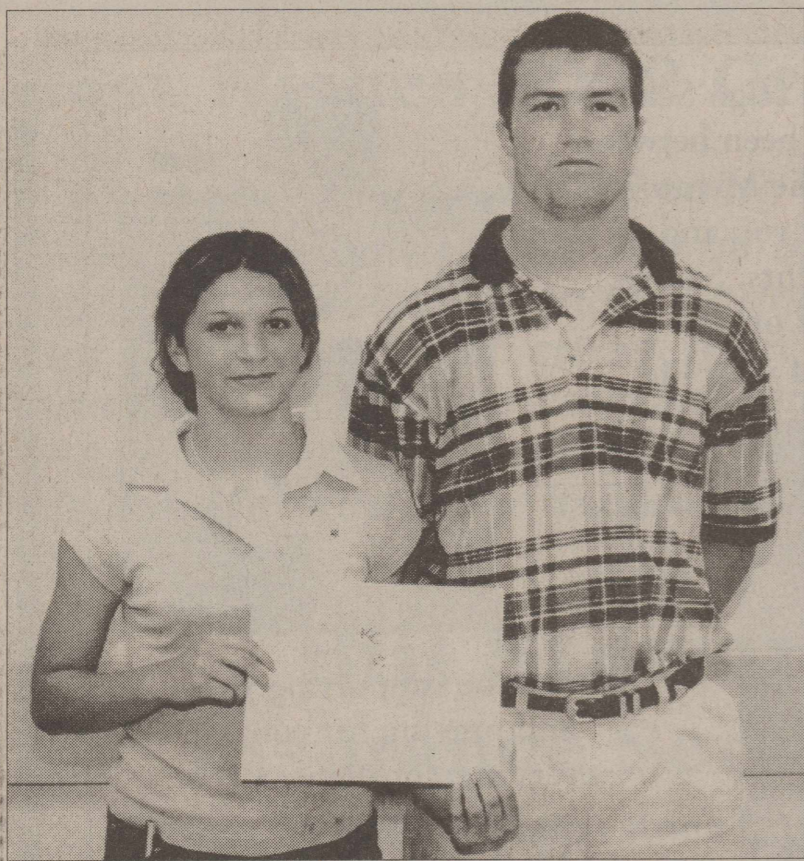

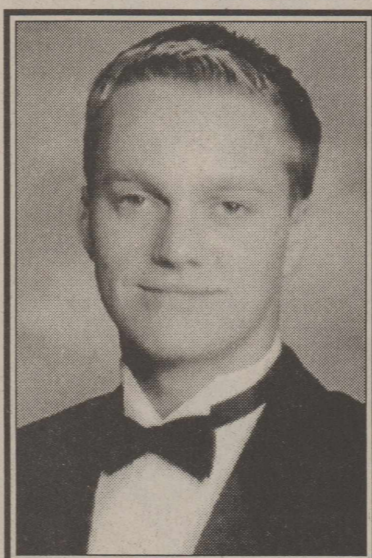

ADAM MCCOWN

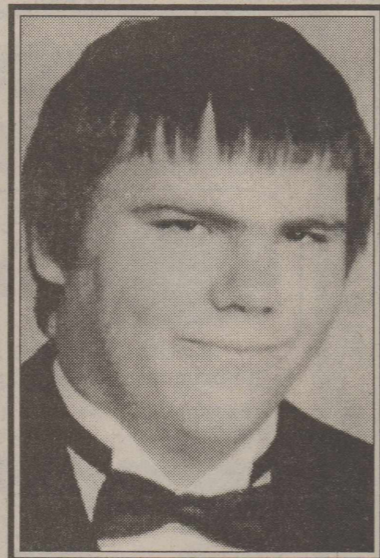

Graduating from Knox City was Amanda S. Baker, who received a bachelor of science degree in multidisciplinary studies III.



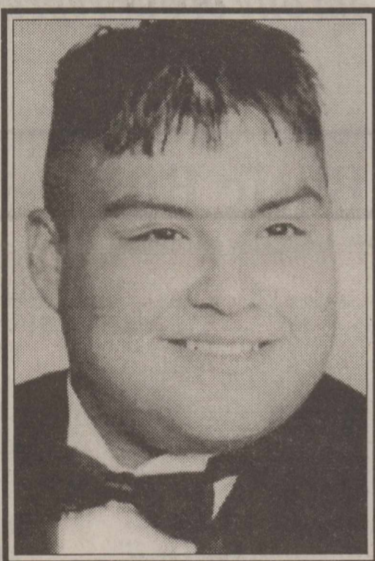
JUSTIN CASILLAS

Justin would like to thank his parents and everyone who supported him throughout his school years.



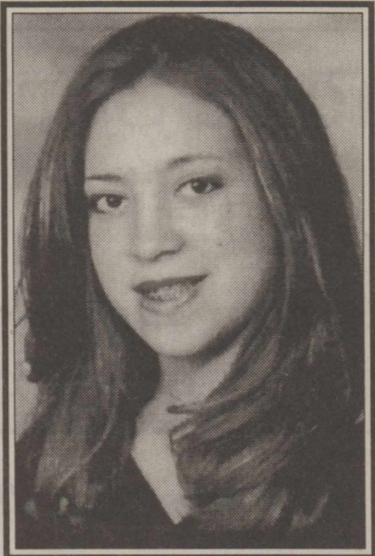
TOMMY TREVINO

Crystal is excited to continue her studies by enrolling at Angelo State University the fall. She plans to study education to become an elementary teacher.

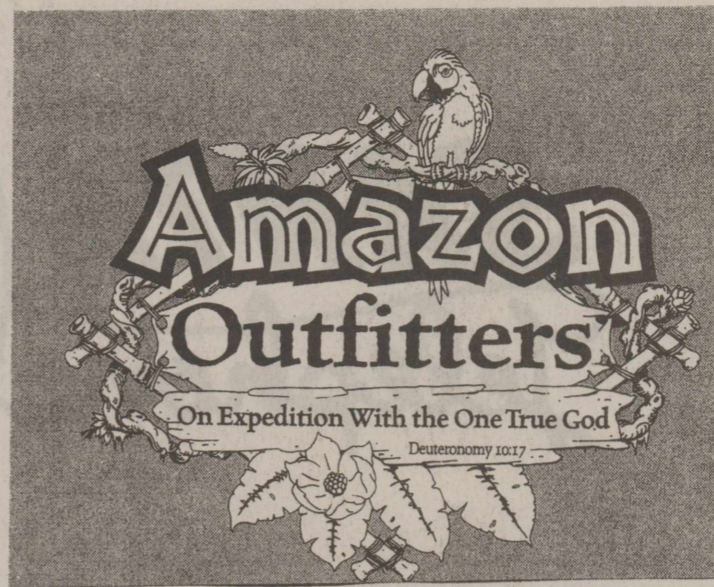

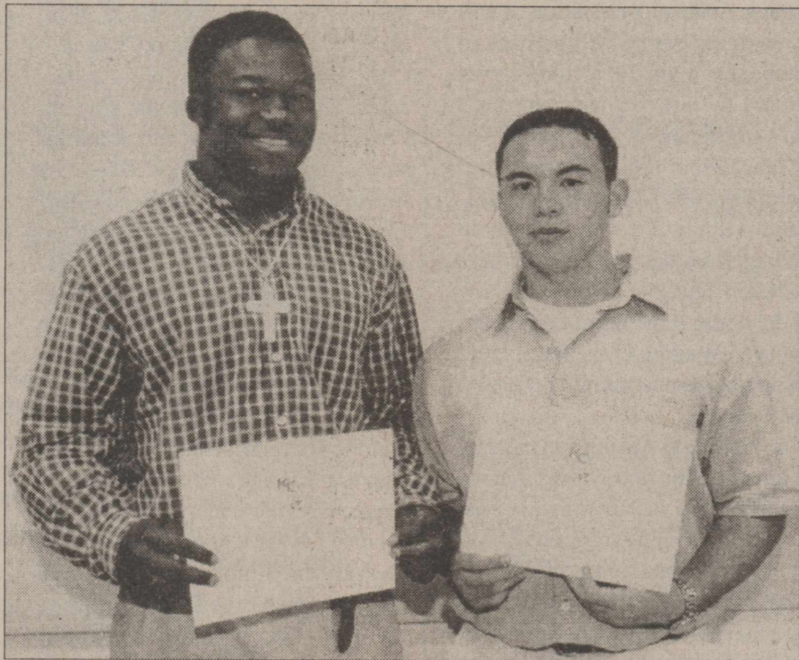
James was active in the Kaysville 3rd Ward and held several callings, his favorite being Ward Clerk, a position he held for about 30 years.



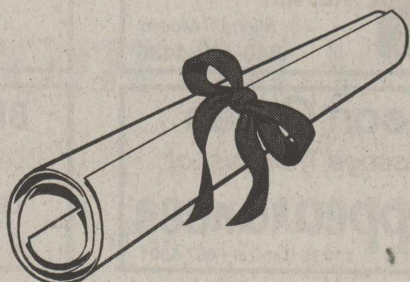
