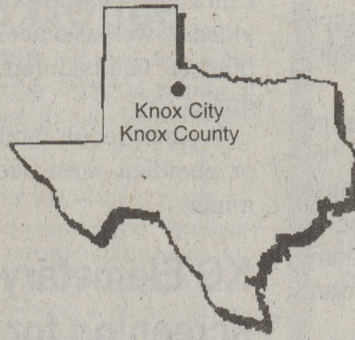

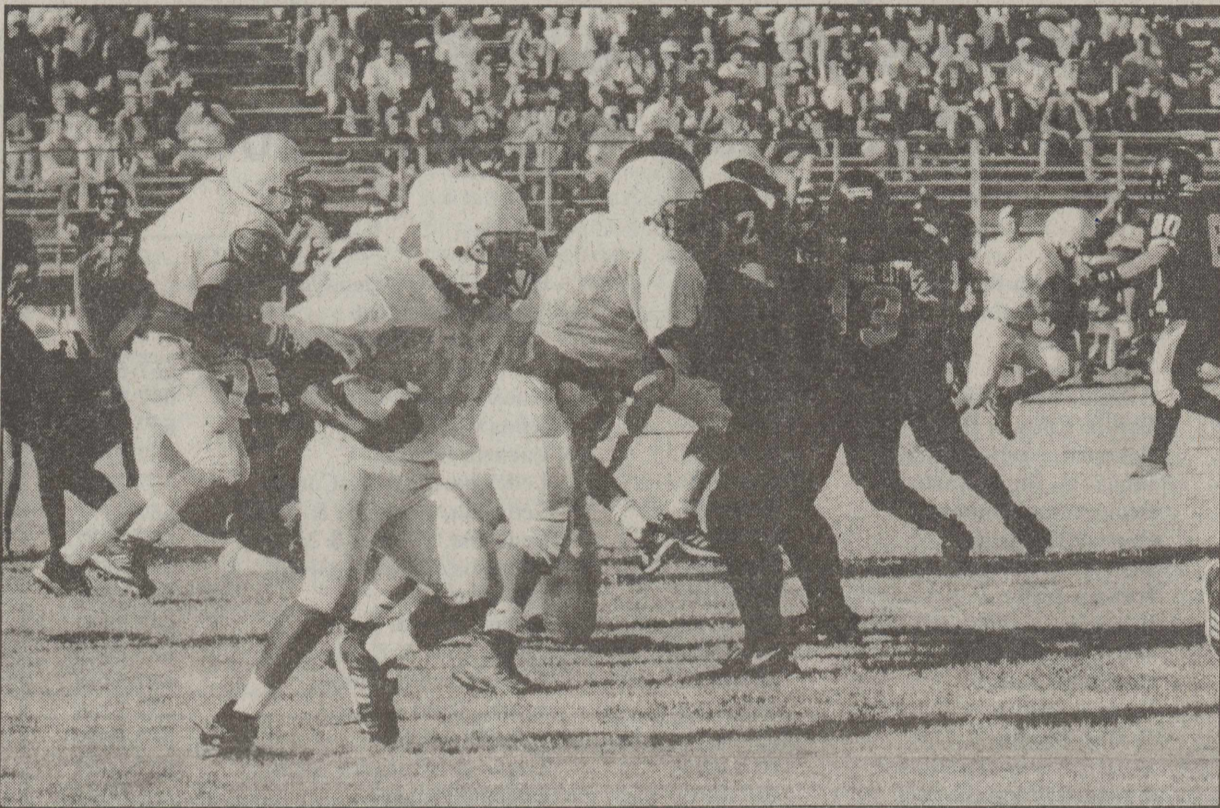

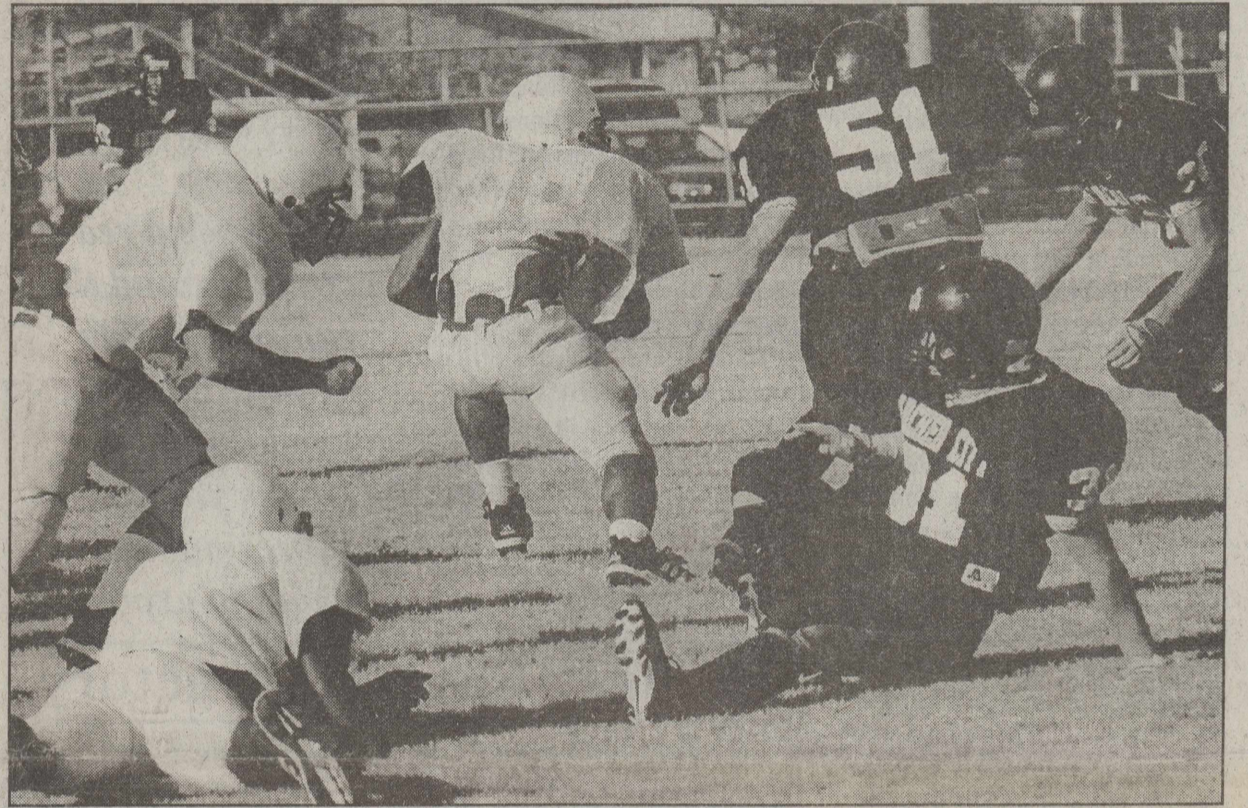

## KCHS Greyhounds dominate Archer City's Wildcats in last pre-season scrimmage

**'Hounds score 3 touchdowns to 2 in scrimmage, then totally control full quarter of play, 27-0**

The 2002 edition of the Knox City Greyhounds flexed their muscles during last Friday evening's scrimmage at Archer City, leaving the former 2A Wildcats to lick their wounds after a full quarter of play ended with the 'Hounds on top, 27-0.

The Greyhounds dominated the full quarter of scrimmage on both offense and defense. Showing speed and strength in every area of play, both the offensive and de-

fensive units for Knox City scored touchdowns. Led by senior Sedrick Roberson, the 'Hound offense proved early on that this season will provide a lot of surprises on the field. With a swift passing attack and strong, powerful runners, the '02 edition of 'Hutch's Hounds' are out to prove they can score in a variety of ways. Not to be outdone, the defense, led by senior Scooter Thompson, proved they are a powerful force

to be reckoned with. Interceptions, sacks and caused fumbles kept the Wildcats off balance throughout the scrimmage. The defensive secondary was brutal on the Archer City receivers, with Carlos Ruiz intercepting 2 passes, including one that he turned into a long run back for a touchdown. Linebacker Scooter Thompson also intercepted a Wildcat pass and returned it 40 yards to the 6 inch line, where he was knocked

out of bounds.

Freshman Quentin Spells once again showed his ability to score as the Greyhound backfield quickly formed a wall of blockers on play after play, providing Spells a path down the field and an opportunity to turn on his amazing speed. Aggressively moving the ball across the yard markers, Gemile Roberson, Dominique Collier, Sedrick Roberson and Scooter Thompson have gotten

bigger and stronger over the summer, adding to their ability to totally run over defenders while taking the ball up the field. Running back Riley Spells has not let an elbow injury from last week slow him down at all, his ability to move the ball down the field has also improved greatly this season. Receiver Kendrick Green caught 2 of 5 passes and turned both into touchdown runs.

Up front on the line, senior

Caleb Carver provides a rock solid anchor for the other linemen to rally around. Sophomores Drew Barnard and Ricky Dale Smith worked hard on Friday, showing a lot of poise as they held off 200 pound Wildcat linemen all evening. As a unit, the line has come together fast, working hard for their coaches.

A pep rally will be held in the gym on the Knox City High School campus, all Greyhound supporters are encouraged to attend. The rally starts at 3:30 p.m.



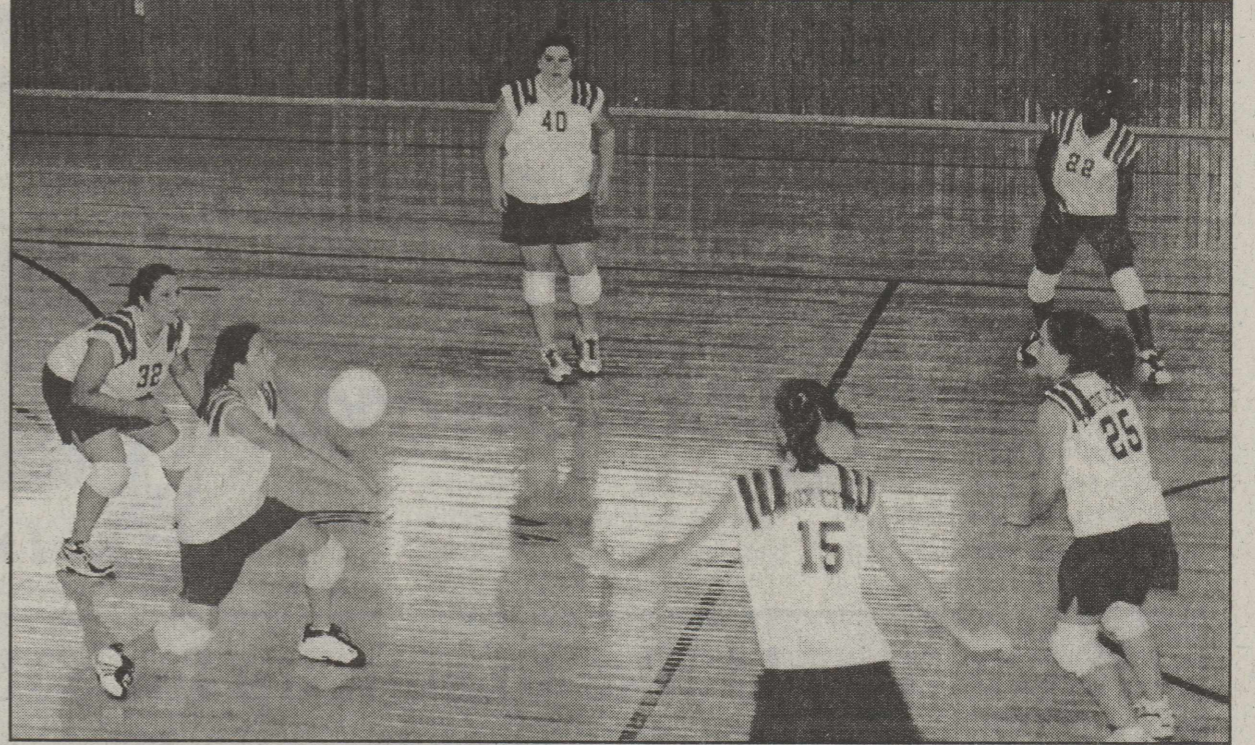

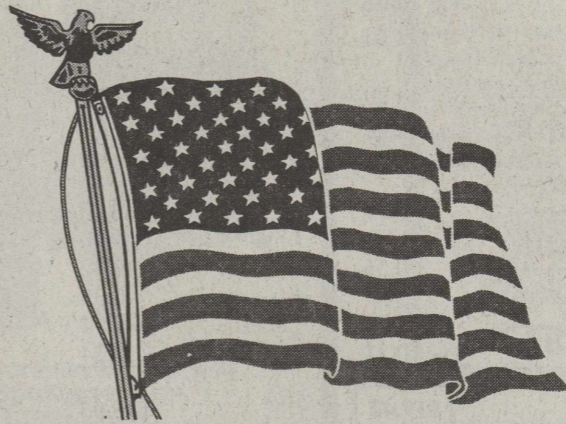
Overall, the team showed a lot of spirit and played well together. We will develop more consistency

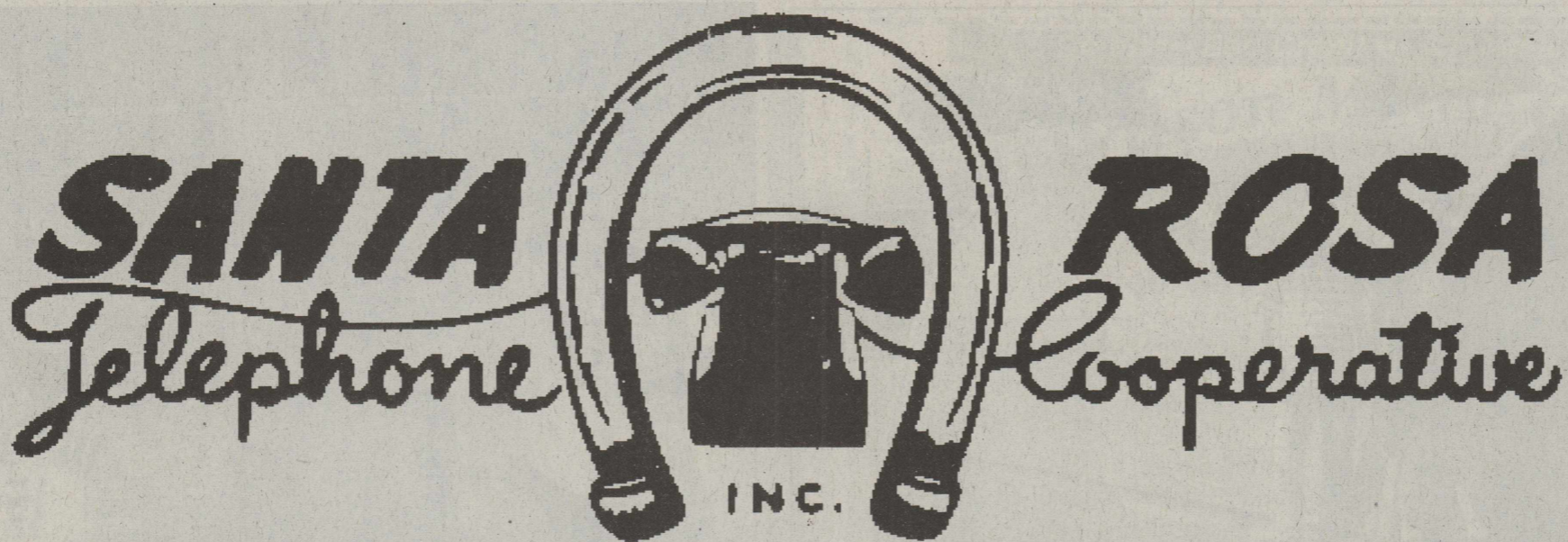

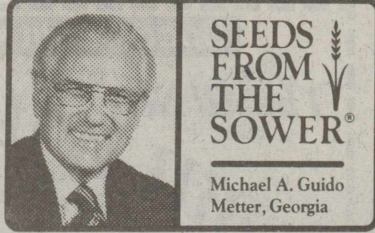

### Local student awarded health care scholarship

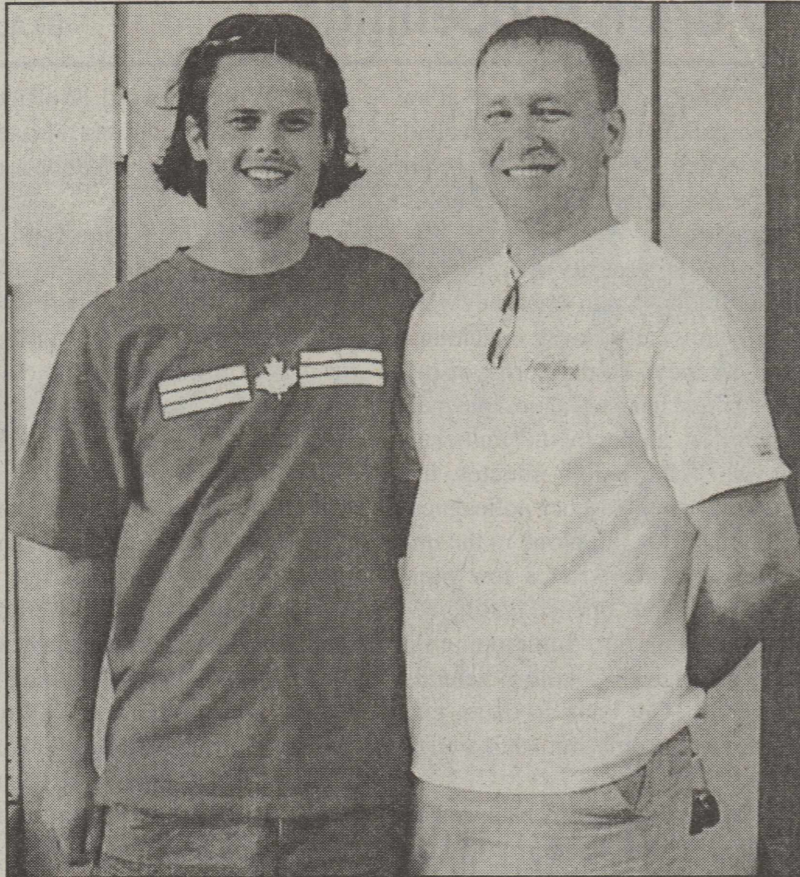
Knox County Hospital District recently provided a scholarship to Amy Sigala to be used to pursue studies toward a career in an allied health care profession.

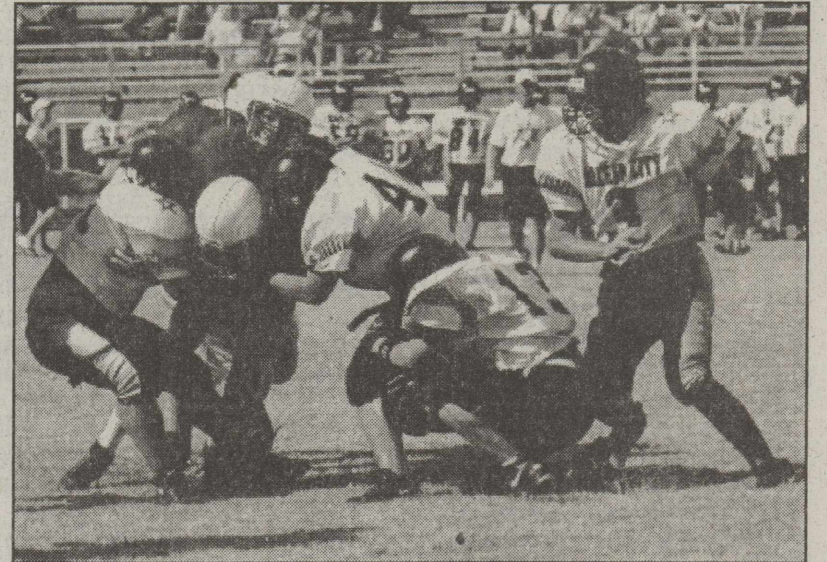

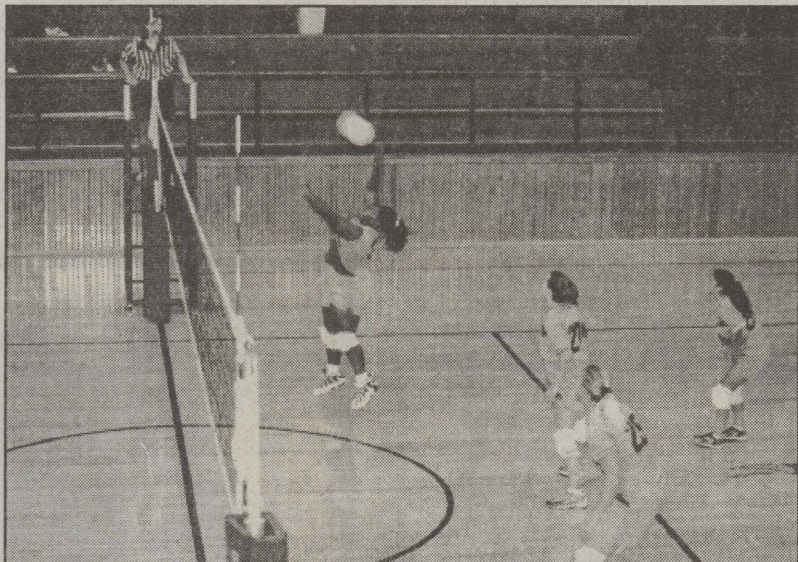
