



Claudale Barnard receives long overdue combat badge from World War II service

Claudale A. Barnard, of Knox City, is a WWII veteran who was wounded in combat. He fought for the United States in Normandy and in Northern France. He was just 18 years old when he went to Germany, a simple farm boy from O'Brien, Texas.

The day he received his wounds, his division (83rd) was replacing troops for the 101St division. Mr. Barnard was one of only two soldiers to survive this battle. He received the Purple Heart, but never received the Combat Infantry Badge. Claudale started an investigation many years ago to see why he never received the CIB. He was told that all records to verify his request were destroyed in a fire at the National Hall Of Personnel Records.

About a year ago his daughter, Claudia got in touch with Chandra Ford, who works in Congressman Stenholm's office. Ms. Ford spent countless hours and phone calls, preparing the papers to reapply for Claudale's CIB, again she was told there was

no documentation to prove that the award should be given.

Ms. Ford then made a phone call to James Benefield of Ripley Mississippi, one of the two soldiers to survive this battle, she asked Mr. Benefield to send a letter of documentation. Ms. Ford then sent the information to the proper departments.

During the Christmas season of 2002, family members presented Mr. Barnard with a letter from Congressman Stenholm congratulating him on receiving the Combat Infantry Badge, teary eyed family watched a very proud American veteran soldier finally receive the CIB from his country he proudly served.

On March 28, 2003, Congressman Charles Stenholm formerly presented the Combat Infantry Badge to Mr. Barnard. Numerous family members were present for this emotional and long awaited event.

Kevin Finley D.O. signs three year contract

The Knox County Hospital District has received several grants recently, including a \$500 Health Information Portability Accountability Act (HIPAA) Compliance grant from Four Winds RC&D, Inc. This will be used for the additional electronic equipment required by HIPAA to ensure patient privacy standards and to comply with recent mandates.

Another grant received by the District was a Small Hospital Improvement Program Grand from the Office of Rural Community Affairs in the amount of \$9,763.39. This money will be used to purchase REGIMEN for Rural and Community Hospitals. This grant is geared to hospitals

with fewer than 150 beds. It provides operations manual templates and includes standard policies, procedures and forms necessary for compliance with HIPAA.

Additionally, the District acquired funds from the Regional Advisory Council. EMS will be reimbursed \$2,872 of money spent upgrading pager systems. This includes seven handheld radios with pager capabilities. These radios will ensure prompt response from emergency responders. Funds were also used to purchase a Kendrick Extraction Device and Spider Straps, used for immobilizing trauma patients. The Hospital District Trauma center received \$1,235.63. It was used to

purchase additional airway management tools and specialty carts for trauma patients.

Hospital administrator Stephen Kuehler recently accepted the resignation of Imran Rao M.D., effective March 31, 2003. Dr. Rao has been on the staff at Knox County Hospital District since 1997, where he served part of his term as Chief of Staff. He is leaving Knox City to accept a teaching position at the University of Oklahoma.

Kevin Finley D.O. has signed a three-year contract with the District. Dr. Finley joined the staff in 2000 as a family practice physician specializing in osteopathic medicine.



KC graduate is first recipient of award at Syracuse University

The Progressive Librarians Guild has announced that the first recipient of the Miriam Braverman Prize is Shelly Balis Sipley, a student at Syracuse University, for her essay "Operation - Patriots Act: The Role of School Libraries in Promoting a Free and Informed Society."

Ms. Sipley was raised in the small West Texas town of Knox City and attended Angelo State University in San Angelo, Texas, where she received her BBA in accounting.

She is currently the Associate Director of Financial Aid at Syracuse University and is pursuing a Master's Degree in Information Science, specializing in the Library Science / School Media Specialist program.

Shelly, the daughter of Evelyn Balis, is a graduate of Knox City High School.

Her essay will be published in the Spring 2003 issue of Progressive Librarian.

The prize will be awarded at a ceremony at Syracuse University and a special celebration will also be held during the American Library Association 2003 Annual Conference in Toronto.

The Miriam Braverman Prize is awarded annually to a student enrolled in a library and information science graduate program for an essay that covers an aspect of the social responsibilities of librarianship.






