## Indians fall to Hamlin Pied Pipers, 24-20

Haskell came up short against the defending district champion Hamlin Pied Pipers. The Indians have struggled to put together two halves of football, consistently struggling to get into any kind of a rhythm in the first half of any district game. The final score Friday night was 24 to 20, but Hamlin held a 17 to 0 advantage at halftime, completely controlling the first two quarters of play.

That famous word "momentum" when it comes to sports can be a killer for you or your best friend, depending on which side of it you're on. After the

Indians struggle on both sides of the ball in the first half, something happened in the third quarter. The Tribe picked up their play on both sides of the ball scoring 14 points in the third quarter and allowing only seven points in the second half, but that was not enough to get out of the hole dug in the first half.

"I will give credit where credit is due, and that is to the Pied Pipers for their play throughout district, now 3-0, after struggling in pre-district play. They were also starting a freshman at quarterback after they have lost two others to injury. Freshman Nathaniel

Villanueva, who played an overall good game throwing for one touchdown, took a big hit from Indian Lane Burson, while connecting on another big pass leading to a touchdown. The Indians were flagged for a late hit on Villanueva after he threw that ball. Coach Russell Lucas of Hamlin said, he was tickled pink by his performance. All week long we told him to just manage the game and not put us in a bad spot.

As Indian fans, I think we are all disappointed with the way the game ended, but I think we have to notice the fight the Tribe put up in the second half to almost come away with a victory. I think

we saw a show of great heart from many, especially senior quarterback Dylan Hanson. You could tell he was hurting, really favoring what seemed to be his right knee, and also seeming to be bothered by his throwing hand, which could have been a part of the reason for his struggles in the first half. In the third quarter, when the Indians needed to strike, you would see Hanson make play after play, either scrambling for big gains, throwing passes on point, or just moving around inside the pocket and out, to buy time to throw the ball down field.

"I personally don't know him that well, but watching

him play you can see his competitiveness, and that makes you respect him. Yes, he struggled early and had three interceptions, including the one that basically sealed the game with 36 seconds left, but as a former high school coach, I always said you can't blame one play or one call for winning or losing a game."

Speaking with Haskell coach Grady Benton about the loss overall he had this to say, "We found it tough to find rhythm early offensively and get off the field defensively. I give a lot of that credit to Hamlin. Our kids continued to grind, which allowed them to have a shot at the end to win the game. In the second half, we got going offensively and got off the field quickly defensively, which created momentum. Unfortunately we weren't able to take advantage of the late opportunity inside the red zone to win. I'm proud of how my kids continue to fight through adversity and give themselves a chance to win."

Now the Indians turn their attention to Petrolia, who is 0-3 in district. Haskell really needs to win out to give themselves a real shot at a playoff berth. Hamlin, now in first with a record of 3-0, Seymour moves into second after upsetting Electra on Friday. Both squads hold a record of 2-1, giving Seymour the tie breaker. Haskell and Munday are both 1-2, tied for fourth, and will end the season with a head to head match-up that could have a play-off spot on the line.

## Special election set Tues., Nov. 3

A special election has been scheduled for Tuesday, November 3.

According to County Clerk Belia Abila, all that will appear on our local ballot are the seven proposed constitutional amendments, which came out of the 84th legislative session.

Early voting ends Friday, October 30 at the Haskell County courthouse. Hours are Monday-Thursday, 8:30 to 5:00, and Friday, 8:30 to 4:30. They are closed for lunch from 12-1 p.m. The last day to apply for a ballot by mail was Friday, October 23.

For an explanation of each of the proposed amendments, as well as how they will appear on the ballot, go online to <http://votetexas.gov/november-3-2015-constitutional-amendment-election-explanatory-statements>.

On election day, you may cast your vote from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m. at the following locations: Pct. 1 (Hester) will

vote at Box 1, St. George's Catholic Church, 901 N. 16th in Haskell; Pct. 2 (Mayfield) votes at Box 2, Assembly of God Church, 1500 N. Ave. F in Haskell; Pct. 3 (Thompson) votes at Box 3, Extension Office, 101 S. Ave. D in Haskell; and Pct. 4 (Kreger) will vote at Box 4, Experienced Citizens Center, S. 1st Street in Haskell.

To cast a ballot in person, registered voters need to present one of the following approved forms of photo ID: Texas Driver License, Texas Personal Identification card, Texas Concealed Handgun License, United States Military Identification card containing the person's photograph, United States Passport or Election Identification Certificate. Following the parade, contest winners will be

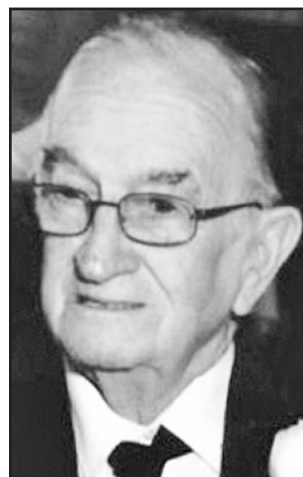

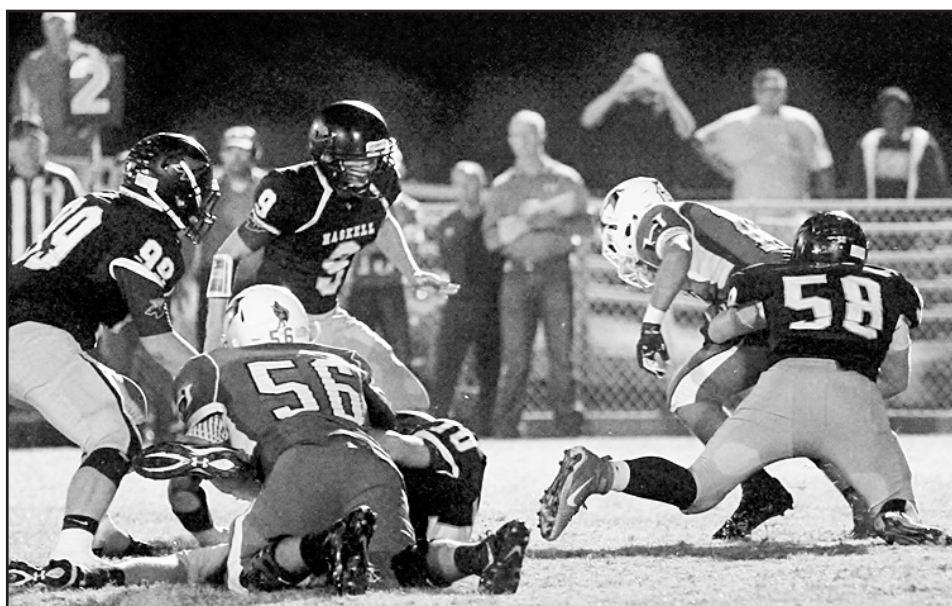

## Safety Rules for Ghosts and Goblins

Unfortunately, many accidents occur on this holiday that could be avoided. Here are some helpful hints for a safe Halloween:

- Keep children away from lit jack-o'-lanterns.

- Fruit should be washed and cut into small pieces before eating.
