Elephant Stew: If you're planning on feeding a large group this summer try this recipe for elephant stew.

One medium sized elephant. One ton of salt. One ton of pepper. 200 bushels of carrots. 4,000 sprigs of parsley 500 bushels of potatoes. Two small rabbits [optional].

Brown gravy. Cut elephant meat into bit sized pieces. This will take about two months. Cut vegetables into cubes [another two months]. Place meat in pan and cover with 1,000 gallons of brown gravy. Simmer for four weeks. Shovel in pepper and salt. When meat is tender, add vegetables. A steam shovel is useful for this. Simmer slowly for four more weeks.

This will serve 3800 people. If more are expected, add the two rabbits. This is not recommended, as very few people like hare in their stew.

Billy E. Pena Killed By **Hamlin Man**

Fisher County law enforcement officers investigated a shooting incident that left an Abilene resident dead in the early morning hours of Saturday, May 10th in the far east portion of Fisher County, according to Sheriff Mickey Counts.

Billy Emilo Pena, age 26, of Abilene, formerly of Stonewall County was dead at the scene after a shooting took place at approximately 1:45 am on May 10th. Law Enforcement officers arrested Christopher Blaine Allan, age 21 of Hamlin and charged him with the murder of Pena. The subject is currently in the Fisher County jail in liew of \$30,000 bond.

According to Counts, there were approximately 7 people on a county road northwest of Hamlin that were apparently drinking and smoking when the group began "slap box-The shooting stemmed from an argument evolving from the
