



Gin Managers Predict 31,000 Bales For 1980, Underground Moisture Great For Future Crop

Cotton farmers should begin making steady trips to one of the seven Fisher County gins toward the end of this week, providing the weather remains good and we don't get any additional moisture. But, if predictions by area gin managers hold true, this vear's crop will be about one-third what it was in

The official bale count, according to records at the A.S.C.S. office in Roby, for 1979 amounted to 94,217. If predictions by gin managers hold true Fisher County gins should bale in the neighborhood of 31,000 bales.

Howard Faught of the A.S.C.S. office in Roby thinks the 1980 crop will fall below the predictions of gin managers. "I'm guessing we'll gin between 22,000 and 25,000 bales this season", said Faught. He indicated that a lot of acres have already been plowed up, that a lot of farmers were thinking of plowing and indicated that in his opinion the majority of cotton in Fisher County would yield from 1/2 bale down to nothing per acre. "The best cotton seems to be north and east of Rotan and around the Dowell community", according to Faught.

dismal predictions for 1980 is the bright hope that 1981 will be a very good crop. "This is the best underground (moisture) season for this time of year I have ever seen in the 30 years I have been in Fisher County', said Faught. He indicated that the 14 inches of rain in September and the moisture from the two recent snow storms have put Fisher County farmers in good shape for moisture in

The seven Fisher County gins have a combined total of 578 bales already ginned through last Monday afternoon. the Sylvester Coop Gin reported 225 bales: Rotan gin 164; Farmers Gin in Rotan 66; Farmers Union Gin at Roby 62: Longworth Gin 36; Hobbs Gin 16; and Terry Gin 9 bales.

Many of the Fisher County gins have made improvements since the last ginning season. The biggest change can be seen at the Rotan Gin with the addition of a module feeder. Dick Edwards, local manager, indicated that the gin has already ginned 7 modules and said, "it looks like the new feeder is going to work real well"

Edwards estimated that One consolation to the he would gin about 1/3 of

what was ginned in 1979. The total count for 1979 at the Rotan Gin was 28,000 bales. "If the weather holds good, we should begin getting in a lot of cotton over the weekend", said Edwards. The Sylvester Gin did

considerable remodeling and overhauling after last season. "We have installed a new press, lint slide and steady-flo", according to Joe Gilley, Sylvester Gin bookkeeper. He anticipated that they would get in 20 or 30 bales each day until the cotton really began "coming in good" around the end of the week or the first of next week.

Kirmit Terry, manager of Terry Gin, Inc., said he hoped his customers would reach 2,000 bales this year. Terry Gin had a season total in 1979 of 8,350 bales. Terry Gin has installed a new loading dock that will enable the bales to be loaded right off the dock onto trucks for hauling to the compress. They also put in a new saw and new cycloner in the

Wayman Leverton, gin-

ner at the Farmers Gin in Rotan, said he had installed a new high capacity stand that separates the lint from the seed. "We took out two small stands and added the one large stand that will allow us to up our capacity", said Leverton. Bonnie Duke, manager of the gin, indicated that the gin has also installed a new burr house.

The Farmers Union Coop Gin at Roby has installed new lint cleaning equipment, new burr equipment and new burr box for the up-coming season. Foy Mitchell, local manager, said that he expected a short 1980 crop. "We hope we'll gin 4.000 bales this year", said Mitchell.

Although the Hobbs Gin hasn't added any new equipment, "We're running fine and expect to be in full swing in 4 or 5 days," according to Danny Helms, Gin bookkeeper. Fred Soliz is the ginner at Hobbs.
