Commissioners Hear Plan For Group Major Medical Insurance

Fisher County Commissioners listened to a proposal by Joe Dale Burk, Rotan Insurance Agency, on a group comprehensive major medical insurance plan for county employees last Monday morning, but failed to take any action on implementing the plan.

Burk's plan is to be studied by commissioners with more discussion to take place in May at the meeting of the court.

The commissioners listened to a presentation by Annie Mae Weems, Fisher County Senior Citizen's Coordinator, concerning the number of people served, meals prepared and cost factors of the center's first month of operation. According to Mrs. Weems, the Senior Citizen's facility has had an average daily attendance of 77, served a total of 920 meals to 249 different senior citizens and is currently serving 7 take-out meals to homebound people.

Mrs. Weems and the commissioners seemed satisfied with the figures that were available, but both showed some concern over the cost factors for the first month's operation. Meal donations have amounted to \$756.57. which represents the money facility users voluntarily pay for the food served. This averaged out to \$.80

per day per person. An unusually high food

Two types of homestead exemptions from school taxes are available to taxpayers who owned their residence homesteads in this school district on January 1 of this year. First, the general homestead exemption is available to all homeowners and exempts \$5,000 from the market value of the homestead.

Second, any person who is 65 years of age or older or who is disabled can be exempted an additional \$10,000 from the market value of the homestead. Proof of age or disability may be necessary.

Application forms were mailed earlier to all homeowners who qualified for a homestead exemption in 1980. If you did not receive an application, or if you have questions about qualifying for exemptions or filing application forms, contact the school tax office at 915-

Application forms may also be picked up at the tax office at Hobbs School.






