As far as I am concerned, the state income tax is not the place to raise the money to operate our schools. I'd rather not have to increase the sales tax, and I'd really rather not have to increase the property tax.

Why can't we just leave things as they are?

Caprock Jamboree goes onstage once again at 7:00 p.m. Saturday, August 2, at the Showbarn in Silverton.





Plants Can Be More Resistant to Herbicides

Pammy L. Millican Briscoe County Extension Agent-Ag

Research reveals plants can be made resistant to herbicides.

Many herbicides kill plants around the targeted weeds. But researchers have come up with ways of breeding plants that are herbicide-resistant.

Extension weed specialist Dr. Paul Baumann says geneticallyengineered corn, cotton and soybeans are already giving farmers an advantage.

There is now a variety of corn that is resistant to Round-Up, which targets broad leaf grasses

and weeds.

Baumann says chemical companies would rather breed herbicide-resistant plants than create new chemicals. He notes that the development of a new chemical costs from 40-to-80 million dollars and can take up to ten

Genetically altering plants is much cheaper and quicker.



Since 46 percent of all car crashes are frontal crashes, riding in the back seat is the safest place to be. The National ABC Campaign emphasizes air bag safety, buckle everyone, and children in the back. By following these three simple guides, you can better protect your children in the event of a vehicle crash. Even though air bags continue to save lives and prevent many injuries in motor vehicle crashes, they can seriously injure or kill children who are not properly restrained.

Therefore the National Highway Traffic Safety Administra-tion recommends that all children ages 12 and under ride properly restrained in the back seat. Whether a vehicle has a passenger-side air bag or not, the back seat is the safest place for

To assure a safer ride for all passengers, buckle everyone every time. Texas law requires children ages two and under be properly restrained in a safety seat that meets federal safety standards. From ages two to four, children are required by law to be in either a child safety seat or in a seat belt. Secure infants and toddlers in a child safety seat that is appropriate for their age and size. Insist that everyone wear a safety belt every time.


