


## Davidson donation gets project off the ground


### **Bettie McQueen honored**

Please place information for additional markers or bricks on a separate sheet of paper. Brick orders received together will be laid together.



# How To Keep A Living Legacy For The Deceased

You can honor the memory of loved one who has passed on, and help needy, deserving WTC students, at the same time. Carefully consider the two options listed below.

## **Endowed Scholarship**

Currently, WTC has over 1.1 million dollars invested in endowed scholarships, from which the interest is utilized to assist students in paying for their education here at WTC. Because of our significant increase in student numbers this year and based on projected growth to 2000 within the next five years, our next goal is to raise that amount to 2 million dollars. Our philosophy is that no student that applies for a scholarship, and meets the necessary criteria, will be refused.

A significant portion of these funds were given and named in the memory of a family member or friend. Named scholarships are estalished with a gift of \$5000 with the donor establishing criteria and naming the scholarship. A gift of \$5,000 begins the process and can be given in one of two ways: (1) In one lump sum; or (2) In increments over a period of time until the amount is built up to \$5,000 or more.

Contributions to a scholarship fund can be of any amount. Donations in honor or memory of an individual are acknowledged with a receipt to the donor and an acknowledgement to the recipient requested by the donor.

Memorial Brick or Granite Marker in WTC's Walk of Honor

For only \$100 a brick, or \$300 for a larger granite marker, you can permanently place the name of that special person for viewing, while at the same time contributing to WTC into a flexible fund that will be utilized to build endowment, fund special projects and programs, or towards scholarships, all as needed.




