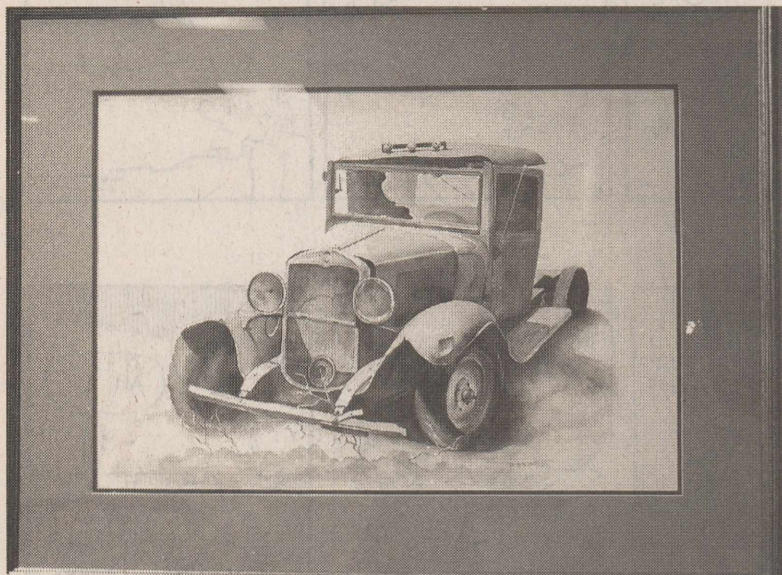

Scurry County Museum displays works of Barbara Ainsworth



Thirty paintings by Barbara Stewart Ainsworth are currently on display at the Scurry County Museum located on the WTC campus. The exhibit will be featured through October 24.

Mrs. Ainsworth grew up in Scurry County. Upon marrying, she moved with her military husband to various places, including Germany. While in Germany, Mrs. Ainsworth began studying art at a private school operated by Andre Schinkovich and later took lessons from Earnest Krupp and A.C. Mang.

After returning to the United States and settling in Oklahoma, Mrs. Ainsworth took lessons from R. V. Goetz, Robert Gartland, and Ken Kois.

Mrs. Ainsworth has won numerous trophies and ribbons,

had private showings, and served as a judge for shows. Her paintings hang in businesses and private homes throughout the nation, especially in Oklahoma and Texas.

The museum's Christmas exhibit for this year will be titled 'Grand Ole Opry Christmas 2003.' The exhibit will feature thirty photographs taken by Gordon Gillingham during the 1950s.

The museum is asking anyone who has radios, record players, and records from the 1950s to please consider lending them for the exhibit. Also, vintage musical instruments, especially a dobro, fiddle, guitar, mandolin, and banjo are needed to complement the traveling exhibit.

Anyone who has attended a Grand Ole Opry performance and collected memorabilia is also asked to consider allowing

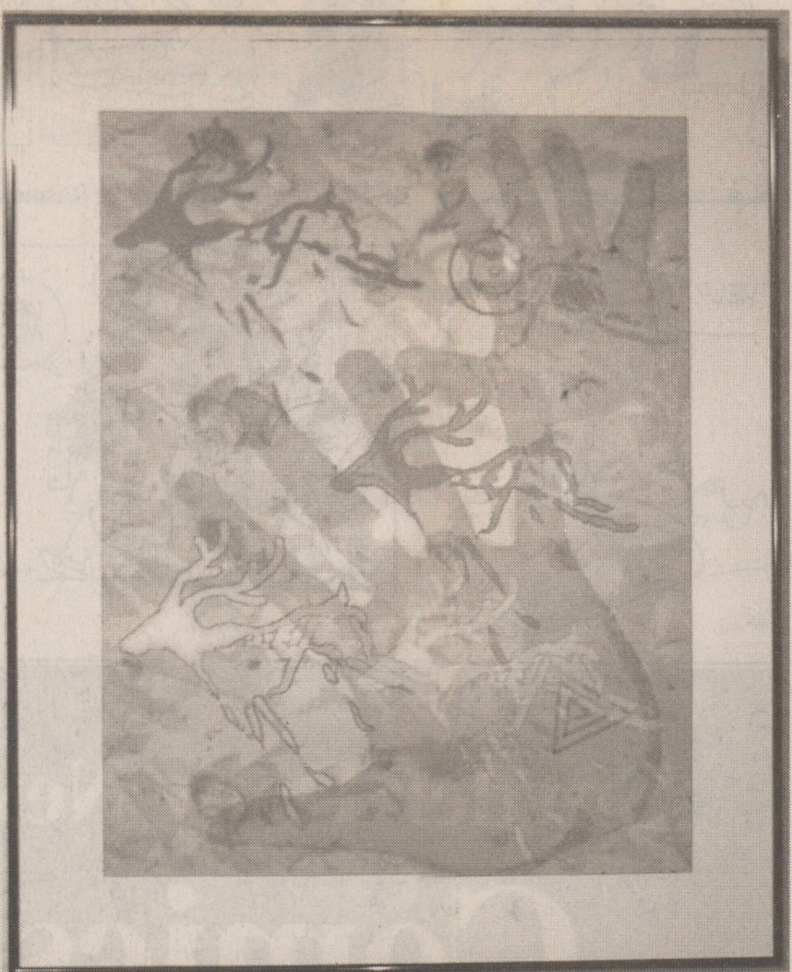
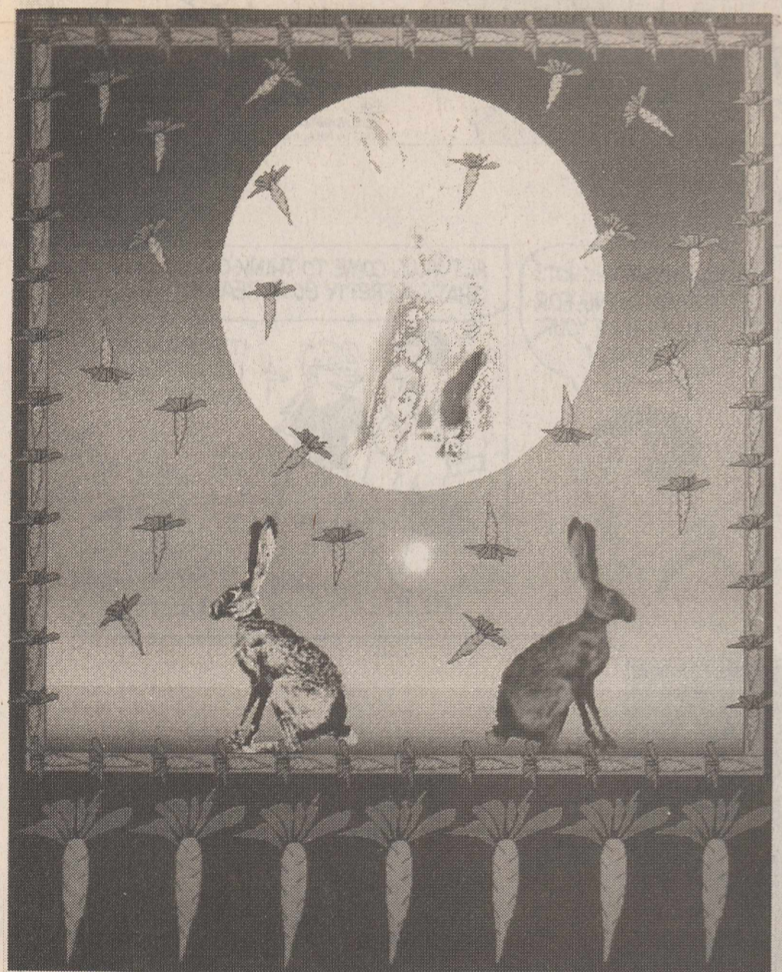
the museum to display them in a secure locked case during this special exhibit.

Selection of computer prints on display by UTPB Fine Arts Instructor

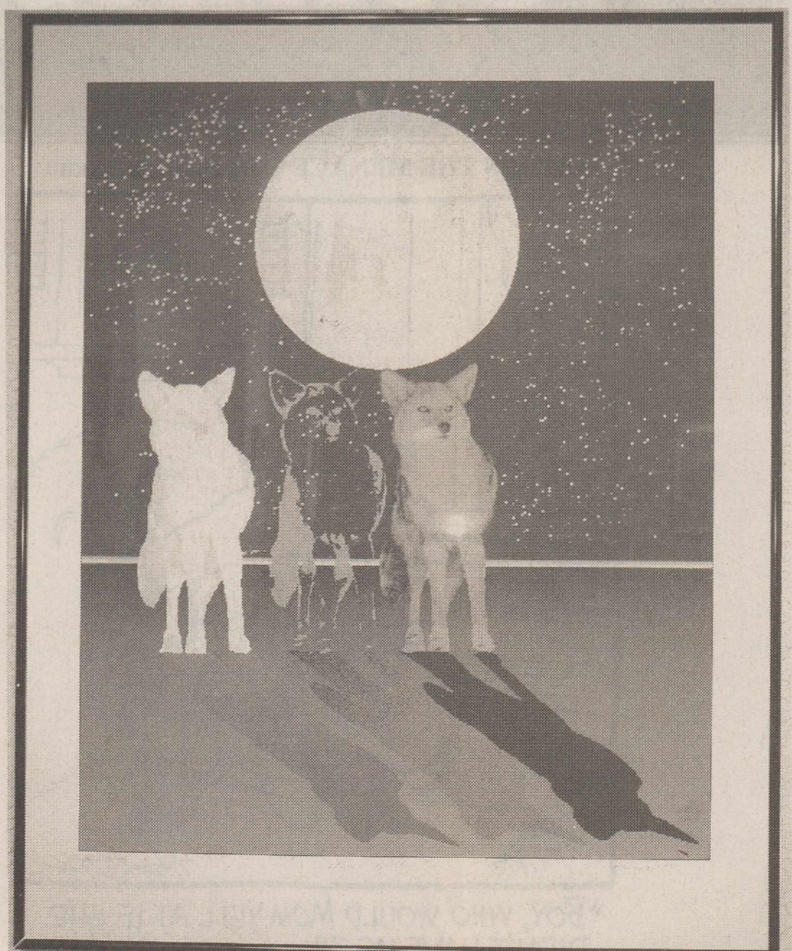
