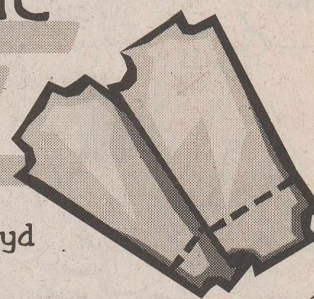




Lions Club Raffle

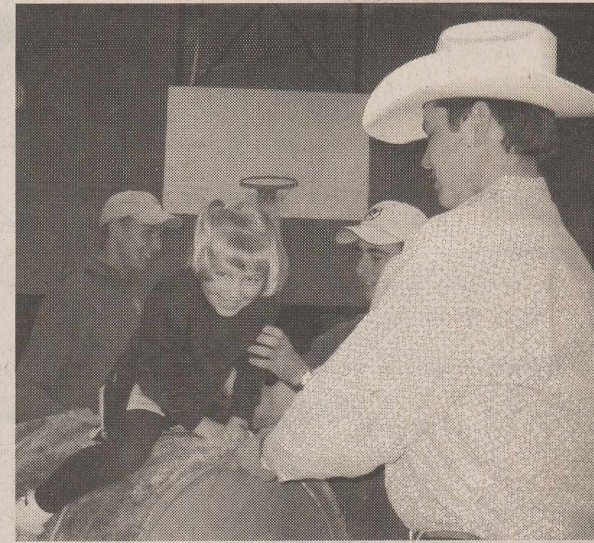

Over 100 Western Texas College employees will help in some way to make the Fall Festival happen. SCADA has helped by distributing fliers to all the local schools to promote the Fall Festival and by collecting candy from local businesses. WTC Student Government Association will run the concession stand and Phi Theta Kappa will conduct a cake walk. Snyder High School Student Council will also have a booth in the Fall Festival for their community service hours. TDCJ will help by setting up and cleaning up.

Last year \$1,500 of the moneys donated to United Way by Western Texas College came from the Fall Festival. This year WTC's United Way goal is \$6,000. This will come from the sale of United Way buttons, employee contributions and the Fall Festival. WTC employees have divided into seven teams that are competing to get the most points with their contributions.

Ceramics by Steve Heywood

Western Texas College's Art Department is hosting a ceramics exhibit by Stephen Heywood. Mr. Heywood is an assistant professor of Art at Jacksonville Community College in Jacksonville, Florida. His exhibit consists of a collection of Soda Fired Stoneware, a process of mixing soda-ash and water together and spraying it into the kiln while firing. This creates a beautiful orange color as well as other colors that are associated with Mr. Heywood's work.

Stephen Heywood graduated from Southern Utah University, where he received his Bachelor of Arts degree, and Edinboro University in

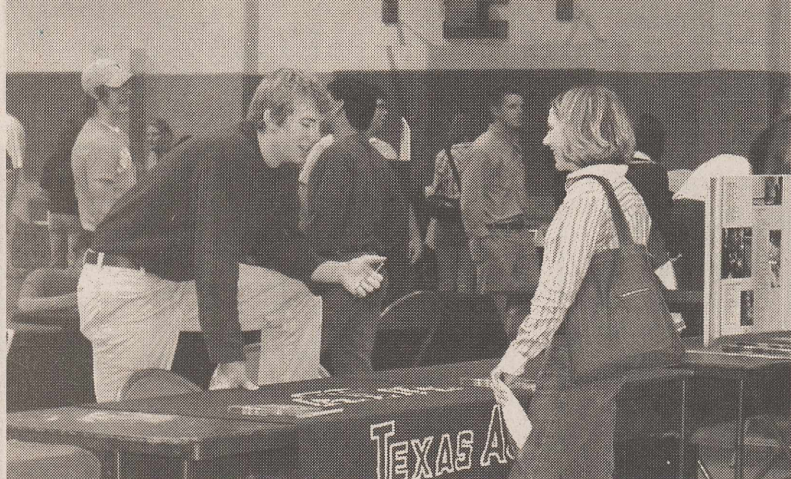
Pennsylvania, where he received his Master of Arts degree. In between graduate school and his current job at the Jacksonville Community College, Mr. Heywood worked at the Clay Space in Erie Pennsylvania which is associated with the Erie Art Museum.

At the present time Mr. Heywood and Shane Christensen, an Art/Ceramics Instructor here at WTC, have a show in Gannon University in Pennsylvania. They are also planning a show next year at Jacksonville Community College. Stephen Heywood's work is for sale and ranges from \$50 to \$350.
