


PTK Chances

Dual Credit Student **Numbers** Grow

Last Spring, I predicted that Western Texas College would have 655 dual credit students in the Fall 2003 semester. If the right statistics are used, then that goal was met. Let me explain.

Dual credit students take courses through Interactive TV, tape or Internet.

Last Spring, 560 students were taking classes. According to the enrollment statistics for the fall semester, we have 609 dual credit students. The total enrollment for WTC is 1649.

However, we also teach to an additional 154 students via VCT (Virtual College Texas.) These students are not registered as WTC students and are not counted in the enrollment statistics, but they are taught by our instructors. So, if these students are added in then we have a total of 714 dual credit students.

To be truthful, I was thinking about WTC students when I made the prediction. So, I am still short. For the past 6 semesters, dual credit enrollment has increased from semester to semester. So, I'll stick with the prediction of 655 dual credit WTC students in the Spring 2004 semester. Someday, we will get there.

Now, let me discuss the real point of this TI. Through dual credit classes, WTC has expanded its influence to a wide area of the state. WTC teaches students in places as far away as Cotton Center (north of Lubbock), Patton Springs (by Dickens), Tolar (by Fort Worth), Comstock (by Del Rio) and Mexia.

Why are we teaching in these far away places? One reason is that we are trying to meet the needs of these students. Another reason is that these schools have requested that we teach for them.

Of all the choices that these schools (which are outside of our service area) have, they have requested classes from WTC.

This is an excellent recruiting tool, I believe that we will see an increase in on-campus students in the future because dual credit students have had a great experience in the classes taught by WTC instructors and will want to come
