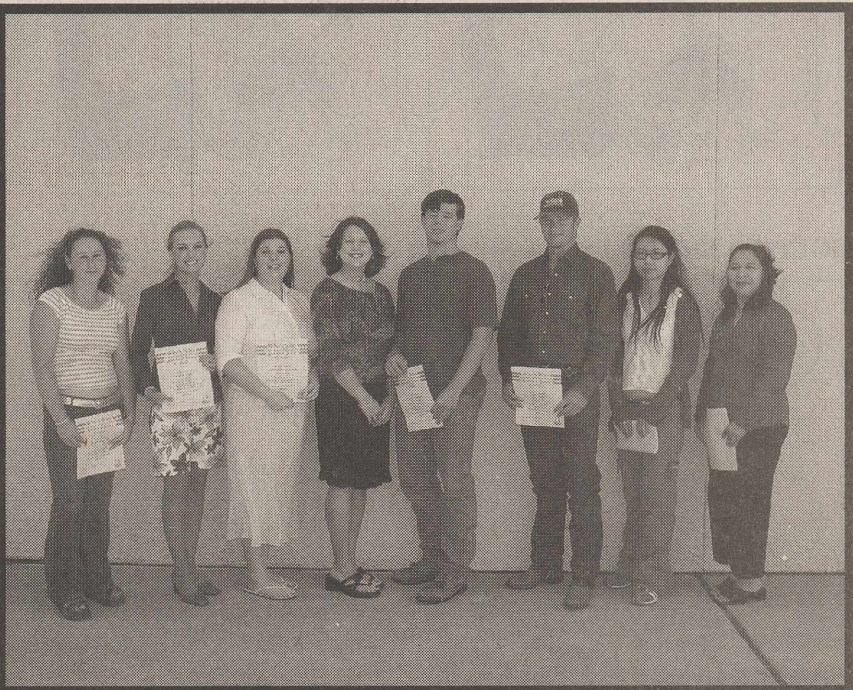
Outstanding Students Named at Awards Day

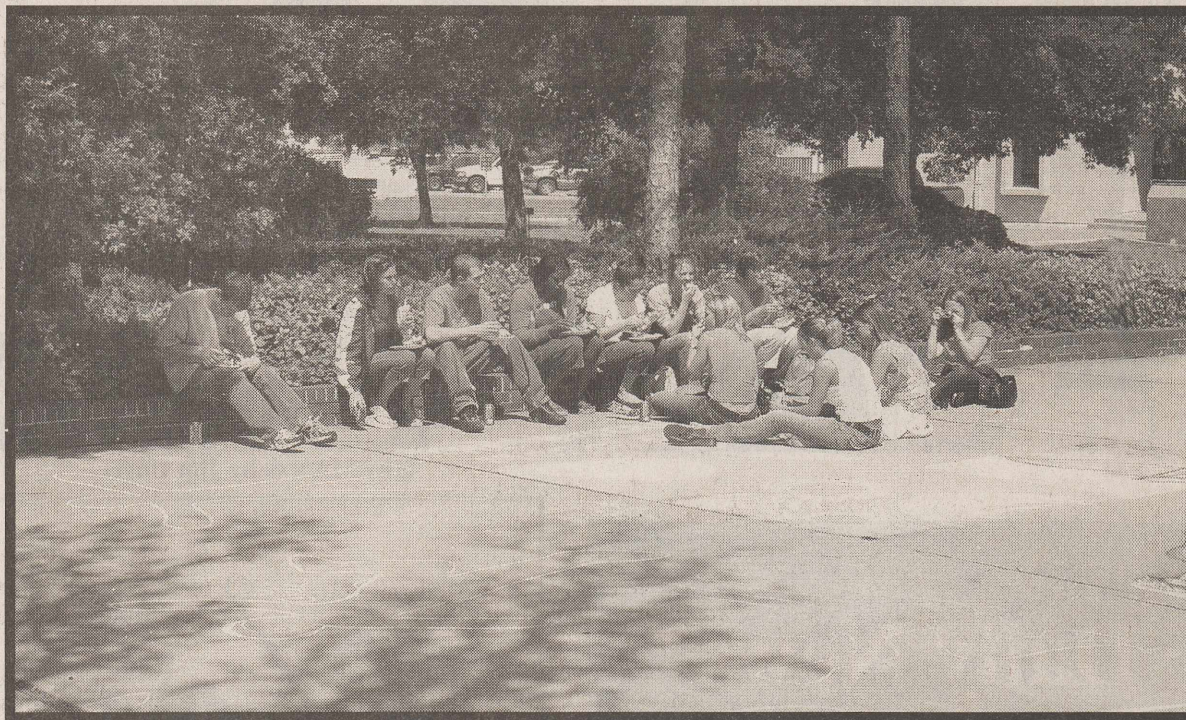
