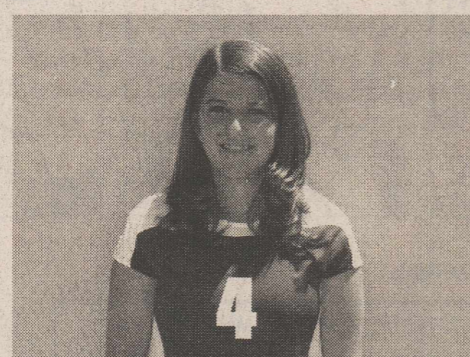
Yomaira Ruiz from Parker, AZ; and Lacy Westbrook from San Angelo, TX. All the team members are freshmen this year.

"The girls have worked very hard and have been very enthusiastic about the season," said McAden.



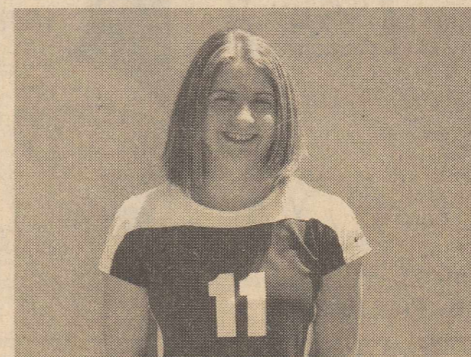

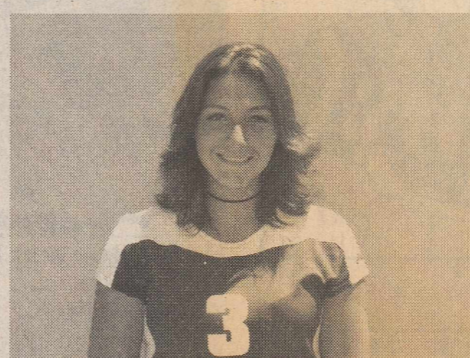

One returning WTC student commented on how great the Student Center looked and how different it was from last spring.

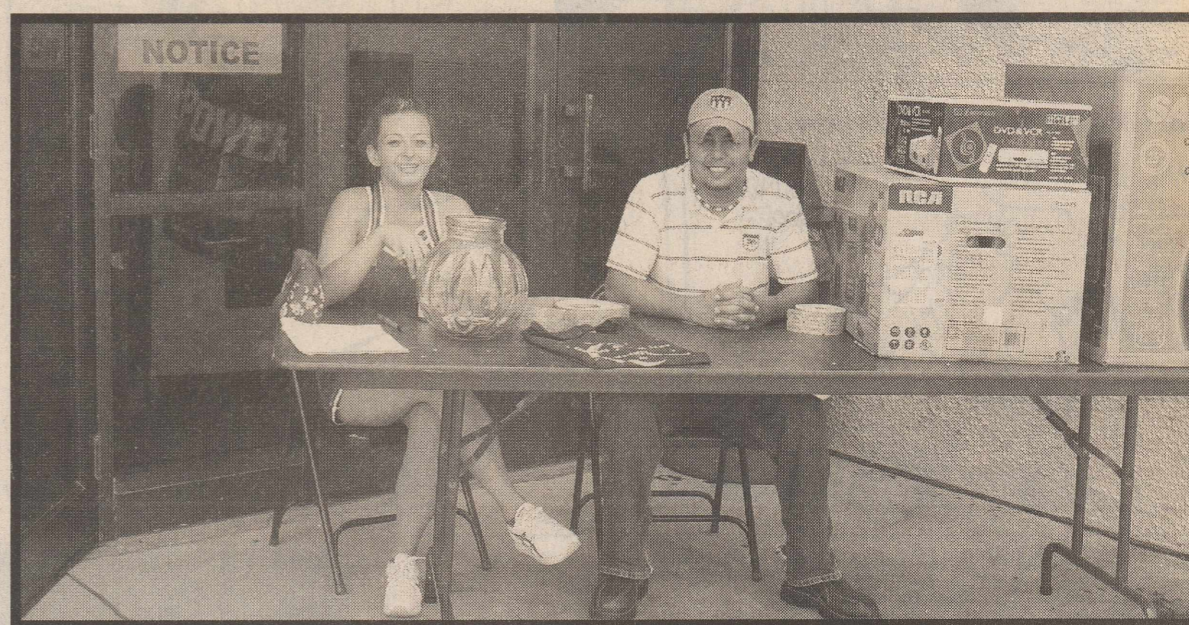
The changes are not over for the Student Center. The construction of the coffee shop is under way and should be finished by the first of September.
