

Plans this fall include the broadcast of the WTC Drama Department's first play of the season, "The Importance of Being Earnest," scheduled in late September.




Western Texas College has hired Dave Funk as Art Instructor. He began teaching classes this fall semester. Funk teaches Ceramics and Design I and II.




