## Wuensches set World RECORD!

A family with origins in Wilson, Texas, is the new World Record title holder in the Guinness Book of World Records for the most family members that have graduated from the same university. They set the record at 44, and they all are graduates of Texas Tech University in Lubbock, Texas. The title was verified in July 2022 after an extensive verification process, breaking a world record that stood at 40 family members that have graduated from the same university.

The Wuensche Family, originally from Wilson, has brought Texas Tech University to the limelight with them as they attained a Guinness Book of World Records for the most family members that have graduated from the same university. The previous record was 40 members of the Wayne family that attended Grambling State in Louisiana, according to information provided to the Wuensche family by the Guinness Book of World Records.

The Wuensche family beat this record, with 44 members graduating from Texas Tech. There were also 14 spouses that turned in the necessary paperwork to Guinness.

Amber Wuensche Parker, a family member who resides in the Metroplex area, was the driving force for gathering family information to submit to Guinness, according to her cousin Mark Wuensche, a Tahoka resident.

"My cousin Amber started pushing the family for documen-

tation a few years back, when she learned that the Wuensche family was in the area of possibly breaking the current Guinness World Record for the most family members to graduate from a university. That record was at 40, and we were closing in on that number then," said Mark.

"This started in 2014, when I read about the family that had just achieved the Guinness World Record for most family members that graduated from the same university (40)," Amber told *The News*.

"I like to stay connected with Wuensche family members, so I posted it on our Wuensche family Facebook page, and asked everyone

to reply if they were a Tech grad. It quickly became apparent that we were close. I then reached out to a more distant Wuensche relative on FB from Thorndale, and asked if his branch of the family had any Tech grads. He connected me with two more Wuensche's that joined our quest.

"It did take quite a while for everyone to turn in the paperwork - 8 years. By then, we had more recent grads to join us. The timing turned out perfectly in that our Guinness World Record was attained at the start of the celebration of Tech's 100 year anniversary," said Amber.

"We appreciate the community coming out and supporting our lunch and bake sale," said a spokesperson for the event.

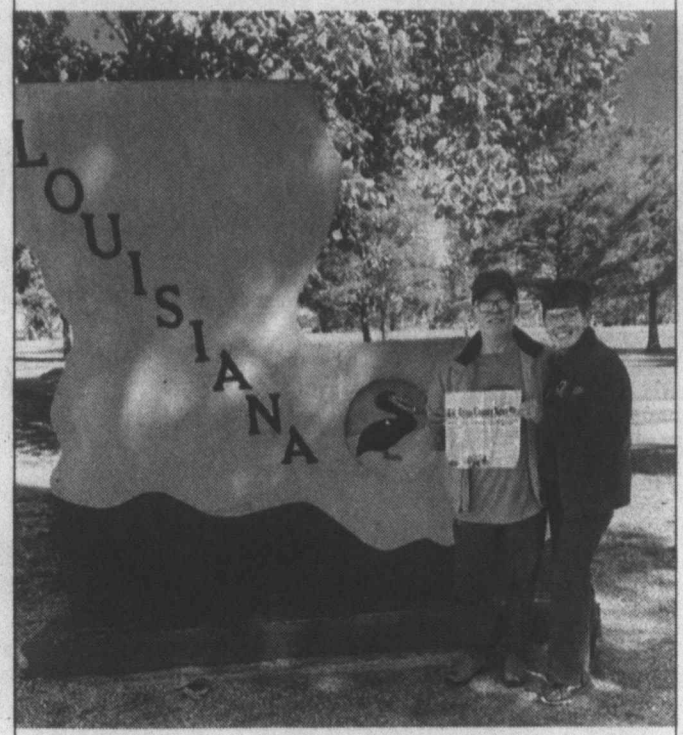
### Hancock wins OISD election

Blandon Hancock was the winner for the lone seat open on the O'Donnell ISD Board of Trustees in the Nov. 8 election. Hancock had 127 votes, according to election results from Lynn and Dawson County (OISD includes some area in Dawson County). Hancock had 107 votes on the Lynn County ballot, and 20 votes on the Dawson County ballot, for a total of 127.

Also running were Casey Boone, with 85 votes (68 Lynn and 17 Dawson), and Travis Walters with 61 votes (46 Lynn and 15 Dawson).

Hancock will serve the remaining 2.5 years on an unexpired term held by former trustee Melissa Pedroza.



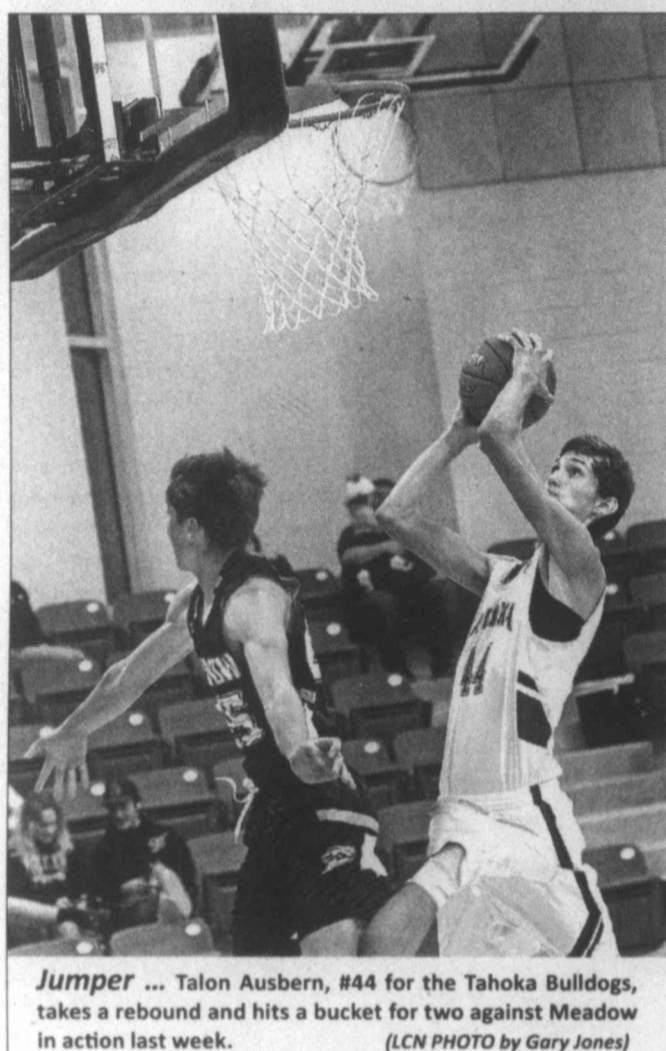

**USDA releases nationwide farmer, rancher and forest manager prospective customer survey**

Producers can now take a nationwide survey to help the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) improve and increase access to its programs and services for America's farmers, ranchers, and forest managers. The survey includes new and existing customers. USDA encourages all agricultural producers to take the survey, especially those who have not worked with USDA previously. The survey gathers feedback on programs and services available through USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA), Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and Risk Management Agency (RMA).

The survey is available online at farmers.gov/survey, and producers should complete by March 31, 2023. Stakeholder organizations are also encouraged to share the survey link through their networks. The survey is available in 14 different languages including Arabic, Chinese, English, French, Hmong, Korean, Navajo, Punjabi, Somali, Spanish, Tagalog, Thai, Urdu and Vietnamese.

"A robust survey response that includes the perspectives of all of our customers, including underserved producers, will help USDA better understand the unique needs of both existing and prospective customers, while identifying opportunities to enhance government programs and services. Please take the survey, especially if we haven't worked with you before," said Robert Bonnie, USDA's Under Secretary for Farm Production and Conservation (FPAC). "This survey will provide USDA with critical data to help USDA serve all

of agriculture."

In addition to the online survey, the FPAC Business Center, which is administering the survey, will also mail 11,000 printed surveys to various local state stakeholder organizations and farmers markets.

The survey is an Office of Management and Budget requirement supported by the Biden-Harris President's Management Agenda (PMA), which identified FSA and NRCS as High-Impact Service Providers. These agencies provide critical customer-facing services and are expected to use the survey data to make targeted improvements.

**Four elected to New Home ISD Board of Trustees**

The election for four seats on the New Home Independent School District Board of Trustees was a close race among the six candidates vying for the seats, in the Nov. 8 election.

According to official election results, Jason Gandy led the ticket with 415 votes, Corey Ann Clem had 402 votes, Andy Beck had 354, and Rusty Dutton had 339 votes, to claim the four seats on the board.

Also running were Travis Smith, with 286 votes, and Andy Maeker with 277 votes.

There were 2,073 total votes cast in the New Home ISD election, according to information from the election results posted by Lynn County election officials.

**Lamesa School officers to get AR-15s**

LAMESA – In another effort to ensure students and staff remain safe inside the Lamesa schools, board members Thursday agreed to allow School Resource Officers (SROs) to be armed with AR-15 assault rifles.

Officers can't access the weapons until they undergo training on the rifle.

An AR-15 is the same firearm a shooter used when he entered Robb Elementary School on May 24 in Uvalde. He fatally shot 19 students and two teachers, and wounded 17 others, and eventually was shot and killed by law enforcement officers.

SROs are commissioned by the Lamesa Police Department, but are employed by the school district. There are four SROs here – one for each of the school district's four campuses.

SROs are already licensed to carry handguns, and have access to shotguns mounted inside their patrol vehicles.

Board members agreed to acquire the AR-15 rifles, at a cost of \$700 per rifle, obtain gun locks, \$450 safes where the rifles will be stored in the SRO office at each campus, and mounts in their police vehicles to secure the weapon while on patrol.

**Cities, county get monthly sales tax payments**

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose districts \$1.1 billion in local sales tax allocations for November, 7.1 percent more than in November 2021. These allocations are based on sales made in September by businesses that report tax monthly, and on sales made in July, August and September by quarterly filers.

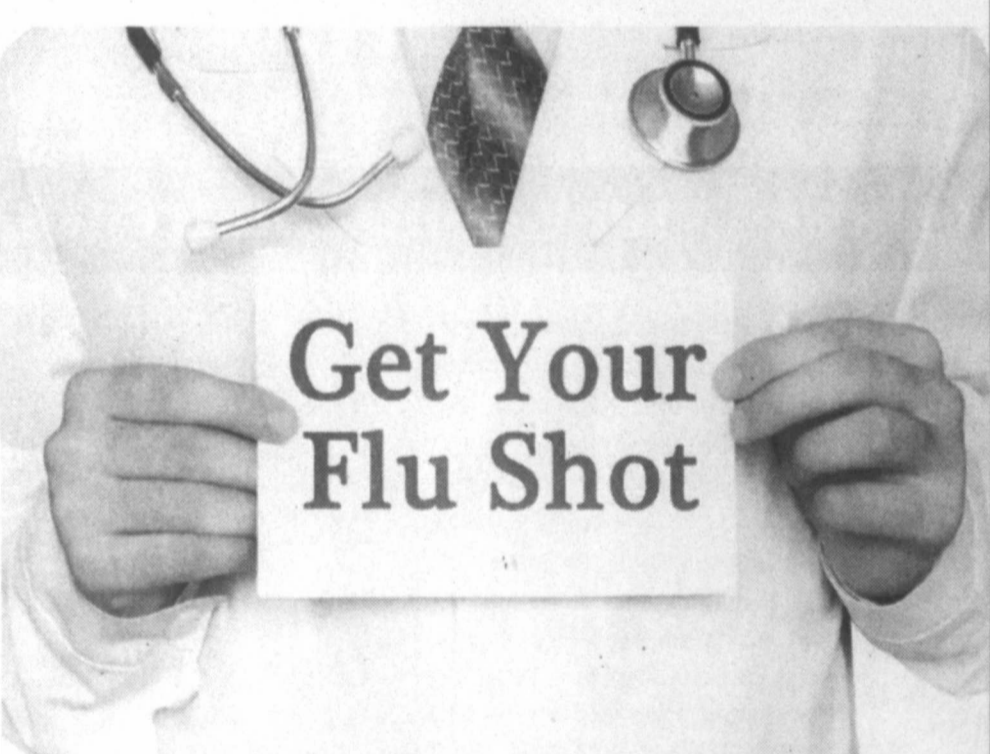
Lynn County's net payment for the month was \$16,543.60, based on a half-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$180,904.56.

The City of Tahoka's net payment for the month was \$24,605.83, based on a 1.5-cent sales tax rate (including a half-cent collection for the Tahoka Economic Development Corporation), making the total payment to date \$247,835.72.

The City of O'Donnell's net payment for the month was \$4,231.41, based on a 1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$41,272.26.

The City of Wilson's net payment for the month was \$2,551.96, based on a 1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$30,374.34.

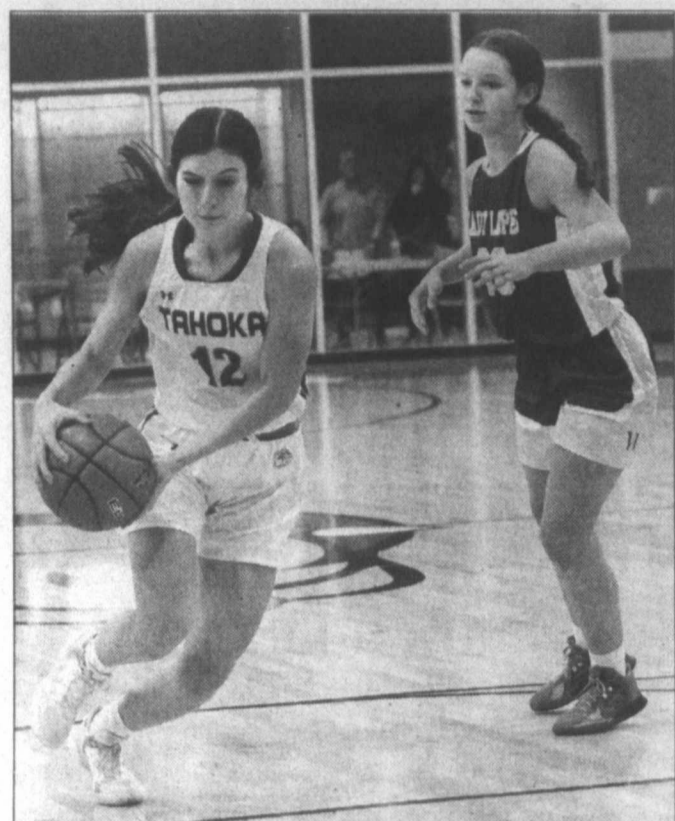

## County roads, ballot issues brought up to commissioners

Lynn County Commissioners met in regular session Monday morning at the Lynn County Courthouse. Lynn County resident Marcus Kidwell addressed the court regarding county road issues in northern Lynn County, including CR 6 and CR L, and asking that commissioners find funding to repair the roads.

Commissioners approved a final plat for New Home Estates, a subdivision near The Palms subdivision in northern Lynn County.

Chief Derek Hester gave the Lynn County Sheriff's Office report, and reported 41 inmates in the county jail.

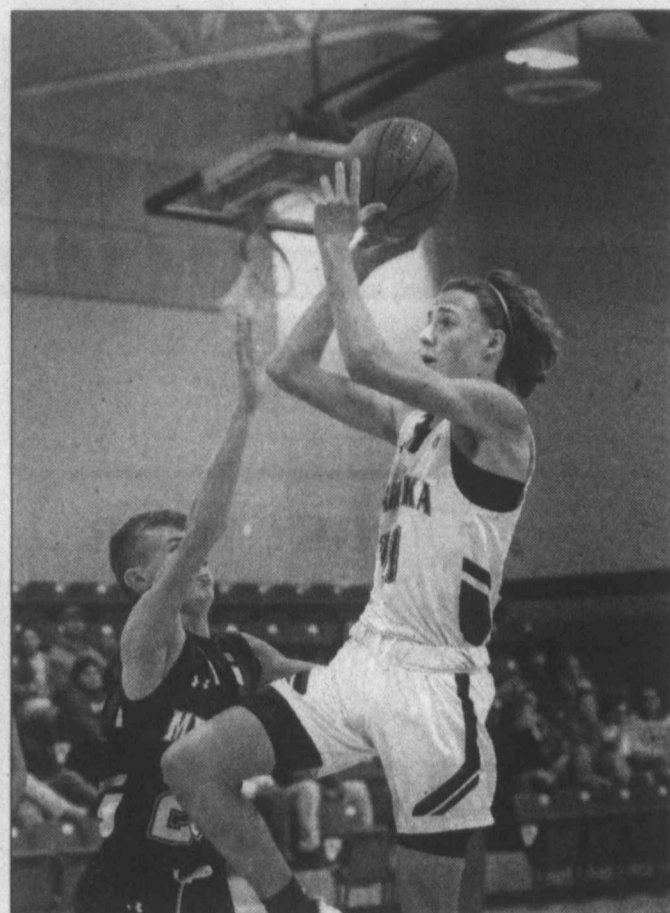
An agenda item was tabled for canvassing the ballots for the 2022 General Election, reportedly due to the fact that the results had not yet been certified by the state.

Lynn County News publisher Juanell Jones addressed the court, noting that Lynn County election results from

the Nov. 8 General Election were delayed in reporting results to all news media until later the following day, which may have been due to some alleged issues with one of the school board elections on the ballot. She asked county officials to investigate reports of the possibility of incorrect ballots provided to a few county residents that allowed them to vote in the New Home ISD election when they were not residents of the school district.

Commissioner Don Blair led the meeting in the absence of County Judge Mike Braddock. Commissioners John Hawthorne and Larry Durham were present. Commissioner Matt Woodley was absent from the meeting.

Commissioners have scheduled a special meeting for 1:30 p.m. Friday, Nov. 18 to canvass votes from the Nov. 8 General Election, and to discuss the election and possible solutions, according to the posted agenda.

### TPWD proposes to allow use of drones at night to spot feral hogs for hunters

TX FARM BUREAU – The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) is accepting comments on a proposal that would allow the use of unmanned aerial vehicles, commonly called drones, to locate feral hogs at night for hunters on the ground.

"To use aircraft for that purpose currently requires our permit provisions to comply with the federal Airborne Hunting Act," Stormy King, TPWD assistant commander of wildlife enforcement, told the Parks and Wildlife Commission.

"These rules, much like a lot of things related to drones, were all written years ago before drones were a thing. So, our current regulations, when they were written, were talking about helicopters mostly."

TPWD has the statutory authority to regulate the use of aircraft, including helicopters and drones, to manage wildlife in Texas.

Under current state regulations, those with an aerial wildlife permit can use drones during the day to locate feral hogs for lethal control measures on the ground. Use of drones for that purpose is prohibited between 30 minutes after sunset to 30 minutes before sunrise. The proposal, if adopted by the commission, would change that.

Feral swine cause millions of dollars in damages to crops, pastures, lawns, golf courses and cemeteries in Texas each year.

"Feral hogs are an extremely destructive nuisance species, causing great damage to agricultural crops and wildlife habitats across the state, and the department vigorously encourages the public to control feral hog populations in order to protect native wildlife and their habitats," the proposal states.

While the proposal would allow the use of drones to locate feral swine, it would now allow people to use drones to hunt from a drone.

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission was expected to discuss and consider the proposal at its meeting Nov. 2-3 in Austin. -- from the Lamesa Press-Reporter

### SHS culinary class starts dinner series exposition

"In order to give my students industry experience, and to teach them skills they can only learn by doing, we initiated a "Dinner Series" type exposition.

Kelly said the menu reflected the skills of the Culinary Arts students.

"Advanced Culinary students used their learned skills and

talents to present a six-course Italian Dinner to 20 guests," she said, adding it was offered to SISD staff, administration and guests, who had to make reservations and pay \$20 to attend. -- from The Slatonite

### Dawson Hospital makes pick for new CEO

LAMESA – It only took about 10 minutes for the Dawson County Hospital District board members to finalize a three-year contract with Freddy Olivarez, currently chief operating officer of the Martin County Hospital District, to become the new chief executive officer for the district.

The action ended a three-month search for a new CEO to replace Letha Stokes, who is retiring when her contract expires in January.

He is expected to start work on or about Dec. 19, having a 30-day resignation notice this week from his current position as chief operating officer of the Martin County Hospital.

His contract comes with a \$210,000 annual salary. The agreement stipulates he will relocate to Dawson County from Big Spring by Sept. 2023, after his son graduates from Big Spring High School.

Olivarez said he is excited about his new position. "He exceeded all of our criteria. He wants to be local. He wants to be a part of the community," said David Sanderson, hospital board president. -- from the Lamesa Press-Reporter

### Thousands turn out to hear Tebow at Fields of Faith event

ANDREWS – Tim Tebow had to alter his speaking schedule to appear in Andrews on Wednesday night (Oct. 19).
