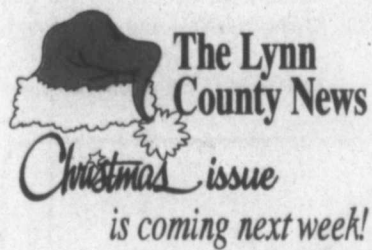


LCSO sponsoring toy drive for children here

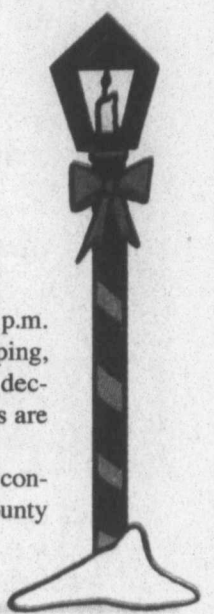
Annual Christmas event is Saturday

City seeks citizens for new Community Relations Board

The City of Tahoka, with approval from the City Council, is seeking citizens to form a new advisory committee whose purpose would be to serve as liaisons between city officials and the community, to report the community's needs and concerns to the city council in an advisory capacity, as well as to plan events.

"It is important for us to know what our citizens are wanting, what their concerns may be, and we would like for this board to also initiate and plan community events and projects with the city's involvement," explained Julie Arrington, City Administrator.

The City Council unanimously approved a motion at Monday night's council meeting to create a Community Relations Board, and discussed the need for having a diversified representation of citizens from throughout the community.

It was decided to have two citizens represented from each of the four city council districts, as well as additional citizens from at-large, to fill an 11-member board.

In order to implement the initiative, council members discussed finding volunteers for the board by speaking to citizens in their precincts, and to have an application form placed in this newspaper and on social media to provide opportunities for citizens to submit for consideration to serve on the board. To fill the board, each council member may appoint two citizens from the applications to represent their precinct on the board, and the mayor and the at-large council member may appoint three additional citizens.

The deadline for applications to be submitted at City Hall is Wednesday, Jan. 4.

An application form is printed on page 4 in this newspaper, and

can also be found on the City of Tahoka's Facebook page. Citizens interested in serving on the board may also contact city council members Nathan Garcia, Joe Craig, Shiloh Braddock, Samantha Henderson, and Stephen Overstreet, or Mayor John Baker.

In other action at Monday's meeting, the council approved applying for grant funds for the Texas Capital Fund-Downtown Revitalization Program through the South Plains Association of Governments, and adopted Procedural Rules for the City Council and Board meetings.

Information was presented to the council regarding details of the Texas Department of Transportation 2023 Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside Grant, for the council to consider in making plans for seeking grant funds for sidewalk connectivity projects in the city.

City Attorney W. Calloway Huffaker presented council train-

ing regarding the Texas Open Meetings Act, Open Records Act, and Public Information Act.

During the open forum, Shae Askew presented information on the Hometown Christmas event that will be held on Saturday.

An ongoing issue with runoff water drainage issues causing hazardous conditions in northwest city streets was discussed, with city officials gathering information to present the case to TxDOT regarding the US 380 and Country Club Road areas.

Department head reports and a city manager update were also presented. During the city manager update, Arrington told council members that a new city website is currently being built, which will be designated as Tahoka.org.

Mayor Baker led the meeting, which convened at 6 p.m. and adjourned at 8:30 p.m. All council members were present, as well as other city departmental officials.

Albany stops Leopards in state semifinals



The New Home Leopards' historical season came to an end on Thursday against the Albany Lions, 53-25, in the 2A Division 2 State Semifinals held in Sweetwater. It was a bittersweet ending for the Leopards, who made school history by going the furthest in football playoffs than ever before, but were hoping for a chance to play in the state finals.

Leading the Leopard defense in a tough battle against the Lions was junior, Logan Addison, with 26 tackles. Seniors, Cameron McFadden and Brady Brown, finished their high school football career with 15 tackles each. Junior, Graham Keys, also had 15 tackles.

Senior, Jackson Raines, ended his high school football career with nine receptions for 143 yards and two touchdowns.

Lubbock Avalanche Journal's

Athlete of the Week, Brazos Beck (junior), completed 19 out of 30 passes, with 211 total passing yards. He had eight attempts for 74 yards and scored two touchdowns for the Leopards.

"I am very proud of our team this year. We are going to continue a winning tradition at New Home, I'm already looking forward to next season," said junior, Jacob Meunier.

The Leopards finished their season with a record of 13-2.

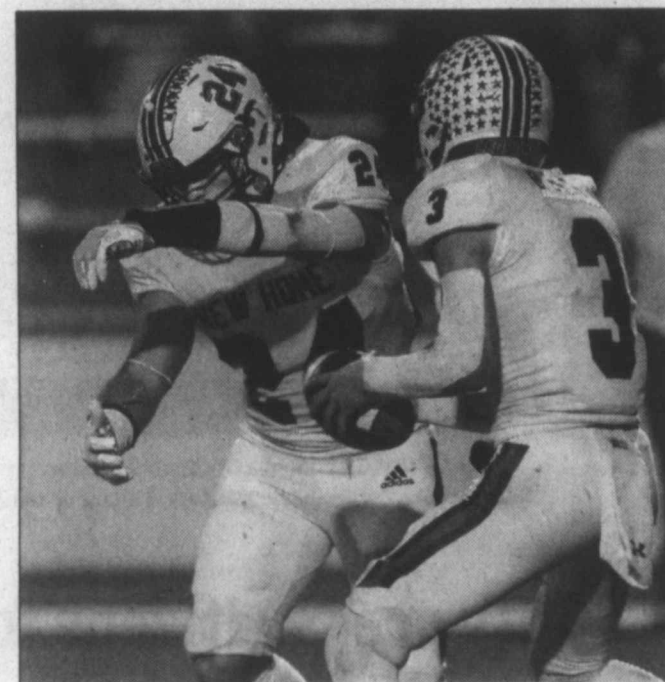

Cities, county get monthly sales tax payments

Texas Comptroller Glenn Hegar announced he will send cities, counties, transit systems and special purpose districts \$1.1 billion in local sales tax allocations for December, 12.4 percent more than in December 2021. These allocations are based on sales made in October by businesses that report tax monthly.

Lynn County's net payment for the month was \$14,081.48, based on a half-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$194,986.04.

The City of Tahoka's net payment for the month was \$19,231.85, based on a 1.5-cent sales tax rate (including a half-cent collection for the Tahoka Economic Development Corporation), making the total payment to date \$267,067.57.

The City of O'Donnell's net payment for the month was \$2,185.24, based on a 1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$43,457.50.

The City of Wilson's net payment for the month was \$2,509.88, based on a 1-cent sales tax rate, making the total payment to date \$32,884.22.

'Operation Snake Eyes' shuts down seven area game rooms

BROWNFIELD - A cooperative effort among multiple law enforcement agencies resulted in the execution of 'Operation Snake Eyes' which saw 29 arrests across Hockley County at seven game room locations.

Law enforcement agencies such as the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Hockley County Sheriff's Office, Levelland Police Department and the Department of Public Safety have been working on the joint operation for the better part of a year.

A two-phase operation, the first part of the take down, resulted in 13 arrests with five additional that were already in custody being served for a total of 18.

The second part of the operation began with seven groups of law enforcement personnel that raided five game room locations in Levelland, one game room in Opedyke West and the seventh location in Austin.

Police locate woman for doctor concerned about her welfare

Tahoka Police performed a good deed in a welfare concern last week, when a Lubbock physician's office contacted the police at 8:15 a.m. Dec. 9, to seek assistance in contacting one of their patients.

The female patient resides in Tahoka, and the doctor's office had been unable to contact her by phone. They told police that she had recently had an MRI conducted and they had just received the results and were trying to contact the patient immediately because the MRI indicated that she was having a mild stroke. Police were able to make contact with the woman at her home, and while there had the woman call the doctor's office, who requested that she be brought immediately to the Lubbock hospital facility. Police called Lynn County EMS, who transported the woman to Lubbock.

Police assisted a student at

Tahoka High School in locating a missing cell phone, last Friday morning. The student discovered the cell phone missing from a gym locker, and police worked in conjunction with the student to track the phone. The student was able to initiate an alarm on the phone, and the phone was eventually traced back to the locker, where whomever had taken the phone apparently returned it after the alarm sounded. The phone was returned to the student.

Tahoka Police, Lynn County EMS, and Tahoka Volunteer Fire Department members all assisted in a search for an individual visiting a local resident, described

as an "elderly female with dementia", when the woman apparently wandered off on foot from the residence. The call came in at 7 p.m. Dec. 11, and police reports indicate that EMS located the woman after approximately 20 minutes, walking away from the area.

She was returned safely to the home.

A local resident contacted police on Dec. 10 to report threatening messages sent via an app on a phone, allegedly from the Dominican Republic, threatening to send pornographic videos and/or arrest if payment was not made. A report was taken.

Lynn County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) received a call from OnStar at 7:42 p.m. Dec. 7 reporting that a vehicle had struck a deer on US 87 and CR 6, and reporting that the vehicle would be in the center median, but also reporting that OnStar was unable to get in contact with anyone inside the vehicle. Deputies responding to the location reported that the vehicle was unoccupied and off the roadway.

A male driver was arrested after a traffic stop on US 87 and CR 6 at 12:20 a.m. Dec. 6, after a deputy conducted a vehicle search. The male was arrested on charges of possession of a controlled substance and for felon in possession of

a firearm, and the vehicle was towed.

The LCSO K-9 team was requested at a traffic stop on a vehicle four miles south of Tahoka on US 87 at 11:16 p.m. Dec. 10. According to call sheet reports, the K-9 gave a positive alert, and the female

driver was arrested on possession of a controlled substance, unlawfully carrying a weapon, and for an outstanding warrant for possession of marijuana from Tom Green County.

LCSO and Tahoka Police Department assisted DPS in stopping a vehicle that DPS was pursuing that was heading eastbound on US 380 towards Tahoka at 8:51 a.m. Dec. 8. The vehicle was reportedly stopped about 4 miles west of Tahoka on US 380. No arrests were made, according to reports, but citations may have been issued.

LCSO assisted Lubbock PD at 9:34 a.m. Dec. 8 in verifying that a runaway juvenile had returned home to a residence in Lynn County. A deputy reported verification that the juvenile had returned home and was in school.

Other calls to law enforcement were for reports of suspicious persons/vehicles, welfare concerns, illegal dumping of tires, motorists needing assistance, loud music, reckless drivers, domestic disturbances, child custody issues, and loose dogs.



Commissioners approve vehicle take-home program for deputies

Lynn County Commissioners approved a vehicle take-home program for Lynn County Sheriff's deputies in action taken Monday morning in regular session at the Lynn County Courthouse.

The motion was approved with a caveat, that the program was being approved on a trial basis with specific guidelines in place, that would allow deputies to take home their official LCSO vehicles when off-duty. The purpose of the program is to allow for faster response time in emergency situations when off-duty deputies could be needed to return to duty quickly to assist in emergencies.

Currently, deputies leave their LCSO vehicles at the LCSO when off-duty, and take their personal vehicles home. However, much of their emergency response equipment is inside their squad vehicles, and off-duty deputies responding to an emergency must first travel to the LCSO and retrieve their squad vehicles. In emergency situations, time is of the essence, and those extra minutes could make a difference, especially if the emergency is in outlying

areas of the county.

Commissioners will review the program after six months, to consider whether to keep it implemented if it proves to be successful.

In other business, commissioners discussed the date for all re-elected county officials to take the Oath of Office for their next terms. Because the eight county officials were declared elected after running unopposed in the November election, their terms remain in effect, and the swearing-in ceremonies were set for Tuesday, Jan. 3, 2023 at 2 p.m. Those officials include Lynn County Judge Mike Braddock, District Clerk Courtney Odom, County Clerk Karen Strickland, County Treasurer Amy Schuknecht, Precinct 2 Commissioner John Hawthorne, Precinct 4 Commissioner Larry Durham, Pct. 1 Justice of Peace Christie Olivian, and Pct. 4 Justice of Peace Ed Follis.

Lynn County Agrilife Extension Agents Sierra Stephens and Kaci Scott presented information to commissioners on the 4-H program.

A jail report stated there were 49 inmates in Lynn County Jail, including 34 for Lynn County, 14 for Bell County, and 1 for Dawson County, with four female inmates housed elsewhere.

Monthly bills were approved, and Judge Braddock presented an update on the courthouse repairs. He noted that the District Courtroom floors and walls have been repaired, and chairs and other furnishings were almost finished being installed. It is anticipated that 106th District Court proceedings can return to the District Courtroom beginning in January 2023.

Judge Braddock led the meeting, with all four commissioners present including Larry Durham, Don Blair, John Hawthorne and Matt Woodley, as well as other county officials.

O'Donnell alum honored as NMSU Aggie Legend

O'DONNELL - An O'Donnell ISD alumni, Kenneth White, has been honored as the newest NMSU Aggie Legend.

For more than 50 years, Kenneth R. White has served New Mexico State University, and his dedication was celebrated when he was selected as the newest Aggie Legend.

White, who is a Regents Professor Emeritus in Civil Engineering, has worked in numerous positions such as interim dean, department head, associate dean of research, and professor at NMSU in the College of Engineering since 1970.

The Aggie Legend is an NMSU tradition honoring alumni and friends of NMSU who have supported NMSU while continuing successful careers. White was recognized at Founders Day, April 26.

In addition to his work with the university, White also served on the New Mexico State Board of Registration for Professional Engineers and Surveyors, and was State Transportation Commissioner for Southwestern New Mexico in District 1. He was a lead instructor for bridge inspection training for more than 30 different state Department of Transportation, and was the principal investigator on bridge testing and evaluation for the Federal Highway Administration and bridge inspection and evaluation for the New Mexico DOT for more than 20 years.

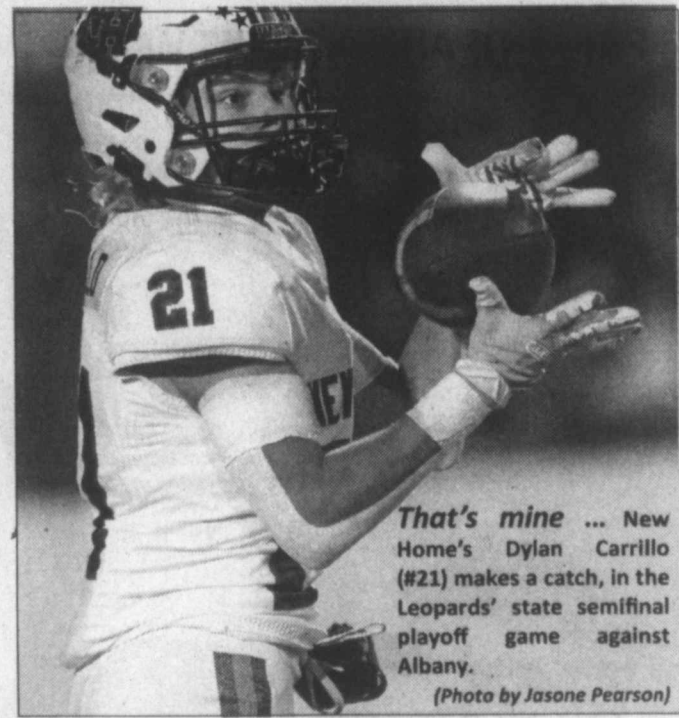

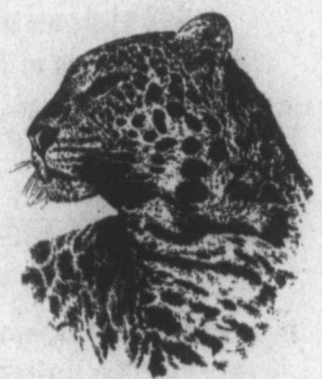
