Anthony May, a freshman at West Texas A&M University, made the President's List with a 4.0 grade point average for the fall 2000 semester.

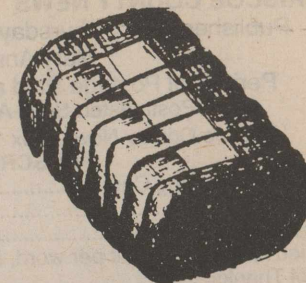

Unconditional Love

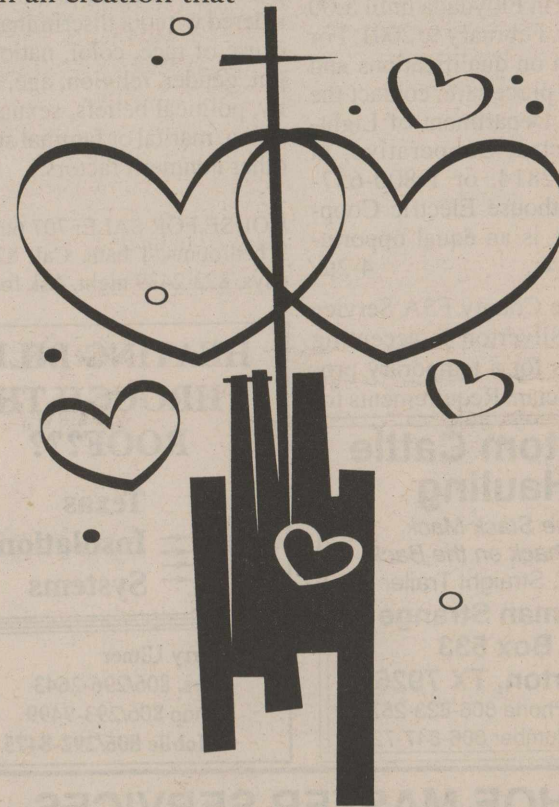

WINNIE REDIN

Funeral services for Winnie Redin, 99, were scheduled for 2:00 p.m. Wednesday, January 24, at the First Baptist Church in Silverton. Dr. Travis Hart, pastor of the First Baptist Church in Plainview was to officiate.

Burial in the Silverton Cemetery was arranged by Myers-Long Funeral Directors.

Mrs. Redin, who had resided in Hale Center for the past several years, passed away there Monday, January 22.

The former Winnie Joiner, she was born June 4, 1901 in Hunt County, Texas, and was one of the six children of Charlie and Obara Joiner. They moved from Woodson to Silverton in a covered wagon in December 1915. She started to Silverton High School in January 1916 and was graduated as salutatorian of the class of 1918. She loved school and had wanted to be a teacher from the time she was in first grade. She taught at the Francis school, which was located about a mile from her home, then taught at the Rock Creek school before going to teach in the Silverton School. She attended college in the summers and received her bachelor of science degree in 1936 and her masters degree in 1950.

She married Alvin Redin May 11, 1918, the day after her high school graduation. He preceded her in death April 17, 1990.

Mr. Redin put in a gasoline filling station at their house and later began to buy cream and eggs.

A highlight of their lives was the arrival of their son, Harley, and later following his career as he coached at Wayland Baptist College. For several years Mr. Redin and Tomlin-Fleming Gin sponsored the Wayland Queen Bees (freshman women's team) and during this period the Queen Bees usually played a pre-season game here with the Silverton High School girls.

The Redins helped educate several young people who needed help. They kept students in their home when a home was needed for them. In 1944 Patricia Ann Jackson, whose father was in the Army and whose mother had died, came to stay with them until arrangements could be made for her. She stayed from the age of eight until she was married in 1958.

Mrs. Redin (sort of) retired from

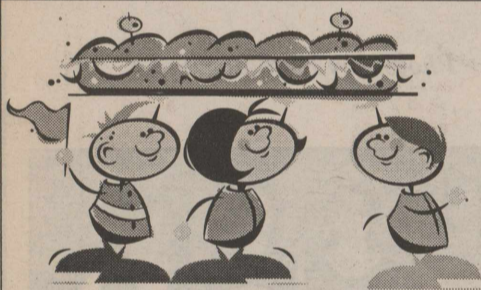

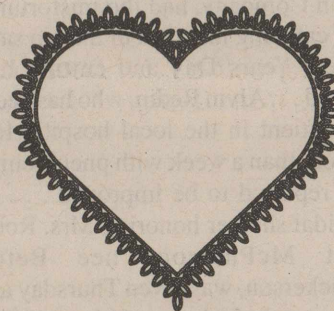
