WARSAW, Poland (AP) - Solidarity leaders rushed to Radom today to try to avert the second strike threat of the week. Poland's communist regime also was expected to open talks in Radom, but continued a campaign against dissidents

Freed prisoners will be allowed Libya landing

DAMASCUS, Syria (AP) - The leader of a trio of heavily armed hijackers said that none of the more than 100 hostages aboard a Pakistani ietliner seized 12 days ago would be freed "until all political prisoners and family members" released by Pakistan arrive in Libya.

The Pakistani military government began assembling the political prisoners it agreed to free Thursday after the hijackers threatened to kill three Americans among the hostages. Libya, asked to provide asylum for the hijackers and to receive the freed prisoners, has agreed, a Pakistani diplomat here said.

Pakistani officials who declined tobe identified also said they expected a plane to leave Karachi, Pakistan, tonight with 49 freed prisoners and members of their families, but the plane's destination was not revealed The hijackers asked for 55 dissidents to be freed, but Pakistani officials say they have not been able to locate six.

The officials said the latest demands by the hijackers were "not a problem," but that the timing of the release was still unsettled.

The plane was commandeered over Pakistan March 2 and flown first to Kabul, Afghanistan, and then to the Damascus airport. The hijackers shot and killed one hostage, a Pakistani diplomat, while it was in Kabul.

The hijack leader also told negotia tors in the control tower of Damascus airport today that the trio demanded that an agreement in writing be sent to the Syrian government, the United Nations and Amnesty International, a human rights group based in London.

A Pakistani spokesman in Islamabad today denied his government had agreed to pay \$50,000 to the hijackers and said, "We have received no demands for money.

Showing some impatience, the hijacker said, "we want a reply very soon. This problem should be settled as quickly as possible.

He also insisted that relatives of the three hijackers should be allowed to return to Pakistan, sell their property and ship out their belongings without interference. He demanded that the government pay their air fares.

A possible sticking point was identification of six political activists on the hijackers' list of 55 to be freed. Pakistani authorities said they were not held in Pakistan jails.

The hijacker demanded that authorities "confirm the identification of our six friends whether they are traced or not.

Western diplomatic sources said there were "strong indications" the hijackers wanted the hostages flown to Libya along with themselves and the freed prisoners from Pakistan. But Syrian and Pakistani officials were opposed to that solution in part because the crew of the plane was exhausted from the ordeal and the plane needed servicing, the sources said.

Zia had given Syrian President Hafez Assad carte blanche to free the hostages. But veteran observers doubted Assad would use force because the hijackers are disciples of Bhutto, who sent arms and men to aid Syria in the 1973 war against Israel. Zia led the military coup that overthrew Bhutto in 1976, and he was executed two years later.

"All the passengers are in good spirits despite their long ordeal," said Khan. But Syrian officials reported earlier that they were in poor shape physically and psychologically.

"When they eventually come of that plane, they will certainly be a miserable and smelly lot," said an official of the Pakistani airline.

ATLANTA (AP) - The Guardian Angels, an anti-crime youth group from New York, got a mixed reception from residents on the first full day of their campaign to help Atlanta youngsters protect themselves from killers

The 11-member contingent, wearing distinctive red berets and white T-shirts, visited several playgrounds Thursday to offer advice and encouragement to youngsters in the wake of the city's string of 20 child slayings.

While some residents said they were glad to see the Angels, in the Techwood Homes housing project the youths were met by a group of adults who asked them to leave.

'They came into the community without an invitation," said Israel Green, a spokesman for the United Tenants Association. "They weren't invited into the city by the mayor or the (police) commissioner. They just

bullied their way in here." Green said the tenants feared that the Angels, a racially mixed group,

would add to the tension created in Atlanta's black communities. "The neighborhoods are so tense

now," he said. "If we knew these people, we could accept them. But we don't know who these people are. The Angels left the Techwood



Government must become more efficient in 1980s

As Texas state government moves into the 1980s it will be entering "a new ballgame. We won't see the surpluses we had in the 1970s," Sam Coats predicted Thursday during a session in the Petroleum Club with local businessmen.

With reduced surpluses, the goal of the Texas Research League becomes even more important: To find ways of operating state government in the most efficient manner.

Coats, who has been executive director of the research league since. 1979, said the public "will have to be much more prudent and businesslike to manage this creature called state government."

The Texas Research League is supported by businessmen and is an objective organization which provides information to legislators, government employees and even the governor.

NATURAL RESOURCES in the future are a primary concern to Coats. The league currently is looking at the oil and gas situation, and Coats is worried about the water supply. Tax relief is an item state legislators will have to wrestle with in the future, he said while advocating the new coun-

ty-wide tax appraisal district. Gov. Bill Clements asked the league to investigate the oil and gas supplies. to "see when the revenue curve will start downward,"-said Coats, "Even though production and reserves are decreasing, oil prices are going up and we're still getting more money.'

Some of the variables under study include feasibility of increased secondary and tertiary recovery as prices rise and how it will affect state revenues. In spite of increased technology for deeper recovery, Coats said the day will come when the supplies are gone

Currently, oil and gas revenues account for about 20 percent of the state's total income.

"The question is when and how do we plan for it. What other sources of state revenue do we look for?" That, study should answer those questions, he said.

Drying up of water sources should be placed in the context of a state wide problem, not just a regional one in which people believe West Texas farmers will bear the brunt, Coats said, voicing his belief that water will

be the greatest challenge of the decade for state government.

'The water situation involves not only surface water, but also depletion of aquifers, flood control and subsidence control down on the coast. It's a state issue, not just regional," he explained.

"THE STATE IS going to have to worry about it on the whole, not fractionalize it," Coats added.

Formerly an attorney and a state representative, Coats looked at "the vast lead time from conception of a water project until it's brought on line. Time is running out. Projects providing water today were planned back in the 1950s.

State government spent too much money in the 1970s, Coats claimed, charging the legislators with dipping their hand too freely into the surplus. Now, a shortfall of \$350 to \$400 million is appearing for the budget under consideration.

The highway partment is one of those agencies that has been running short of funds in recent years and reverting to the general surplus. A higher state gasoline tax than the current 5 cents per gallon has been proposed. But Coats expects to see

that proposal fail in this session of thelegislature. 'Clements is not going to support

any tax increase of any type. Earlier, it was thought a gas tax increase might be right for a change;" he said. The Texas Research League has

looked extensively into property tax reform, according to Coats. But as inflation goes up, so will these taxes; he said.

Property tax is one of the main resources in Texas for local government," Coats remarked. "The problem is how to reduce it for those people who need it badly, but without damaging the property tax base."

ONE METHOD OF relief is re ferred to as the "circuit breaker. Coats explained that this concept, already in use in other states, allows a person to pay a certain amount of taxes on his property. But when that tax exceeds a given percentage of that person's income, the state picks up the excess portion.

In various counties, some tax relief may come with the new tax appraisa! districts, claimed Coats. "Taxpayers shouldn't have to pay for school, county and city appraisers. They should save money by eliminating some appraisers.

The 100 percent assessment has caused trouble in cities throughout the state, he conceded. But in many, cases, people's property hadn't been reappraised for years. Taking into consideration inflation during those years, the value of their property had increased dramatically.

"Homeowners don't look at their homes as investments," Coats said of one problem with the objections of recent assessments.

Another problem with the 100 percent assessments has surfaced when the taxing bodies failed to drop their tax rate accordingly, Coats remarked.

The former executive with Texas International Airlines praised the governor's plan for increased cooperation between state government and business, and the Research League has aided in that project.

PEOPLE FROM THE private sector were brought in to look over the 12 largest state agencies and recommend changes to improve their effi-

Spring eases way back into Basin

Spring is beginning to inch its way back into the Permian Basin. But it still may be a good idea to keep the umbrella handy

The National Weather Service at Midland Regional Airport is calling for partly cloudy skies on Saturday However, there lingers a 20 percent chance of thundershowers that day.

After the mercury rests at 40 de grees tonight, it should rise into the middle 60s on Saturday, according to the weatherman.

Westerly winds should come through at the speed of 5 to 10 mph tonight, and switch to southeasterly at 5 to 10 mph Saturday.

High on Thursday was 52 degrees, which was still a cool comparison to the record high of 88 degrees set on that date in 1967. Overnight low was 34 degrees, a sizzling reading compared to the record low of 14 degrees set in 1932.

Geologist seeks to preserve crater

ODESSA - Twenty-five thousand years ago a fiery meteor blazed across the Ice-Age sky above West Texas, exploded in mid-air and crashed into the Permian Basin 10 miles southwest of present-day Odessa.

The impact formed one major crater and two lesser ones which are known today as Odessa Meteor Crater, and the geologist who supervised its original excavation between 1939 and 1941 is seeking to preserve it for future generations.

"I think it should be treated as an important historic site ... not as a tourist attraction," Glen L. Evans, formerly of Midland and currently a geological consultant for The Univer sity of Texas, told an audience of 70 persons gathered at The University of Texas in the Permian Basin Thursday

'There's been gigantic looting of this one out here for 40 years," he said sadly. "I wish they hadn't done that. I just wish people would leave the area alone

Evans, who has studied meteor-craters throughout the world, explored the possibility that the Odessa Meteor Crater may be associated with the great Meteor Crater in Arizona.

"They're very similar in age and content (both nickel iron) and it makes me wonder if they could have been part of the same fall," he mused. "Sometimes meteors come in clusters.

"IF YOU LOOK for other series of craters there's only Central Australiawith a group of 13, the largest about the size of our number two crater here, a cluster of four in Argentina. much smaller than ours, seven in Russia and another in Arabia," he explained, adding that an additional series of craters, all smaller than the

tossils of Pleistocene horses and elephant teeth, and the bedrock was still fragmented beneath," he noted. 'This gives us some idea of the age, but what we really need to find is (fossilized vegetation) in the origi-

nal soil to get a carbon dating." He noted that the art of documenting craters as being the result of meteor falls is "a quite new science" and noted that even as recently as 1960 reputable geologists were arguing that the vast Arizona meteor crater – a half-mile wide, 500 feet deep - is the result of a gas explosion and that the thousands of meteorite frag- store the site.

House passes nuke waste bill

AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — State Health Commissioner Robert Bernstein says some hospitals have drums of low-level radioactive trash in their hallways, but the House has acted to solve the problem.

House members passed a bill Thursday, 139-1, authorizing permanent waste disposal sites in Texas for low-level nuclear wastes and imposing a number of safeguards.

The bill next returns to the Senate, where it originated, for action on two amendments added by the House. If senators accept the changes, the bill will go to Goy. Bill Clements for signature into law

Bernstein told the Texas Energy and Natural Resources Advisory Council on Thursday that hospitals, industrial firms and medical research laboratories have virtually no way to dispose of their radioactive trash.

There are only three permanent disposal sites in the nation — in South Carolina, Washington and Nevada --and Bernstein said they are virtually useless to Texas.

He said South Carolina will not accept Texas waste, Washington insists on a \$5 million bond against possible damage, and Nevada re-

EVANS SAID his approach to future development of the site differs from that of many persons. "I don't think anybody should try to make it into a tourist attraction, because it won't ever make it," he said, following a one-hour slide presentation. "People want something extraordinary, like a Grand Canyon, and this

'It's a rare land feature, but it is one that several years down the road...may be wanted-by people who desperately want to look down in the ground" and inspect qualities that may have been overlooked, he noted. Evans, who described the craters as "the best-documented craters in the world" said even today if he were excavating the site there are additional features he would search for.

"You can learn a good deal from a good impact model, and we've got the best, the most accessible there is," he noted. "I believe there are other craters there that are totally filled. I wouldn't be surprised but what there aren't large meteorites still buried out there.

HOWEVER, SAID Evans, there are problems that threaten the future of the craters - not so much erosion as people who vandalize and scavenge the area.

main Odessa crater, were formed during a witnessed fall in 1947 in Siksote-Alin, Russia.

Evans said a vast incongruity exists regarding craters, in that "the biggest meteorites, when they're found in the ground, are in the smallest craters, and in the largest craters you don't find any meteorites at all.

He further explained that massive meteors, such as in the Tonguska fall witnessed in 1908 in Russia, vaporize upon impact, doing massive area damage but leaving little sign of cra ters

Although no main core exists at the Odessa site, Evans said other evidence indicates the mass of the meteor which slammed into the Permian Basin as "somewhere in excess of 500 tons, although it may have been three times that.

EVANS SAID that while it is difficult to determine the definite origin of many craters, the Odessa crater has been well-verified as being formed as the result of an extraterrestial meteor.

He explained it contains most of the classic astroblemes - structural features - associated with impact craters, including the presence of. strongly tilted rocks on its periphery and a central mound of boulders. evidence of which was discovered within a 165-foot shaft drilled during original excavation.



ATLANTA (AP) - The medical examiner who performed an autopsy on the latest victim in a series of 20 child slayings here says the last seven cases are "disturbingly similar" and show evidence that links the victims to a "gentle killer."

Joe Burton, chief medical examiner for suburban DeKalb County, said Thursday that 13-year-old Curtis Walker, like the six youngsters before him, was asphyxiated.

Burton said neither Walker nor the others had been mutilated, and their remains showed no indication of violence or signs that they had resisted abduction.

The only signs of injury to Walker's body, Burton said, were "indications of minimal trauma" to his neck and bruises and abrasions on the nose. The nose injuries indicated Walker was suffocated with an object other than fabric, he added.

"It seems that this person is doing just enough to kill the child," Burton

He said the seven cases "are disturbingly similar, and we're finding evidence also to connect the cases. I would not argue with anyone who says they are connected.

Link found in children's deaths

Physical evidence found on Walker's body, including fibrous materials, lend credence to a theory that one person was responsible for the last seven killings, all of which have occurred since city officials formed a task force to probe the mysterious child disappearances and slayings. One child still is missing.

The Fulton County district attorney had said Wednesday, in a copyright story by the Atlanta Constitution, that he believed as many as 10 killers might be involved in the 20 deaths. But Lewis Slayton also said he felt

evidence - including fibers - indicated the last seven cases could be connected. He said the deaths of three other children, all found in the adjacent community of East Point, could be the work of another individual.

Three children found earlier also were asphyxiated - either strangled or suffocated. Others were shot, stabbed or beaten to death, and sever-

al bodies were too decomposed to determine a cause of death.

Like 14-year-old victim Lubie Geter, Walker was clad only in underwear when his body was discovered March 6 in the South River, 15 days after he was last seen, Burton added.

Burton cautioned against assuming too much from the physical evidence.

"If you pulled 100 people from outside, you'd find that two or three of them have fibers on them that match. The fibers alone are not enough to me to tie the cases.

However, Burton said, "This evidence serves to aid us in connecting cases where we have evidence that would tend to connect them."

Public Safety Commissioner Lee P. Brown said he had not yet made a decision to transfer the case of Joseph Bell to the task force, despite broadcast reports to the contrary.

Pentagon panel wants draft change

WASHINGTON (AP) - A Pentagon advisory panel is recommending that Congress consider reinstituting a version of the military draft that would require youths to serve six months and then decide whether to stay on active duty longer or join the reserves.

Louis J. Conti, chairman of the Reserve Forces Policy Board, called this a 'try it before you buy it' approach.

Reporting to Congress, Conti noted recent increases in Reserve and National Guard strength but said the board still is concerned over "inadequate force levels which must be responsive to mobilization demands.

The board, which includes reserve and active-duty senior officers as well as civilian officials, functions by law as an adviser to the secretary of defense. However, Conti made it clear the board was not speaking for Defense

Secretary Caspar Weinberger when it expressed its views to Congress There has not been a military draft in the United States since 1973 and it would take an act of Congress to revive it.

However, draft registration, which was ended by former President Ford in 1975, was resumed for young men last summer by former President Carter to have names on hand in case the draft was reinstituted.

Weinberger and President Reagan have indicated reluctance to keep the draft registration machinery intact and have voiced strong opposition to reviving the draft itself.

The board fully realizes that a return to the draft will fall far short o resolvin all the problems of a modern, technologically advanced military force," Conti said. "On the other hand, the board sees too many positive outcomes resulting from a draft not to pursue the question with utmost vigor.

He described the draft as "potentially the most cost-effective and equitable answer" to many of the problems

Under the board's recommendation, men - "and women, if mandated by Congress" - would be required to serve six months on active duty. It would start with a "military orientation" period of three to four weeks, followed by basic and advanced individual training.

The required military service would begin after graduation from high school or at the "conclusion of the academic term of college in which the individual was enrolled.'

For a high school dropout, service would start within 90 days of the time he left school or at a specific age, which was not given.

As is the case now, members of the Individual Ready Reserve would not be members of units that hold monthly drills but would be required to undergo periodic refresher training.

If a youth decided to remain on active duty, he would serve at least three years and then be obliged to enter a reserve unit or the Individual Ready Reserve for another three years.

The youth would be eligible for full veterans benefits after completing the three-year active duty tour.

In his acceptance speech at the Republican National Convention in Detroit, Reagan said last July

"I do not favor a peacetime draft or registration, but I do favor pay and benefit levels that will attract and keep highly motivated men and women in our volunteer forces and an active reserve trained and ready for an instant call in case of an emergency

Reagan has said nothing since his election to change that position, although there is no indication he is taking any steps toward dismantling the draft registration machinery.

The president's budget-cutting proposals spared the \$35 million program and a pilot program is getting under way to recruit and train draft board members in the event the draft is revived.

Helicopter smugglers get suspended sentences

SAN ANTONIO, Texas (AP) - A federal judge has given two top Nicaraguan Air Force officers suspended prison sentences and fines of a total of \$150,000 on charges of attempting to smuggle helicopters from Texas to Nicaragua

U.S. District Judge William Sessions set the suspended prison terms and fines Thursday for Modestto Rojas-Berrios, director general and second in command of the Nicaraguan Air Services, and Sidney Muller-Schroeder, director of maintenance for the air services. Nicaraguan Air Services is the name by which the air force of the Central American country is known.

A U.S. Justice Department spokesman says an investigation by U.S. Customs agents into other possible helicopter smuggling is continuing.

Sessions sentenced Rojas-Berrios to one year in prson and a \$50,000 fine and sentenced Muller-Schroeder to two years in prison and a \$100,000 fine. He then suspended both prison terms and placed the men on unsupervised probation for five years.

Both men had pleaded no contest to the charges last month.

The two officers and four other men, including John King Daily, a Panama national guard commander, were arrested by customs agent Jan. 18 as they were preparing to fly two Bell UH-1B "Huey" helicopters from a heliport at Bulverde, just north of San Antonio, to Monterrey, Mexico.

Charges were later dropped against the other four men.

Defense lawyers Jack Paul Leon and Sam Bayless said the two Nicaraguans were unable to pay the fines at this time, but were expecting money soon from their government. Sessions gave them 30 days to pay the fines or go to prison and continued them on bond with the understanding they would not leave the country.





Helping with housing

For a number of months now Midland has been facing a worsening housing situation which, apparently, holds the potential to stymie the growth of one of the most promising cities in the nation

Midland businesses and industries need workers. In fact in some categories the need for workers is so great that it already is affecting our progress.

But we have a problem: If we attract the workers how will we house them? For a number of years Midland has been caught between a rock and a hard place in the housing category. Houses are always going up in the Tall City, as are apartments. But it seems that both single-family houses and multi-family complexes can't be constructed quickly enough to fill the demand, And when housing is available, it's expensive.

This all creates a serious problem for many among us.

Now, there may be a glimmer of light at the end of this long, dark tunnel. A plan was announced earlier this week for the construction of an apartment complex here that would combine the efforts of a Houston developer and the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

The plan would provide additional rental space for Midland residents - many of them newcomers - who face a difficult time finding adequate housing sometimes any housing at all, in any condition! And it would offer the Federal Housing Assistance Payments Program.

We're glad to see this plan in the works. Midland is experiencing one of the greatest periods of growth it has ever seen and the future is definitely bright. It would be a real shame to see Midland's growth and development as a well-rounded community blocked because of a continuing lack of adequate housing.

We have that problem now. But it can be overcome. We should do our best to encourage such endeavors as this and others so the city can continue to grow and develop.



WASHINGTON MERRY-GO-ROUND Soviet planes 'testing' nation's air defense

WASHINGTON - In the past several months, the Soviet Union has increased the number, range and daring of its worldwide aerial surveillance - including deliberate penetration of NATO and U.S. air space.

Aside from the direct reconnaissance value of these missions, the Russian overflights have another obvious purpose: to test American and allied reaction as a gauge of our defensive capability.

I've already reported on the sorry state of our air defense network, including significant radar gaps that would allow Soviet bombers to reach American targets undetected. Our military leaders know about these dangerous deficiencies; the Soviets



The Air Force has acknowledged it scrambled fighter planes on 142 occasions between January and September of last year to intercept Soviet military aircraft. They intruded into the U.S. Air Defense Identification Zone, which runs 200 miles out into the

CHARLEY REESE Reagan should state our opposition to communism

President Ronald Reagan appears to be drawing the line against com-munist subversion in El Salvador. That's good, but I hope he does not make the same mistakes some of his predecessors have made.

One of those mistakes was not being honest with the American people. Unless he explicitly defines our goals, he could fall into the same trap that destroyed the presidency of Lyndon Johnson.

What, for example, is our true goal in El Salvador? It should be to prevent a communist government and if that is the goal and if President Reagan will state it clearly, I think the American people will back him

If, however, he allows the diplomats to talk him into distorting the objective, then he could get in trouble. Suppose, for example, he says the goal is to preserve the present government. That constitutes an endorsement of the present government. It may turn out that the present government is a bad government. Now, you are committing the U.S. government to defend a particular government from all threats, communist or noncommunist. The American people may well ask, as they did in Vietnam, why we are committing American lives and treasure to propping up a bad government?

If the President says we are going to the aid of El Salvador only because outside forces are trying to overthrow the government, he is also walking

It would not be unusual for the Pentagon to deny knowledge of Soviet penetrations. Top-secret CIA documents, going back a few years, reveal that "a U.S. Coast Guard aircraft on a search-and-rescue mission south of Florida was harassed by Cuban fighters. After intercepting the U.S. aircraft about 40 nautical miles northwest of the Cuban coast, the fighters made numerous close passes The U.S. aircraft descended to a

very low altitude and returned to Florida with the fighters following for some distance.

The National Security Agency reported that "two Cuban MiG fighter aircraft entered the U.S. Air Defense Identification Zone" two weeks later.



into a trap. What are we going to do then when a purely domestic communist movement succeeds? Are we saying that a communist revolution is okay so long as it is homegrown? Here again we approach the absurdity of Vietnam where we were fighting, according to Johnson, solely to allow the people of South Vietnam to determine their own destiny. Presumably that meant that if they freely voted to go communist, it was okay with us.

We have gotten into these semantic tank traps because in the past the foreign policy establishment of the United States refused to put us clearly on record as being anti-communist. That's because they wanted to trade with some communist governments.

Logically, the American people have only a negative interest in El Salvador. It is in our interest that the government not be communist; so long as it is not communist and thereby hostile to the United States it really does not matter, nor should it, what kind of government rules in El Salvador or anywhere else.

The American people can understand and support that position because it is clearly in our self-interest to keep Central America from becoming a Soviet outpost. It is so much in our self interest that President Reagan should make it absolutely clear that we are not going to tolerate a communist government in Central America whether it's duly elected, entirely domestic or imposed from without.

If he lets the State Department talk him into hiding that by claiming that we support the right of self-determination or that we are committed to opposing all outside invasions, then he's heading for domestic political trouble

President Carter, for example, by adopting the principle of being against outside invasions per se, put the United States in the absurd position of defending Pol Pot, the Cambodian Hitler, simply because the Vietnamese tossed him out.

By adopting the principle of being for self-determination per se, the Car-

A MiG-25 Foxbat reconnaissance plane made an overflight of the entire Rhone Valley in the heart of France. "The French sent up Mirage 2000s, but they couldn't shoot it down," a Pentagon source said.

Nation's new toughness difficult to enforce militarily

WASHINGTON - When the first of four Soviet naval vessels slipped quietly into Marxist Mozambique's main port Feb. 19, post-detente U.S.-Soviet rivalry notched up to a new peak with the Kremlin serving notice it would trump President Reagan's Caribbean ace

This shows how hard it is for the Reagan administration to conduct a forceful, catch-up foreign policy from a position of relative military weakness. The new policy of boldness in the Caribbean, overdue after years of futile courtship of Cuba's Fidel Castro, has triggered a heightened Soviet challenge in even more important regions where the Soviets hold the high cards.

Such a Soviet response has been predicted by worried pro-Reagan hard-liners in Congress. While applauding the president and Secretary of State Alexander Haig for longoverdue drawing of the line, they have been concerned about too much talk

While making no public criticism of a toughened Caribbean policy they applaud, aimed at ending Sovietbacked arms shipments to El Salvador,' Reagan's hard-line critics have privately cautioned administration officials that too much talk could promote Soviet responses. These would come with the U.S. so far behind in the arms race that countermeasures would be difficult.

Arrival of the Sverdlov-class light



cruiser Suvorov in the port of Maputo Feb. 19 showed the accuracy of these warnings. The Suvorov was shortly followed by three other Soviet navy ships: a Kashin-class destroyer, a frigate and an auxillary vessel, all detached from the Soviet Indian Ocean fleet. That formidable naval power has now been added to a rapidly-increasing number of military and economic "advisers" from the communist bloc now numbering more than 5,000, well over twice those working in Mozambique less than three years ago. These include 2,500 Soviet and East German military specialists who, with 1,500 Cubans, are now training Mozambiqe military officers to fly MiG 17s, to operate SAM 3 anti-aircraft missiles and to drive over 200 tanks.

The stakes in the Southern Africa power game, where Mozambque is one the high cards held by the Soviets, are breathtaking: control of the most concentrated mineral wealth anywhere in the world on land; and control of the oil sea-lane from the Persian Gulf down the East Coast of Africa. Europe gets 90 percent of its imported oil through that route and 70 percent of it imported minerals from Southern Africa.

The Soviet game in Southern Africa is to win what Haig called "the era of the resource war" in testimony to a House subcommittee last fall, before he became secretary of state. He said that if "future trends, especially in Southern Africa, result in alignment with Moscow of this critical resource area, then the U.S.S.R. would control as much as 90 percent" of key minerals vital to the economy of the U.S., Western Europe and Japan.

The sudden arrival of four naval vessels in Maputo, together with the steadily expanding contingent of communist "advisers," shows that 'alignment with Moscow'' is moving ahead fast. Indeed, some diplomats here believe that the Soviet bloc pushed hard for the unusually harsh edict of the Mozambique government that expelled four American Embassy officials last week on spy charges. That followed a daring South African raid Jan. 30 on the Maputo headquarters of the anti-South African National African Congress.

Using its 1977 friendship with Mozambique, the Soviet Union is believed to be leaning on the Maputo government to invoke Article 9 of the treaty, pledging Soviet aid to eliminate any "threat" to peace.

South Africa, along with its racial policies, is the cement used by the Soviets to bind Moscow to black

Southern Africa and create a band of Soviet power across the Southern tip of the continent from Mozambique to Angola. Hoping to close the final link in that band, the Soviets finally won full diplomatic relations with Zimbabwe last month.


Dealing with this Soviet subversion in an area as important to the industrial democracies as the Persian Gulf is unavoidably more challenging than imposing a long-needed Caribbean quarantine now planned by the new administration. It requires military strength - the existence of real power to compete with the Soviet Union.

Reagan has asked Congress to give him that, but he is far from possessing it. Until he gets it, his conservative critics will praise his resolve, but continue to worry about too much loud talk in America's backyard.

A total of \$55,142 would go to the Amarillo school to repair one building. The Harlingen school would get \$20,941 to repair seven buildings.







Deep drilling increases

DALLAS - Deep drilling in the United States increased 40 percent last year as the oil and gasindustry completed a record 859 wells that went 15,000 feet or deeper, according to a deep well survey conducted by the Petroleum Engineer International magazine

Results of the survey were published in the Dallasbased publication's March issue. The magaizne also reported that the industry spent almost \$4 billion over the previous year.

1979's figures show the industry spent over \$2 billion to drill 621 deep wells.

drilling expenses jumped 26 percent in the one-year quarter last year. period. The average cost of drilling and completing a well last year was \$4.56 million.

wells, 63 of which were off-shore. Texas produced 186 deep wells with ten of them off-shore.

four off-shore wells in New Jersey

Alaska was the most expensive onshore drilling state in the country, with the average cost per well of \$26.5 million.

Five deep wells were dug in Alaska last year.




